The National Income of Thailand covers 3 sides of approaches covering production, expenditure and income, which reflects the overall economic activities of accounting of the country in particular calendar year on disseminates publication for economic analysis purpose.

The National Income of Thailand 2017 edition, following the International System of National Accounts (SNA), is compiled using the chain volume measures (CVMs) in measuring the real terms. In this 2017 edition, data are revised back to 2015 in accordance with the latest available primary data and latest revision of data sources provided by responsible agencies to ensure the accuracy and consistency of the entire system of national accounts. Details of revisions are indicated in the revision note on the following pages.

The Office of the NESDC would like to express our gratitude to agencies and individuals who constantly supply basic data and contribute suggestion on enhancing the compilation of the National Income of Thailand and other statistic accounts.

Revisions to the National Income of Thailand 2017 Edition

In this publication, the main estimates have been revised back to 2015. The revisions are made based on the most recent data from the primary sources as follows:

1. Revising data

- Agricultural, forestry and fishing sector: revising crops and livestock production figures from 2015 to 2016 according to the Agricultural Statistics of Thailand 2017 from the Office of Agricultural Economic, Ministry of Agriculture and Co-operatives; revising fishery production figures from 2015 to 2016 according to the Fisheries Statistics of Thailand 2017 from the Department of Fisheries.
- Manufacturing sector: revising industrial production figures back from 2015 to 2016 according
 to the Manufacturing Product Index (MPI) from the Office of Industrial Economics, Ministry of
 Industry and data from relevant sectors.
- Construction sector: revising the data of construction back to 2016.
- Real estate, renting and business services sector; and other community, social and personal services activities sector: revising income for value added taxes assessment back to 2016.
- Education sector and human health and social work activities sector: revising the data of
 education and health service of general government and the annual report of the private
 universities from 2015 to 2016.
- General government: revising 3 units of autonomous universities including Prince of Songkla University (PSU), Suranari University of Technology (SUT) and Institute Community Colleges according to the primary data from agencies and the latest data available from original data sources figures from 2015 to 2016.
- Export and import of merchandise and services: revising both primary income and secondary income according to the current account data from the Bank of Thailand from 2016.
- Updating other basic data according to the latest data available from original data sources.

2. Abbreviation

• In this publication, there are two letters assigned after data period (s) in tables (r and p). Letter "r" stands for "revised" representing revision figures based on most recent data, coverage, and compilation methodology. Letter "p" stands for "preliminary" annual figure, which is subject to revisions in the next series of publication.

Executive Summary

The Thai economy, in 2017, measured by the Gross Domestic Product (GDP), increased by 4.0% which accelerated from a rise of 3.4% in 2016, mainly contributed to a continual expansion of production of goods and services for private final consumption expenditure, exports, and tourist-related industry. On production side, non-agricultural production grew in a favorable level. Similarly, agricultural production also improved greatly from the previous year as a result of a growth in main crop production. For expenditure side, private final consumption expenditure rose prominently as a result of higher farm income whereas government final consumption expenditure slowed down from last year. Private investment expanded whereas public investment decreased due to base-effect from a high value of public investment projects in response to disbursement expedition measure in the previous year.

The total production increased by 4.0%, accelerating from a rise of 3.4% in the previous year. Non-agricultural production, accounted for 91.7% of total production, grew by 4.1%, compared to a rise of 3.8% previously. Such a high level of production was from manufacturing sector with a growth of 3.0%, improved from a 2.2% growth in the previous year, due to a contribution of computer and components, machinery and equipment, rubber and plastic products, and chemicals and chemical products. In addition, tourist-related sectors also supported expansion including: a rise of 10.6% for accommodation and food service; 8.2% for transportation and storage; 7.0% for wholesale and retail trade; 12.1% for arts, entertainment and recreation, which expanded favorable as a result of a rising number of tourists. Similarly, agricultural production rose by 3.7%, improved from a drop of 1.3% in last year as a result of a growth in main crop production in line with favorable weather conditions.

Domestic demand rose continuously from last year. Supporting factors were from private sector improvement, including both final consumption expenditure and investment. However, in public sector, consumption slowed down whereas investment decreased. Expansion in private sector was contributed to a growth of major crops prices and continual missing income of non agricultural sector in addition to an expansion of consumer credit expansion and consumer confidence index improvement. As a result, private consumption expenditure rose by 3.0%. Gross fixed capital formation increased by 1.8%, slowed down from 2.9% previously. In particular, private investment increased by 2.9%, compared to a 0.6% rise in 2016 whereas public investment declined by 1.2% in contrast to a 9.5% growth in the previous year, due to a high base-effect in which disbursement on investment projects was expedited in last year namely water resources development and management system and urgent phase land transport system. General government final consumption expenditure grew by 0.1%, compared to 2.2% last year. Such a slowdown was from a deceleration in compensation of employees and a decrease in purchase from enterprises and abroad. For external sector, exports of goods and services grew favorably by 5.4%. Similarly, imports of goods and services also grew profusely by 6.2%.

National income in 2017 posted the value of Baht 14,762,125 million, rose by 6.4%. Sources of income were from a return to labor with the value of Baht 4,843,384 million, a 2.7% rise from the previous year. Return to capital, land and operation was worth Baht 5,770,810 million, increased by 10.7%. In per capita terms, national income per capita in 2017 was Baht 218,200, rose from Baht 205,607 in 2016. Disposable income per capita was Baht 122,874 and consumption expenditure per capita was Baht 111,292. As a result, per capita personal saving valued at Baht 13,716, accelerated from Baht 11,997 in 2016.

For overall economic stability, recently gross saving kept expanding whereas gross investment trended to be expanded. It was seen in 2017 that gross saving and investment rose by 10.1% and 15.8%, respectively. As a result, saving-investment gap (equivalent to current account) postulated a surplus with the value of Baht 1,702,474 million, accounting for 11.0% of GDP. Such a surplus was regarded as the fourth consecutive year, since there were surplused of Baht 497,597 million, Baht 1,103,130 million and Baht 1,703,101 million for 2014, 2015 and 2016.

GDP implicit price deflator rose by 2.1%, compared to a rise of 2.5% in the previous year. Agricultural price index increased by 0.9%, compared to a growth of 2.1% in 2015. Similarly, non-agricultural price index grew by 2.2%, slowed down from a 2.5% rise previously. Meanwhile, both consumer price index (CPI) and producer price index (PPI) equally rose by 0.7%, yet the later recovered from a drop of 1.2% in last year.

Thai Economy in 2017 National Accounts Perspectives


Overview

GDP in 2017 rose by 4.0% compared to a rise of 3.4% in 2016, driven by private consumption expenditure, exports, and tourist-related industries.

Gross Domestic Product of 2017 increased by 4.0%, compared to a rise of 3.4% in 2016 as a result of a continuous expansion of private final consumption expenditure, exports, and tourist-related sector. Such a rise of private final consumption was partly from high farming income in line with rising price in main agricultural. In addition, low inflation level maintained as a consequence of price reduction of main products related to low fuel price. Meanwhile, government consumption expenditure and investment decelerated, attributed to a decline of government investment whereas investment of private and state enterprises maintained expansion. Decrease in government investment was from reduction of disbursement from government investment project as a consequence of base effect from disbursement expedition in last year, namely water resource development and management project and urgent phase highway project.

Non-agricultural sector and several sectors with high expansion covered manufacturing sector such as chemicals and chemical products, rubber and plastic products, and computers and peripheral equipment; service sectors such as wholesale and retail trade, repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles; and tourist-related sectors such as accommodation and food service activities, and transport services. Meanwhile, the productions of agricultural sector improved relatively compared to the previous year

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) in 2017 at current market prices valued at Baht 15,451,959 million. After deducting Baht 689,834 million of net factor income from the rest of the world, Gross National Income (GNI) registered at Baht 14,762,125 million, which expanded by 6.4%. Per capita GNI was Baht 218,200 higher than that of Baht 205,607 million in 2016, which expanded by 6.1%.



