The Office of the National Economic and Social Development Council (NESDC) is responsible for compiling the National Income of Thailand in compliance with the International System of National Accounts (SNA). The National Income of Thailand covers 3 sides of approaches covering production, expenditure and income, which reflects the overall economic activities of accounting of the country.

The National Income of Thailand 2023 edition, following the International System of National Accounts (SNA), is compiled using the chained volume measures (CVMs) in measuring the real terms. In this 2023 edition, data are revised back to 2021 in accordance with the latest available primary data. This is to ensure the accuracy and consistency of the entire system of national accounts. Details of revisions are indicated in the revision note on the following pages.

On this occasion, we would like to express our gratitude to agencies and individuals who constantly supply basic data as well as contribute suggestions on enhancing compilation of the National Income of Thailand and other statistic accounts.

Revisions to the National Income of Thailand 2023 Edition

In this publication, the estimates have been revised back to 2021. The revisions were made based on the most recent data from the primary sources as follows:

1. Revised data

- Agricultural, forestry, and fishing: revised agricultural figures back to 2021 according to the Agricultural Statistics of Thailand 2023 from the Office of Agricultural Economics, and amended fishery figures back to 2021 according to the Fisheries Statistics of Thailand 2023 from the Department of Fisheries.
- Mining and quarrying: revised mineral production figures back to 2021 according to mineral production of Thailand from the Department of Primary Industries and Mines, and the Department of Mineral Fuels.
- Manufacturing sector: revised industrial production figures back to 2021 according to the Manufacturing Product Index (MPI) from the Office of Industrial Economics, Ministry of Industry; revised imports and exports of merchandise data from the Custom Department; and other revised inline with relevant activities for example agriculture, Mining and quarrying, and transportation.
- Wholesale and retail; trade and repair of motor vehicles and motorcycle: revised data back to 2021 due to updated production data of manufacturing, agriculture and mining sectors.
- Accommodation and catering services: revised income for the Value Added Taxes assessment back to 2022.
- Financial and insurance activities: revised data back to 2021 according to the updated annual reports of specialized financial institutions and other financial institutions; revised life and non-life insurances from the Office of Insurance Commission (OIC).
- Electricity, Construction, Transportation and storage, and Information and communication: revised data back to 2021on account of updating in relevant data.
- Water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities and real estate activities; revised data back to 2022.
- Private final consumption expenditure, General government consumption expenditure, Gross fixed capital formation, and change in inventories; revised data back to 2021 according to relevant data sources.
- Exports and Imports of goods and services: revised back to 2021, in accordance with the updated balance of payments from the Bank of Thailand.
- Updated other basic data according to the latest data available from original data sources.

2. Abbreviation

- New Classification of Individual Consumption by Purpose (COICOP: 2018) is implemented for Private Final Consumption Expenditure (PFCE).
- Gross Domestic Production at current factor cost by economic activities are replaced with GrossDomestic Product at basic prices by economic activities as presented in table 4.
- This publication has two letters assigned after data period (s) in tables (r and p). The letter "r" stands for "revised" representing revision figures based on most recent data, coverage, and compilation methodology. Moreover, the letter "p" stands for "preliminary" annual figure, subject to revisions in the next series of publications.

Executive Summary

The Thai economy in 2023, measured by the Gross Domestic Product (GDP), grew by 2.0%, decelerated from the 2.6% growth observed in 2022. The slowdown was observable in both agricultural and non-agricultural sectors. As a result, there was a decrease in agricultural production of main crops. Concurrently, non-agricultural production was affected by the decline in manufacturing production, regarding weakening external demand from trading partners' economies. In contrast, the services sector accelerated as the number of foreign tourists increased with higher growth rate and domestic travelling activities continuously expanded.

Total production rose by 2.0%, propelled by a 2.0% growth in agricultural production, which decelerated from 2.4% in 2022. The yields of main crops dropped, resulting from El Niño phenomenon which reduced rainfall. The non-agricultural production increased by 2.0%, from 2.6% in 2022. The deceleration in non-agricultural production was induced by a decrease in manufacturing sector, reflected by lower external demand which was in line with economic situation of trading partners. Meanwhile service sector production simultaneously grew in various sectors, including wholesale and retail trade, repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles, as well as, transportation and storage, etc.

For domestic demand, private final consumption expenditure increased by 6.9%, accelerated from 6.2% in 2022. The expansion was influenced by a rise in the number of foreign tourists, resulting in higher expenditure for food and beverages. This was coupled by lower unemployment rate, causing an increase in household income. However, general government final consumption declined by 4.7%, from an increase of 0.1% in 2022. Gross fixed capital formation rose by 1.2%, slowed down from 2.2% in 2022. Notably, private investment displayed consecutive growth, while public investment dropped. In terms of the external sector, exports and imports of goods and services grew by 2.4% and 2.5%, respectively.

National income in 2023 registered a value of 17,505,174 million baht, presented an increase of 4.0%. Sources of income included a return on labor with a value of 5,618,954 million baht, expanded by 3.9%. Additionally, returns on capital, land, and entrepreneurs valued at 7,048,418 million baht expanded by 2.9%. In addition, taxes on production and import, less subsidies, valued at 1,669,558 million baht, increased by 16.1%. Consumption of fixed capital valued at 3,168,244 million baht, expanded by 1.2%. In per capita terms, national income per capita in 2023 was 249,928 baht, rose from 240,860 baht in 2022. Disposable income per capita was 147,603 baht, and consumption expenditure per capita was 147,351 baht. Consequently, per capita personal savings was valued at 2,091 baht in 2022.

For overall economic stability, gross saving increased by 1.4%, an improvement from a fall of 1.3% in 2022. Gross investment fell by 16.7%. Consequently, the saving-investment gap (equivalent to the current account) posted a surplus with a value of 266,723 million baht, accounting for 1.5% of GDP. This was better than a deficit of 602,207 million baht in 2022.

GDP implicit price deflator increased by 1.3%, decelerated from 4.7% in 2022. The deceleration was contributed to the agricultural price index, which dropped by 0.6%, from a 5.1% increase in 2022. Moreover, the non-agricultural price index increased by 1.5%, compared to 4.6% in 2022. In addition, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) and the Producer Price Index (PPI) expanded by 1.2% and 2.4%, orderly.

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
Thai Economy in 2023, National Accounts Perspectives

Overview

GDP in 2023 rose by 2.0%, decelerated from 2.6% in 2022.

Gross Domestic Product for 2023 experienced a growth of 2.0%, slowed down from 2.6% in 2022. The deceleration was noticeable in both agricultural and non-agricultural sectors. The agricultural sector grew by 2.0%, resulting from a decrease in agricultural production of main crops. The non-agricultural production rose by 2.0%, from 2.6% in 2022. This was affected by a decline in industrial sector, regarding weak external demand from trading partners' economies. In