Domestic Demand improved from last year, attributed to an expansion of private final consumption expenditure, exports of goods and services, and private investment. Supporting factors were from; 1) higher household income especially farming income which was from rising in main crop; 2) continuous expansion of non-taxes income and rising in household consumer credits which led to higher consumer demand. As a result, private final consumption expenditure rose by 3.0% compared to a 2.9% expansion in last year. Gross fixed capital formation expanded by 1.8%, decelerating from 2.9% in 2016. Private investment grew by 2.9% whereas public investment decreased by 1.2% as a result of base effect from high disbursement expedition of major government investment projects last year. General government final consumption expenditure increased by 0.1%, compared to 2.2% in 2016 attributed to compensation of employees with a growth of 0.6%, purchases from enterprises and abroad, and social transfers in kind - purchased market production decreased by 0.1%.

External Sector: exports of goods and services at current market prices grew by 5.8%, compared to a 5.4% rise in 2016. Such an expansion was chiefly contributed to a 5.5% rise in merchandised exports and 7.0% in service receipts. For import side, imports of goods and services at current market prices expanded by 7.6%, recovering from a drop of 0.7% in last year. Particularly, merchandised imports rose by 8.7% as well as service payments with an increase of 3.0%. Trade and service balance at current market prices valued a surplus of Baht 2,136,970 million, compared to Baht 2,147,890 million previously, attributed to Baht 1,158,267 million for trade surplus and Baht 978,704 million for service surplus. In addition, net factor income and net current transfers recorded a deficit of Baht 689,834 million and a surplus of Baht 255,338 million, respectively. Ultimately, a current account registered a surplus at Baht 1,702,474 million in 2017, considered to be the fourth consecutive years of surplus.

National Income (NI) or income from factors of production in 2017 recorded the value of Baht 14,762,125 million, expanded by 6.4%. Expansion was found from both compensation of employees, which accounted for 32.8% of NI, and returns on capital, land, and firms, which accounted for 39.1% of NI, with a rise of 2.7% and 10.7%, respectively. Meanwhile, operating income grew by 12.7% whereas net property income dropped by 2.3%.

Domestic Saving in 2017 registered the value of Baht 5,231,089 million, grew by 10.1% decelerating from a rise of 13.8% in 2016. Overall net savings valued at Baht 2,335,400 million, grew by 22.6%, contributed to net private saving with an increase of 18.9% and net public saving increased by 135.2%.

Overall Economic Stability: recently, saving kept expanding and maintained at the high level as overall investment increased drastically. Particularly in 2017, total saving and total investment rose by 10.1% and 15.8%, respectively. As a result, saving-investment gap (equivalent to current account surplus) registered a surplus of Baht 1,702,474 million and accounted for 11.0% of gross domestic product. Current account was considered to be a surplus for the fourth consecutive years which were Baht 497,597 million, Baht 1,103,130 million and Baht 1,703,101 million surpluses for 2014, 2015 and 2016, respectively.

GDP Implicit Price Deflator increased by 2.1%, decelerating from 2.5% in the previous year. Agricultural price index grew by 0.9%, compared to a 2.1% increase in 2016. Non-agricultural price index rose by 2.2%, decelerating from 2.5% previously. Meanwhile, consumer prices index (CPI) and producer prices index (PPI) increased equally by 0.7% respectively.

Gross Domestic Product

GDP in 2017 grew by 4.0% continuously from a 3.4% growth in the previous year.

Gross domestic product in 2017 expanded by 4.0%, accelerating from a growth of 3.4% in the previous year. Such an expansion was mainly driven by non-agricultural sector with a rise of 4.1% due to a continual expansion of private consumption, exports, and tourist-related sector. Manufacturing sector increased by 2.2% and service sector grew by 5.1%, propelled by tourist-related sector. Agricultural sector increased by 3.7% in response to an expansion of crops production and fishery.

Agricultural production rose by 3.7%, recovering from a contraction of 1.3% in the previous year. Such a rise was attributable to an increase in major crops, namely paddy, sugarcane, oil palm and rubber due to a favorable weather condition. Livestock declined as a result of farming of cattle and buffalo whereas poultry such as chicken and hen's egg expanded. Fishery significantly increased.

Non-agricultural production grew by 4.1%. Manufacturing sector rose by 2.2%, continually rising from the preceding year. Such an expansion was propelled by higher production of main manufacturing sectors such as motor vehicles, chemical and chemical products, and computer and computer peripheral equipment. In addition, services and tourist-related sector namely accommodation and food service activities, and transportation also supported expansion with growth of 10.6% and 8.2%, respectively, in response to the number of domestic and foreign tourists.

Agricultural sector

Agricultural sector grew by 3.7% due to a rise of crops and fishery production.

Overall agricultural production expanded by 3.7%, recovered from a contraction of 1.3% in 2016, resulting from annual crops, perennial crops, agricultural services, and fishing with an increase of 3.6%, 7.1%, 6.8%, and 5.6%, respectively. However, livestock and forestry contracted by 5.3% and 3.3%, respectively. Price of agricultural product rose by 0.9%, compared to an increase of 2.1% in the previous year.

Agriculture, forestry and fishery


Total production expanded by 3.7%, improving from the previous year. Major production activities were as follows:

- **Annual crops** increased by 3.6% due mainly to adequate water resources. Major crops such as paddy, sugarcane, and cereals grew by 4.1%, 12.8%, and 8.6%, respectively. Meanwhile, production of tobacco, orchid, and cassava decreased.
- **Perennial crops** rose by 7.1% owing to a favorable weather condition. Major crops namely oil palm, rubber, and other fruits grew by 16.3%, 2.6%, and 11.3%, respectively.
- **Livestock** dropped by 5.3%, attributed mainly to lower production of cattle, diary product despite an increase of poultry such as hen and hen's egg.
- **Agricultural services** increased by 6.8% as a result of an expansion of planting and harvest services in response to planting areas.
- **Forestry** declined by 3.3% due mainly to a decrease in logging and forest products in spite of an increase in firewood and charcoal products.
- **Fishing** expanded by 5.6%. Such an expansion was from a 7.0% increase of marine fishing in response to domestic and external demand. Meanwhile, freshwater fishing decreased.

Implicit prices of agricultural products increased by 0.9%, compared to a 2.1% increase in the previous year. Such a deceleration was originated from higher quantity of agricultural products, resulting lower price of agricultural products.

Non-agricultural sector

Non-agricultural sector dropped by 5.5% in contrast to a 1.1% rise in the previous year.



Mining and quarrying

Mining and quarrying contracted by 5.5% in contrast to an expansion of 1.1% in the previous year. Contraction was attributable to a 4.8% drop of crude oil and natural gas production, compared to a rise of 0.3% in the previous year. Crude oil production decreased by 11.1% in contrast to a previous increase of 6.4%, as a result of decrease in production for main oil fields; namely Erawan group, Yungthong, Nongyao, Songkhla, and Sirikit.

Natural gas and liquefied natural gas production dropped by 2.9%, continually decreasing from a fall of 1.5% in the previous year. Such a fall was found in main fields such as Bongkot, Tantawan group, Benchamas, and Yungthong. In addition, other minerals; namely quarrying of stone, sand and clay declined by 7.1% in contrast to a 2.3% growth in the previous year.

Manufacturing

Manufacturing expanded by 3.0%, attributed to exports of manufacturing goods namely chemical and chemical products, rubber and plastic products, computer and peripheral equipment together with an increase of domestic demand.

Manufacturing with a favorable expansion

- **Food products** increased by 0.6%, compared to a rise of 1.5% in the previous year, supported by an expansion of canned fruit and vegetable oil products in response to an external demand.
- Leather and related products rose by 4.6%, attributed to luggage, handbags and footwear products.
- Wood and products of wood and cork expanded by 7.5% due to higher demand for wooden construction material and wood products.
- Paper and paper products grew by 1.3% due to an expansion of pulp as a consequence of an increase in demand from downstream and related industries.
- **Petroleum refinery** expanded by 4.8% in response to domestic demand.
- Chemical and chemical products rose by 5.0% owing to a rise of petrochemical demand from downstream industries.
- **Rubber and plastic products** grew by 8.8% due to an expansion of external demand for block rubber and rubber sheet. In addition, plastic products also showed a continual expansion.

- **Basic metal** grew by 4.6% due to higher metal product for construction and metal structure.
- **Fabricated metal products** expanded by 7.2% due to higher demand from downstream industries, namely canned fish, and processing and preservation of fruit and vegetables.
- Computer, electronic and optical products expanded by 10.3% due to higher external demand for computer and parts, electronic and intergraded circuits.
- **Machinery and equipment** grew by 8.9% due to expansion of all activities in this sector.
- **Motor vehicles** continually rose by 2.3% in response to demand from passenger and commercial cars. Moreover, spare part production also increased.
- **Furniture** grew by 7.3%, attributed to an expansion of wooden furniture production in response to domestic demand. In addition, metal furniture production also expanded.

Manufacturing with a contraction

- **Beverage** dropped by 0.1% due to decline in beer and non-alcohol beverage in spite of an expansion of spirit beverage.
- **Tobacco** contracted by 16.8%, resulting from an excise tax rise at the end of year.
- **Textile** declined by 3.4% as a result of imported raw materials of downstream industries.
- **Wearing apparel** continually declined by 2.5% due to imported wearing apparel.
- Other non-metallic products fell by 0.5% due to a lower demand for construction material such as brick and cement whereas concrete product kept increasing.
- **Electrical machinery and apparatus** contracted by 3.8% in response to a decline of household appliance and electric motor whist lighting appliance expanded.
- Other motor vehicles decreased by 1.6% in response to ships and boats building. Meanwhile, motorcycles production increased.
- **Other manufacturing** dropped by 0.7% due to a lower demand for gems and jewelry.

Electricity, gas and air conditioning supply

Electricity, gas and air conditioning supply expanded by 2.0%, continually rising from the previous growth of 2.8%. Such an expansion was attributable to a rise of electricity power generation with a growth of 1.5% in response to a continual increase in productions of PEA and private power generation. Meanwhile, productions of EGAT and MEA contracted. However, electricity consumption by users showed an expansion in every type of users. Gas separation expanded by 8.2%, in comparison to a rise of 13.6% in last year.

Water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities

Water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities grew by 6.1%, slowing down from a growth of 7.5% in the previous year. Water supply, water collection and materials recovery expanded 4.3%, 6.3% and 20.2%, respectively, decelerating from a rise of 5.2%, 12.1% and 21.4%, consecutively, in the preceding year.

Construction

Construction contracted by 2.8% in contrast to a rise of 7.9% in 2016, described by a decrease from base-effect of government construction spending in last year which was disbursed from the water resources development and urgent phase highway project. Meanwhile, state enterprise construction for on going project and new projects were implemented in 2017 such as housing development projects of the National Housing Authority, major water supply plans of Metropolitan Waterworks Authority, the Green Line Project (Mo Chit - Saphan Mai - Khukhot) of the Mass Rapid Transit Authority of Thailand, the Laemchabang Container Port Development Project and the Laemchabang Seaport Development Project of the Port Authority of Thailand. Moreover, private construction contracted from housing construction slowdown and other constructions shrank.

Wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles

Trading and repairing grew by 7.0%, due to a rise in sales of motor vehicles and motorcycles in response to domestic demand expansion. Wholesale and retail trade continually increased, driven by domestic and tourism demands.

Transportation and storage

Transportation and storage expanded by 8.2%, accelerating from a 3.2% growth in the previous year. The acceleration was attributable to an expansion of land and air transports of passengers, in response to the number of foreign tourists and Thai tourists. Such an expansion was followed by water, air and land transport of freight. Post activities grew 18.5%, accelerating from an expansion of 4.4% in response to revenue of entrepreneurs.

Accommodation and food service activities

Accommodation and food service activities expanded by 10.6%, accelerating from a rise of 9.2% in the previous year. Accommodation grew by 9.3%, compared to a growth of 8.4% in the previous year due mainly to an increase in number of foreign tourists with a 9.4% growth, higher than 8.7% in the previous year. The number of tourists from East Asia increased by 10.4% owing to the improved number of tourists from China as a result of the suppression of "zero-dollar tour", followed by the number of tourists from Loas, Philippines, Singapore, Vietnam, Japan, Korea, and Taiwan. In addition, tourists from South Asia, Oceania, and Africa maintained a favorable growth. Food and beverage service activities grew by 11.6%, accelerating from 9.9% in the preceding year as a result of an increase in Thai tourists, which was propelled by government projects; namely "12 Hidden Cities", "Slow Life Bike Trips", "12 Hidden Cities Plus", and "E-TO GO CARAVAN", promoted by Tourism Authority of Thailand.

Information and communication

Information and communication increased by 2.7%, compared to 2.9% previously, owing to communications services with an increase of 2.0%, lower than a 2.3% growth in the previous year. Meanwhile, computer programming, consultancy and related activities grew by 6.2%, accelerating from a 4.9% growth in the previous year due to demand for information and related activities. Publishing activities decreased by 7.9% whereas production of motion picture and video and television program increased by 1.3%

Financial and insurance activities

Financial and insurance activities expanded by 5.4%, decelerating from 7.0% in the previous year, due to an increase of operating income of commercial banks and other depository institutions. Such an increase was from an expansion of both credits and deposits. Meanwhile, household loans increased especially in leasing and mortgages in line with a gradual economic recovery. In addition, an income from fees and other services expanded. On the other hand, life and non-life insurances slowed down compared to the previous year.

Real estate activities

Real estate activities expanded by 6.5%, gradually increased from 7.0% in last year. This expansion was attributable to an increase in real estate activities with own or leased property with a growth of 6.9%, slowing down from 7.1% in the previous year. In addition, real estate activities on a fee or contract basis also grew by 2.9%, compared to a growth of 6.0% in preceding year, due partly to reaching termination of transfer fees reduction measure in last year.

Professional, scientific and technical activities

Professional, scientific and technical activities grew by 6.3%, recovering from a 2.3% decrease in the previous year. Such a growth was attributable to an expansion of other management consultancy activities, architectural and engineering activities and related technical consultancy, technical testing and analysis, research and experimental development on natural sciences and engineering, market research and public opinion polling, and veterinary activities.

Administrative and support service activities

Administrative and support service activities rose by 2.4%, accelerating from a 1.4% growth in the preceding year. An expansion was attributable to an increase in travel agency and tour operator in line with higher number of inbound tourist, followed by an increase of renting of personal motor vehicle activities, office administrative and other business supporting activities. Meanwhile, renting of water transport equipment, renting of machinery and office equipment, renting of other machinery and office equipment, activities of other employment placement agencies, security system service activities, investigation activities, and general cleaning of building slowed down.

Education

Education expanded by 0.6%, compared to a rise of 0.7% in the previous year. Public education rose by 0.5%, lower than a 0.8% growth previously. Private education grew by 2.1%, recovering from a fall of 0.5% in the last year, due to a rising number of students in private universities, formal vocational education, and informal vocational education.

Human health and social work activities

Human health and social work activities grew by 3.7%, accelerating from a 3.0% growth in the previous year. Public health services rose by 3.2%, higher than a previous growth of 2.6%. Private health services increased by 4.5%, compared to a rise of 3.6% in the last year, seen in private hospital, clinical activities, and NGOs.

Art, entertainment and recreation

Art, entertainment and recreation increased by 12.1%, compared to a rise of 21.3% in the previous year, as a result of base affect from issuing a new policy allowing lottery reservation in advance, implementing in 2016 which led to a growth of 18.0% in this year, compared to a growth of 34.8% in last year. Meanwhile, botanical activities, sports activities, and creative, arts and entertainment activities decelerated.

Other service activities

Other service activities rose by 4.5%, higher than a 3.9% growth in the previous year. Such a continual expansion was seen in activities of membership organizations, repair of computers and personal and household goods, and other personal service activities. Activities of membership organizations expanded by 3.2%, accelerating from a 1.2% increase in the previous year owing to an expansion in activities of business employers membership organizations, activities of trade unions, activities of religious organization, and activities of other membership organizations. Repair of household goods grew by 5.7%, slightly accelerating from a 5.4% rise in the previous year, due to a continual expansion of repair of household appliances, repair of footwear and leather goods, and repair of other personal and household goods. Other personal service activities rose by 3.5%, slightly accelerating from 3.2% rise in the previous year, in response mainly to an expansion of other personal service activities.


Expenditure on Gross Domestic Product

Private final consumption expenditure in 2017 expanded by 3.0%

Composition of private final consumption expenditure

Private final consumption expenditure in 2017 expanded by 3.0%, accelerating from a growth of 2.9% in 2016

The main contribution factors were from an expansion of farm income which rose from production of main crop price such as sugar cane and soybean. Inflation and interest rate remained low and commercial banks continued to expand especially for personal loan credit along with maintaining high level of Consumer Confidence Index as well as rising in farm income led to an increase in purchasing power. Particularly, spending on durable goods items rose from the previous year as a result of an increase spending on personal vehicles in addition to an increase of semi-durable goods. However, spending on non-durable and net services decelerated.



Private final consumption expenditure in the domestic market excluding non-residents expanded by 2.7%, accelerating from an increase of 2.3% in 2016.

Private final consumption expenditure in the domestic market - including expenditure of non-residents in the country and excluding expenditure of residents abroad expanded by 5.3%, compared to a rise of 4.0% in the previous year. In particular, household final consumption expenditure increased by 5.3% whereas final consumption expenditure of non-profit institutions serving households expanded by 3.7%.

Classified by goods and services items

Household consumption expenditure classified by goods and services items.

Food and non-alcoholic beverages grew by 2.3% compared to a rise of 2.1% in 2016. Food items expanded by 2.5%, slightly increasing from a growth of 2.4% in the previous year. The contribution factors were seen in seafood, milk, butter, eggs, oil and fat, fruits, and sugar and dessert. Spending on non-alcoholic beverage expanded by 0.6% compared to a rise of 0.3% in the previous year, especially for carbonate water and fruits juices.

Alcoholic beverages and tobacco declined by 0.4%, compared to a decrease of 3.2% in the previous year. Alcoholic beverages reduced by 0.3%, recovering from a decline of 3.5% in 2016 as result of a decrease in consumption of liquor, beer, and wine. Furthermore tobacco consumption dropped by 0.6%, improving from a decrease of 2.5% in the previous year, in line with lower sale volumes of cigarette reported by state-owned Tobacco Monopoly Factory.

Clothing and footwear increased by 2.5%, decelerating from a rise of 3.3% in the previous year, resulting from a decreasing consumption in both clothing and footwear. Spending on clothing and footwear grew by 2.6% and 2.3%, slowing down from a rise of 3.0% and 6.2%, respectively in 2016.

Housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels remained expanding by 4.3% as same as the previous year. Such an increase resulted from a rise in electricity consumption and expenses on gases and fuels which expanded by 1.4%, decelerating from a rise of 4.7% from 2016. Moreover, household water supply consumption expanded by 1.7%, accelerating from a rise of 1.1% in the previous year. Rental for housing rose by 8.5%, continually expanding from a rise of 7.3% in the previous year.

Furnishing, household equipment and routine maintenance of the house expanded by 2.8% accelerating from a rise of 0.1% in 2016, attributed to an increase in households equipment and routine maintenance by 4.0% from a decrease of 1.1% in the previous year. Moreover, spending on glassware, tableware and household utensils expanded by 5.4% and spending on tools and equipment for house and garden rose by 4.5%.

Health service increased by 3.0%, decelerating from an increase of 4.7% in 2016, characterized from a 4.6% decrease in other medical product decelerating sharply from a growth of 12.8% in the previous year as well as an expenditure of therapeutic appliances and equipment which decreased by 2.7%, in contrast to a rise of 1.7% in the previous year. Moreover, spending on medical services expanded by 0.4% decelerating from 2.3% in 2016.

Transport rose by 8.9% from a rise of 4.3% in 2016, due mainly to recovery of vehicle purchases from 1.5% in 2016 to a growth of 19.8% in 2017 in response to an improvement of passenger cars sale. Meanwhile, personal transportation expanded by 3.0% slowing down from a rise of 7.2% in the previous year. Meanwhile, transport services expanded by 6.2% owing partly to an increase in the number of foreign tourists which led to a upward trend of transport consumption.

Communication expanded by 6.1%, accelerating from an increase of 2.1% in the previous year, owing to an expansion on postal services by 10.0% dramatically increased from a 1.8% decline in the previous year and followed by an increase of spending on postal services. Moreover, spending on telephone services expanded by 6.2%, accelerating from a rise of 2.3% in the previous year which led to an upward trend of communications consumption.

Recreation and culture grew by 8.0% decelerating from a rise of 15.5% in the previous year as a result of a dramatic deceleration in lottery item from 107.2% to 17.5% in 2017. Furthermore, newspaper and periodicals maintained decreasing but recovering from the previous year which decreased by 1.0% from a decrease of 4.2% in last year.

Education increased by 2.5% accelerating from a growth of 0.3% in the previous year in line with a rise in number of students, especially in the tertiary education and other education.

Restaurants and hotels expanded by 10.3% accelerating from an increase of 6.5% in 2016 as a result of an expansion of restaurant and hotel services by 9.4% and 11.5% respectively, which increased from a rise of 4.3% and 9.9% in the previous year, respectively. Such an expansion of restaurants and hotels was from an increase in the number of foreign tourists.

Miscellaneous goods and services grew by 4.8% improving from a rise of 3.4% in the previous year, due to a spending of personal effects which increased by 8.6% compared to an increase of 3.2% in 2016. Moreover, personal services expanded by 6.3%, accelerating from an increase of 2.6% in the previous year. Other services expanded by 4.0%, compared to an increase of 3.0% in the previous year. Financial services increased by 2.7%, decelerating from a rise of 3.9% in the previous year.

Non-profit institutions serving households consumption expenditure grew by 3.7% improving from an increase of by 1.6% in the previous year. Education, health, and social protection rose by 5.9% from 0.5% in 2016. Moreover, other services increased by 1.2%, slowing down from a rise of 2.8% in the previous year.

PCE by durability of 4 factors

Private consumption expenditure classified by durability 4 categories

Durable goods grew by 13.7% sharply accelerating from a rise of 1.0% previously. The main contribution factors were purchase of vehicles which increased by 19.8%, compared to an increase of 1.5% in the previous year. Meanwhile other durable goods; recreation and culture; television and video grew by 13.5% from a decrease of 29.1% in the previous year. In addition, audio visual expanded by 28.2% accelerating from a decline of 2.8% in 2016 and spending on personal effects expanded by 10.8% accelerating from an increase of 1.9% in the previous year.

Semi-durable goods grew by 2.8% rising from a rise of 1.8% in the previous year. Main increased items included spending on small electricity household appliances which expanded by 0.9% compared to a rise of 0.3% in 2016. Meanwhile, spending on glassware, tableware and household utensils increased by 5.4% accelerating from a rise of 0.4% in the previous year. Spending on small tools and miscellaneous accessories expanded by 4.6% accelerating from a decline of 5.2% in 2016. Semi-durable goods of recreation and culture; games and toys expanded by 5.3% recovering from a decline of 3.9% in the previous year. Equipment for sports, camping and open-air recreation expanded by 5.5% compared to a rise of 1.0% in 2016.

Non-durable goods expanded by 2.3% slowing down from an increase of 2.8% in the previous year due primarily to a slowdown in consumption of fuels and lubricants for personal transport equipment which expanded by 2.2% slowing down from a rise of 7.7% in 2016. Furthermore, spending on electricity expanded by 1.4% compared to an increase of 5.8% in the previous year.

Services expanded by 1.3%, decelerating from a growth of 3.7% in the previous year. Such a slowdown was from recreation and culture services which expanded by 17.5%, sharply decelerating from 107.2% in 2016. In addition, miscellaneous goods and services such as personal care expanded by 4.4%, slightly accelerating from a rise of 4.0% in the previous year. Insurance service expanded by 2.5% slightly decelerating from 3.0% and financial intermediation service rose by 2.0% compared to an increase of 4.4% in the previous year. Nevertheless, domestic services excluding expenditure of non-residents in the country and domestic net services consumption for Thai resident continued to increase.

Composition of general government final consumption expenditure

General government final consumption expenditure in real term increased by 0.1%

General government final consumption expenditure at current market price registered with the value of Baht 2,529,944 million, increased by 2.6%. Government compensation of employees valued at Baht 1,411,047 million or increased by 4.0% due partly to a rise in wages and salaries along with remuneration by 7.8% and 18.3%, respectively. Meanwhile, purchases from enterprises and abroad with the value of Baht 722,556 million, slightly rose by 1.1% partly in accordance with an expansion of public utility and service other than personnel. Consumption of fixed capital registered the value of Baht 286,106 million - a 4.6% increase. Social transfers in kind – purchased market production valued at Baht 261,504 million with an increase of 0.5%.

By function of the government, total general government final consumption at current market with the value of Baht 2,529,944 million composed of education service with a 29.6% share of general government final consumption expenditure. The rest of government service by function comprised 17.1% share for health service, 14.2% share for general public service, 12.4% share for economic affair, 10.3% share for defence, 8.9% share for public order and safety, and 7.4% share for remaining of instance housing and community amenities, recreation, culture and religion, environmental, and social protection.

General government final consumption expenditure in real term grew by 0.1%, owing to a 0.6% increase for compensation of employees, 1.7% for consumption of fixed capital. Besides, both purchase from enterprises and abroad and social transfers in kind – purchased market production decreased equally by 0.1% while purchase by households and enterprises increased by 6.1%.

Gross capital formation

Gross capital formation or investment at current market prices recorded the value of Baht 3,528,615 million, consisting of gross fixed capital formation and change in inventories with the value of Baht 3,580,885 million and the decline value of Baht 52,270 million, respectively.

Gross fixed capital formation in real terms expanded by 1.8%, slowing down from 2.9% in 2016 as a result of private investment which grew by 2.9%, improving from an expansion of 0.6% in 2016. On the other hand, public sector investment contracted by 1.2%, decelerating from 9.5% in 2016.

Private Investment

Private investment at current market prices registered the value of Baht 2,655,115 million, consisting of Baht 526,729 million for private construction and Baht 2,128,386 million for private machinery and equipment. Private investment in real terms increased by 2.9%, improving from an expansion of 0.6% in 2016.

Private construction at current market prices recorded the value of Baht 526,729 million, consisting of residential, non-residential, and other constructions with the value of Baht 297,375 million, Baht 150,369 million, and Baht 61,007 million, respectively. Private construction in real terms decreased by 0.9%, compared to an expansion of 1.1% in 2016 as a result of residential buildings which grew by 0.1%, slowing from a 2.3% growth in the previous year. Other construction contracted by 8.0% from an 8.0% growth in the previous year.

Private investment on equipment and machineries at current prices posted the value of Baht 2,128,386 million which rose by 3.9% in real term, improving from a 0.4% increase in 2016. Such an expansion was attributed to an increase in imported capital goods of office machinery. Moreover vehicles and transport equipment also expanded due to an increase in truck and buses.

Public investment

Public investment at current market prices posted at the value of Baht 925,770 million, comprising public construction and public machinery and equipment with the value of Baht 685,445 million and Baht 240,325 million, consecutively. Public investment in real terms shrank by 1.2%, in comparison to a rise of 9.5% in 2016.

Public investment

Public construction at current market prices registered the value of Baht 685,445 million, consisting of residential, non-residential, and other constructions with the value of Baht 15,398 million, Baht 133,456 million, and Baht 536,592 million, respectively. The real value of public construction dropped by 3.0%, in contrast to an expansion of 13.9% in 2016 due to a decrease of disbursement of government investment project particularly loans on development and management project for water resources management system and urgent-phase for road transport system. Meanwhile, the state enterprises construction maintained ongoing projects such as housing development projects of the National Housing Authority, main water supply plans of Metropolitan Waterworks Authority, the Green Line Project (Mo Chit - Saphan Mai - Khukhot) of the Mass Rapid Transit Authority of Thailand, and the Laemchabang Container Port Development Project and the Laemchabang Port Development Project under the Port Authority of Thailand.

Public machinery and equipment at current market prices valued at Baht 240,325 million. The real value of public machinery and equipment increased by 4.3% improving from a 2.2% contraction in the previous year. There were two imported aircrafts of Thai Airways International Public Company in this year

Investment classified by type of assets

Tangible fixed assets at current market prices recorded the value of Baht 3,442,619 million, composing of residential construction, non-residential construction, machinery and equipment, and produced assets with the value of Baht 312,773 million, Baht 811,055 million, Baht 2,311,166 million, and Baht 7,625 million, respectively. The real value of tangible fixed assets expanded by 1.6%, lower than an increase of 2.3% in 2016, attributed to a 0.8% decrease in residential construction, compared to a rise of 2.1% in 2016. Other constructions dropped by 1.7%, in contrast to an expansion of 3.2% in 2016. Likewise, machinery and equipment grew up by 3.2% improving from 2.0% growth in 2016, cultivated assets increased by 18.1% compared to 31.2% in 2016.

Intangible fixed assets at current market prices posted the value of Baht 120,288 million, consisting of mineral exploration and computer software with the values of 68,805 million and Baht 51,482 million, respectively. The real value of intangible assets rose by 7.8% decelerating from an expansion of 22.4% in the previous year, attributed to a 1.2% rise in mineral exploration in 2016 compared to a sharp rise 80.8% in 2016.

Cost of ownership transfer at current market prices valued at Baht 17,978 million. The real value decreased by 0.8%, in contrast to an increase of 5.4% in 2016.

Change in inventories

Change in inventories at the current price recorded a decrease of Baht 52,270 million in 2017. Accumulated stock of manufacturing, rice and crude oil slowed down while stock of agricultural products and monetary gold slightly increased. Stock of rice decreased from a slight increase of rice production whilst higher of rice export and domestic consumption. Decrease in stock was seen from manufacturing goods, namely motor vehicle, plastic and synthetic rubber as well as soap and detergent. Decrease in motor vehicle was from higher domestic demand as a result of domestic economic expansion and launched new domestic motor vehicle model. On the contrary, an increase in stock of manufacturing goods was found from general purpose machinery, wire and cable, and basic chemicals. Moreover, stock of monetary gold increased due to higher imports in line with falling in the world gold price. For agricultural goods, increase of stocks was from paddy and cassava. Consequently, the overall change in inventories declined in this year.

External Sectors

Both exports on goods and services receipts grew up.

Exports of goods and services

Exports of goods and services in 2017 at current market prices registered at Baht 10,534,707 million, expanded by 5.8%, accelerating from a 5.4% growth in 2016, resulting from continual growing in exports after declining in 2015. Meanwhile, service receipts slowed down.

Merchandise exports in 2017 at current prices posted the value of Baht 7,974,045 million, increased by 5.5% from 3.1% in 2016, as a result of favorable growth of agricultural products and manufacturing products. Export growing in agricultural products was from rice and rubber. Particularly, value of rice grew at the high level because Iran and Bangladesh returned to import rice from Thailand once again over the past several years. In addition, major African rice markets such as Benin, South Africa, and Cameroon also grew up at the high level. Export rubber was originated from China market, the major importer. Export value of manufacturing products increased from electronic products, in particular, communications devices which influenced from higher demand for telecommunications equipment and the internet connection in the global market. Exports of pickup and truck returned to expand in response to Australian demand. Moreover, major manufacturing products also expanded such as electrical appliances, metal and petroleum products. However, export of fishery products sharply slowed down due to falling in shrimp exports. Overall exports grew up in line with economic situation of major trading partners such as Japan, U.S.A., European Union and China. However, exports declined in Australia and Middle East. Meanwhile, export prices decreased slightly by 0.2% whereas exports volume expanded by 5.7%, accelerating from 0.3% in 2016.

Service receipts at a current market prices valued at Baht 2,560,662 million, increased by 7.0% due to an expansion of the number of foreign tourists, especially ASEAN, East Asia, Europe and U.S.A. led to expansion of travel and transport receipts. In addition, other business services also increased.

Imports of goods and services

Imports of goods and services at current market prices posted the value of Baht 8,397,737 million, expanded by 7.6% compared to a drop of 0.7% in 2016, due to an expansion of both imported goods and services.

Merchandise imports at current market prices registered the value of Baht 6,815,779 million, grew by 8.7% in contrast to a 2.1% fall in 2016. Such a growth was found in all categories. Imports of consumer goods rose from animal & fishery products and food beverages and dairy products. Imports of intermediate goods and raw materials expanded, especially in main products such as crude oil, electronic parts and metals, etc., in line with production and exports of manufacturing products, particularly electronic products in response to global market demand. Imports of capital goods expanded from communications products and aircrafts in line with investment in machinery and equipment. Meanwhile, import prices level and imports volume increased by 1.2% and 7.4%, respectively.

Service payments at current market prices posted the value of Baht 1,581,958 million, expanded by 3.0% attributed to an expansion of freight and travel service payments in line with international trade and the number of outbound Thai tourists, Meanwhile, other business services shrank.

Imports on goods and services increased.

Current account surplus maintained at the high level.

Trade and services balance and current account

Trade and services balance at current market prices presented a surplus of Baht 2,136,970 million, slightly lower than surplus of Baht 2,147,890 million in 2016, a surplus derived from both trade and service balance. Trade surplus of Baht 1,158,266 million was slightly lower than Baht 1,289,479 million surplus in 2016. Service balance posted a surplus of Baht 978,704 million, kept increasing from Baht 858,411 million in 2016. Primary income (net factor income) showed a deficit of Baht 689,834 million, compared to a deficit of Baht 685,365 million in 2016. Secondary income registered surplus value at Baht 255,338 million, higher than a surplus in 2016. Ultimately, aggregation of all components, current account registered surplus of Baht 1,702,474 million, slightly decreasing from a surplus of Baht 1,703,101 million in 2016.



National income and savings

National income

National income in 2017 at current market prices valued at Baht 14,762,125 million, growing by 6.4%. Compensation of employees, 32.8% of national income, rose by 2.7%. Return on capital, land and entrepreneurs, 39.1% of national income, built up by 10.7%, principally due to entrepreneurship's return expanded as a high rate as previous year. However, net property income contracted from 2016. Furthermore, taxes on production and imports less subsidies and consumption of fixed capital increased by 5.1% and 5.4%, respectively.

Compensation of employees

Compensation of employees expanded by 2.7%, slower than 3.6% in preceding year.

Compensation of employees or return on labor in 2017 amounted at Baht 4,843,384 million, equivalent to 32.8% of Gross National Income (GNI), increased by 2.7%, slower than a 3.6% rise in 2016. Compensation of employees decelerated in both public and private sectors. In addition, wages and salaries and employers' social contributions and other welfare increased by 2.3% and 5.2%, respectively. In 2017, new minimum wage enforcement was implemented with 5-10 Baht per day increasing in various provinces instead of maintaining 300 Baht per day in the whole country. However, there was a minimum wage 300 Baht per day in some provinces, so an average minimum wage slightly increased. Meanwhile, salaries in government sector were increased only on an annual regular rising, without extra salary account adjustment. Labor force survey by the National Statistical Office (NSO) in 2017 indicated that employed persons fell by 0.6%. Private employees, 80.6% proportion of total employees, diminished by 0.1%, while number of public employees slightly increased.

Private and Public compensation of employees

Public compensation of employees, 34.9% share of total compensation of employees, raised by 3.2%, lower than 4.1% in 2016. Government compensation of employees increased by 4.0% whereas compensation of employees of state enterprises dropped by 0.3%. Private compensation of employees (net compensation of employees from abroad included), 65.1% of total compensation of employees, increased by 2.4%, slower than 3.3% in 2016. Compensation of employees in agricultural sector accelerated in contrast to deceleration in non-agricultural sector.

Compensating of employees in agricultural sector increased, while that of non-agricultural sector slowed down.

Compensation of employees by sector

Compensation of employees in agricultural sector recorded the value at Baht 195,598 million, 4.0% proportion of total compensation of employees, expanded by 3.4%, improving from 0.9% in 2016. These were originated from an increase in employment and planting area as well as an increase in cultivated farms. Furthermore, major crop yield also increased in line with higher precipitation level.

Compensation of employees in non-agricultural sector valued at Baht 4,638,523 million, 95.8% of total compensation of employees, boosted up by 2.9%, lower than 3.7% in the previous year.

Compensation of employees in industrial sector, 29.0% of total compensation of employees, expanded by 1.2%, lower than 2.2% in 2016. Compensation on employees in manufacturing, the largest proportion, increased by 1.2%, less than 2.3% in 2016. Compensation of employees in mining and quarrying expanded by 2.7%, better than 3.6% reduction in the preceding year. Compensation of employees in electricity, gas, steam and air condition supply together with water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities grew up by 1.2% and 8.2%, respectively.

Compensation of employees in services sector, 66.8% of total compensation of employees, increased by 3.7%, lower than a growth of 4.4% in 2016. Compensation of employees in wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles and accommodation and food service activities built up by 5.3% and 12.7%, respectively, driven by production expansion in line with the improvement of Thais and foreign tourist consumption expenditure in the domestic market, led to better employment situation and average compensation of employees in these two activities. Compensation of employees in transportation and storage grew up by 2.9%, less than 4.2% in the previous year. In addition, compensation of employees of transportation showed a positive sign from private operators, in contrast to the lower of compensation of employees of state enterprises. Compensation of employees in financial and insurance activities expanded by 1.9%, decelerating from 3.9% in 2016, mainly originated from lower compensation of employees in commercial bank in contrast to higher for insurance business. Compensation of employees in public administration and defence; compulsory social security, education and human health and social work activities expanded by 3.8%, 2.9% and 5.8%, compared to a growth of 4.4%, 3.1% and 7.0% in 2016, respectively. These were affected from deceleration in public compensation of employees in all 3 activities. Economic activities with lessening in compensation of employees consisted of construction and activities of households as employers. In addition, compensation of employees in other activities of services sector grew up 2.5%, better than 2.0% in the preceding year.

Net compensation of employees from the rest of the world registered at Baht 9,263 million, declined by 57.9% from the previous year. In particular, compensation of employees from the rest of the world fell by 11.2% whereas compensation to the rest of the world expanded by 7.0%.

Returns on land, capital, and entrepreneurs

Net return on land, capital, and entrepreneurship posted the value at Baht 5,770,810 million, 39.1% of national income, grew up at the rate of 10.7%, slightly accelerating from 10.2% in 2016.

Income from farms and households and non-profit institutions serving households (NPISHs) mixed income registered at Baht 3,011,056 million, equivalence to 20.4% of Gross National Income, grew up by 8.2%, slowed down from a 9.7% increase in 2016. Income from farm expanded by 3.9%, accelerating from 1.5% in the preceding year, due greatly to a rebound in agricultural production after 3 consecutive years contraction for example paddy, rubber, oilseed plant and sugarcane. Moreover, other self-employed and unincorporated enterprise income revealed in favorable expansion even it a bit deceleration.

Income from entrepreneurship or profit of corporations showed the value of Baht 2,074,573 million, expanded by 20.0%, attributed to favorable rate of growth of private corporations and government enterprises.

Households and non-profit institutions serving households (NPISHs) net income from property presented Baht 659,760 million, decreased by 3.3%, from a 4.8% fall in 2016, resulting from a decline of income receipt whereas income payment rose.

Households and NPISHs property receipt posted value at Baht 1,032,959 million or decreased 1.4% from a fall of 2.8% in 2016 as a result of interest and dividend income, the two main items decreased by 6.0% and 2.0%, respectively. Especially, interest income from commercial banks continued to decline. Although, average deposit of households and non-profit institutions increased slightly, average deposit interest rate in 2017 declined lower than the previous year. As a result, interest on deposits for households and non-profit institutions dropped by 4.9%, recovering from a 10.6% decline in the previous year. Household dividends from business sector fell by 2.0%, kept declining from a 3.7% in 2016. Particularly, households dividends receipt from private corporations was important factor, the main post declined from last year. However, household dividends receipt from cooperatives and state enterprises increased by 9.2% and 23.4%, respectively. Income from rent of agricultural land decreased by 0.2% whereas other benefits income continued to expand continuously.

Households and NPISHs property payment posted the value of Baht 373,199 million, or increased by 2.1% from a 1.2% growth in 2016. Interest payment, the major part of expenditures, expanded by 2.5%, rising from higher interest of both households and NPISHs paid to banks, pawnshops and cooperatives as a result of increasing in personal loans. Meanwhile, an average loan interest rate was slightly lower than the previous year for other mortgage and interest expenses including rent for agricultural land, which value this year decreased from 2016.

General government income from property consisted of income from rent, interest, and dividends which increased by 3.3%, compared to 2.9% in 2016. The decrease was mainly from rent income which decreased by 13.4%, attributed to a fall of extra-received benefits from petroleum royalty. Income from interests fell by 1.1%, owing partially to a decrease in interest on loans from student loan funds and deposit return from financial institutions. Meanwhile, dividend income increased by 7.4%, attributed to a rise in dividend from income of state enterprises and extra revenue from the net profit from the operation of the Government Lottery Office.

Saving and saving - investment gap

Gross saving posted the value at Baht 5,231,089 million, equivalent to the 10.1% rate of growth, lower than a 13.8% expansion in 2016. Net saving posted the value at Baht 2,335,400 million, maintained a growth of 22.6% the same as the preceding year. An expansion of net saving mainly influenced from high level rising rate in government's net saving because of Baht 75,538 million deficit in 2017 less than larger amount deficit of Baht 148,684 million in 2016. Net saving of public corporations and government enterprises slowed down. Net saving of private sector grew by 18.9%, lower than a 24.3% increase 2016, on account of a slowdown in both households and NPISHs and corporations and cooperatives. Consumption of fixed capital registered at Baht 2,622,751 million, grew by 5.4%, gradually slowing down from the preceding year.

Private net saving

Private net saving comprised households and NPISHs, private corporations and cooperatives presented the value of Baht 2,195,376 million, rose by 18.9%, less than 24.3% in 2016.

1) Net saving of households and non-profit institutes

Households and NPISHs net saving showed the value at Baht 927,913 million, grew by 14.7%, due to consecutive expansion of disposable income which affected by higher growth rate of income than of payment. Moreover, private final consumption expenditure grew at a lower rate than disposable income, so households and NPISHs net saving expanded.

Households and NPISHs income valued at Baht 9,620,009 million, increased by 4.5%, compared to the preceding year, supported by growing of both primary and secondary income receivable. Primary income receivable, the principal source of income, increased by 4.0%, consisted of (1) compensation of employees, 50.3% of households and NPISHs income, increased by 2.7% (2) households and NPISHs mixed income, 31.3% of total income, expanded by 8.2% and (3) property income fell by 1.4% owing to a decrease in interest income and dividend from private corporations in accordance with a lower interest rate and dividend payout ratio. Secondary income receivable comprising social benefit other than social transfers in kind and other current transfers grew by 11.1%.

Primary and secondary income payment, inevitable expenses, valued at Baht 1,307,119 million, increased by 1.9%, lower than a growth of 5.2% in 2016. Property income payable rose by 2.1%, enhancing from 1.2% in 2016. Income taxes diminished by 3.0%, falling from a 3.6% growth in 2016. In contrast, net social security contribution lifted up by 5.6% and current transfer to government and abroad inclined.

Income of households and NPISHs was greater than payment, led to a 4.9% growth of households and NPISHs disposable income, slightly higher than a 4.8% rise in the preceding year. After deducting private final consumption expenditure with a 3.8% growth and adjusting change in pension entitlement, households and NPISHs net saving revealed the rate of growth at 14.7%. In other words, average households and NPISHs net saving was at Baht 13,716 per person, rising by 14.3%.

2) Net saving of private corporations and cooperatives

Private corporations and cooperatives net saving which adjusted by national accounts definition, recorded the value at Baht 1,267,463 million, increased by 22.3%, lower than a growth of 29.3% in 2016. Private corporations net saving registered at Baht 1,255,795 million, boosting up by 22.4%, mainly originated from expansion of listed companies in the Stock Exchange of Thailand (private commercial banks and public corporations excluded) and other private corporations. On the other hand, commercial banks, international net saving and international transfer declined. Furthermore, cooperatives saving posted at Baht 11,668 million, kept the rate of growth similar to the preceding year at 7.6%.

Public net saving

Public net saving consisting of general government, public corporations and government enterprises presented the value at Baht 140,024 million, extremely boosting up by 135.2%. Government net saving recorded deficit at Baht 75,538 million, better than Baht 148,684 million deficit in 2016. Public corporations and government enterprises net saving posted at Baht 215,562 million, rose by 3.5%, decelerating from a rise of 66.1% in the preceding year.

1) General government net savings

General government net savings recorded the deficit value of Baht 75,538 million, considered to be the fourth consecutive year deficit. However, it improved from the deficit of Baht 148,684 million in 2016. In 2017, revenues of general government registered the value of Baht 4,545,562 million, an increase of 5.4% whereas the major item income from taxes decelerated by 5.8%. Meanwhile, total use of gross income posted at Baht 4,190,603 million, which increased by 3.4% less than 6.1% in 2016. In the meantime, the value of adjustment for the change in pension entitlement valued Baht 144,391 million, or increased by 6.8%. Consumption of fixed capital valued at Baht 286,107 million, or rose by 4.6%. Consequently, general government net saving increased by 49.2%, compared to a 163.8% decrease in 2016.

An increase in general government income in 2017 came mainly from taxes on production and imports, property holdings, general government income from property, and current taxes on income, which showed an increase, enabled to categorize as follows.

Taxes on production and imports regarded as the main source of revenues with the proportion of 34.9%, increased by 4.4%, owing to an increase in the value of government taxes collection.

Expansion of taxes revenue were from: (1) Value added taxes (VAT) as a result of an increase in vat collection originating from importing raw materials, intermediate products as well as oil products. The main reason was from maintaining the same level of crude oil price in global market between this year and last year. Moreover, value added tax on consumption still expanded including accommodation sector (as a result of the expansion from number of tourists), the association of financial service and insurance and beverage production; (2) Liquor tax and stamp; (3) Specific business tax due to an increase in tax collection from the commercial banks which was from an expansion of commercial banks loan. However, the Department of Lands experienced in a transfer fee collection decrease due to base effect irregular high last year as a result of boosting real estate measure, effective from 29 October 2015 to 28 April 2016 and (4) Non-alcoholic beverage tax, on the other hand, decelerated distributable to: (1) Oil and oil products tax as a result of the lower price in the global market, even though some kinds of oil tax rates were risen which caused higher amount for oil and oil product collection in 2017 higher than the previous year; (2) Import excise tax; (3) Income from the Government Lottery Office and (4) Motor-vehicle tax.

Taxes Declining of tax revenue was from: (1) Tax on brewery; (2) Petroleum royalty due to lower turnover as a result of a continuous reduction of crude oil price and natural gas (liquid) since the end of 2014, affecting turnover and profits of petroleum producers which was seen from lower tax collection on net profit, expected net profit and profit distribution to abroad; (3) Income from Thailand Tobacco Monopoly and (4) Tobacco tax and stamp.

Property Income from government and Investment income payable on pension entitlements with the share of 5.2% of total government revenue increased by 3.3%, as a result of an income from dividend with the share of 54.9% of total government property income, increased by 7.4%, partly contribute to income from Government Saving Bank, Expressway Authority of Thailand and Government Housing Bank. Meanwhile, other property incomes including investment income from pension entitlements increased by 4.2%, which was lower than the previous year, due to a recession of dividend and interest receipt (child and senility allowance program) from social security fund. However, interest income decreased by 1.1% due to a decrease in return of deposit from financial institutions and return of student loan and rents decreased by 13.3%, attributed to a decrease from extra-received benefit from petroleum royalty.

Current taxes on income, wealth, etc. with the share of 22.5% of total government revenue rose by 8.2%. Tax expansion was found from corporate income tax, which increased 15.2%. There were 3 main reasons contributed to the growth:

(1) Tax on net profit and expected net profit was higher than the previous year by 0.5% as result of higher corporate income tax for the year 2016 collected in 2017. Similarly, tax collection on expected net profit increased, according to an economic expansion during the first half of 2017, especially for production of coke and refined petroleum sector, electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning sector as well as food production sector. Tax collection on net profit was lower compared to base effect in the previous year since there was a new high standard from the correction of tax calculation; (2) Tax collection on service fees and profit distribution abroad decreased by 1.6%, as a result a decrease in corporate turnover in 2016 which led to reduction of service fees and profit distribution abroad in business sector; (3) Withholding tax collection by private sector increased by 5.0% in response to an economic expansion especially for transportation and communications sector, financial intermediation sector, and real estate, renting and business activities sector. Petroleum income tax collection decreased by 15.7% as a result of a lower turnover due to a reduction of crude oil price and national gas (liquid). Besides, personal income tax collection decreased by 3.7% as a result of reducing tax on salary base collection by 3.5% as a consequence of restructuring personal income tax in compliance to Section 40 (1).

For additional deductible allowances, the restructuring was effective only for an income earned from January 1, 2017 onwards. Therefore, withholding tax on salary was lower than the previous year. In government sector, withholding tax on salary also decreased by 17.7% as well as private sector which dropped by 2.2%. Finally, withholding tax on interest payment collection fell by 1.9% and withholding tax collection on real estate transaction decreased by 9.0%.

Social contributions with the proportion of 11.9% to total government revenue decelerating by 5.6%, compared to an increase of 11.1% in 2016 as a consequence of a deceleration in both employer and employee contributions to social security fund. Meanwhile, contribution rate of both employers and employees stayed at the same rate as last year.

Miscellaneous current transfers, receivable with the 1.0% share of total government revenue increased by 0.5% because of an increase in income from pay fine and other income transfers.

Interest paid with the 4.0% share of total use of gross income, decreased by 0.5% as a result of: (1) Short-term yield from commercial banks loan decreased by 51.5% according to falling of loans along with low short-term interest rate; (2) Government bond yield as bond redemption increased by 52.0% whereas short-term yield was lower than movement of policy interest rate as a result of the short-term supply of bond of Bank of Thailand. However, short-term government bond yield is started increasing in November 2017 after the investors tended to shift the investment to long-term security with a higher profit. Meanwhile, medium-term and long-term yield volatized in October, in response to external factors, especially an uncertainty from the United State tax system reform. However, supply of Thai government bond was increased and led to rising in bond yield. Similarly, there was a clear direction for the United State tax system reform resulting higher U.S. bond yield along with Thai government bond yield; (3) Interest paid of international debt decreased by 0.2%. However, interest payment of treasury bill discount increased by 63.5% as a results of bills redemption with an increase of 22.7%. Promissory notes for debt restructuring increased by 26.9% in response to a 10.5% rise in redemption of promissory note for debt returning.

Subsidies with the share of 1.5% to total use of gross income decreased by 11.3% as a result of a decrease in subsidy on sugarcane producers and sugar funds together with export subsidies.

Social benefits other than social transfers in kind with the share of 10.9% to total use of gross income expanded by 7.8%, decelerating from an increase of 12.3% in 2016 due to a normal pension, descended pension, monthly pension, investment benefits, senility pension. On the other hand, senility allowance, disabled allowance and out-patient medical fees increased. Similarly, government scheme to strengthen grassroots economy "state welfare scheme", which intended to raise income for poor people, valued Baht 8,924 million (beneficially participants first received since October 2017).

Miscellaneous current transfers, payable with the share of 2.5% to total use of gross income increased by 7.0% compared to an increase of 14.1% in 2016. Operating expenses-household sector and compensation increased. In addition, subsidy for victim from natural disaster decreased.

2) Net saving of public corporations and government enterprises

Public corporations and government enterprises net saving recorded the value at Baht 215,562 million, increased by 3.5%, slowing down from a 66.1% growth in 2016. Public corporations and government enterprises net profit in business accounting format for this calendar year showed the value at Baht 194,254 million or shortened by 6.5%, maintained contracting but recovering from an 18.8% drop in 2016. After consolidated with Baht 197,688 million of national accounts definition adjustment, public corporations and government enterprises net profit in national accounts aspect before profit allocation registered at Baht 391,943 million, rising by 3.5% but slowing down from 33.7% in 2016. After deducting by profit allocation, comprising of (1) dividend (2) profit delivered to government and (3) bonus payment from net profit, with a growth of 3.6%, public corporations and government enterprises net saving slowed down.

Public corporations net saving or performance in national accounts aspects posted the value of Baht 80,119 million, dropped by 3.6%, slowing down from a 64.5% increase in 2016. Government enterprises showed net saving at Baht 135,443 million, rose by 8.3%, slowing down from a 67.2% rise in the previous year.

Saving-investment gap

Gross saving registered value at Baht 5,231,089 million, continued expanding by 10.1% from the preceding year. Gross capital formation or investment registered at Baht 3,528,615 million, boosting up by 15.8%, compared to a 0.8% rise in the previous year. Such gross saving and investment brought about a surplus of saving-investment gap at Baht 1,702,474 million, equivalent to 11.0% of GDP, slightly diminishing from Baht 1,703,101 million in 2016.

GDP Implicit Price Deflator

Overall price level increased by 2.1% decelerating from a 2.5% rise in the previous year.

GDP Implicit Price Deflator

GDP Implicit Price Deflator grew by 2.1%, slowing down from a rise of 2.5% in the previous year. Agricultural price deflator expanded by 0.9%, slightly decelerating from an expansion of 2.1% in the previous year. Meanwhile, non-agricultural price deflator rose by 2.2%, compared to a rise of 2.5% in the previous year as a result of a slowdown in deflators contributed chiefly to main activities namely manufacturing; electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply; wholesale and retail trade; accommodation and food service; public administration and defence; education; and human health and social work. For activities with a higher price index level comprised mining and quarrying; water supply, sewerage, waste management and remediation; construction; information and communication; professional, scientific and technical activities; and other service activities. Meanwhile, price index level of transportation and storage; financial and insurance; and real estates declined.

On the expenditure side, overall price deflator rose by 1.3%, decelerating from a rise of 2.8% in the previous year. Private consumption expenditure price deflator expanded by 0.8%, compared to a rise of 0.5% in the previous year. In addition, price deflator of investment rose by 1.7% and price of government final consumption expenditure grew by 2.5%. For external sector, price deflator of exports of goods and services rose by 0.4%, decelerating from a rise of 2.5% in 2016. Meanwhile, price deflator of imported goods and services increased by 1.3%, higher than a previous growth of 0.3%.

Consumer price index (CPI) expanded by 0.7%, compared to a rise of 0.2% in the previous year while producer price index (PPI) increased 0.7%, recovering from a drop of 1.2% in the previous year.




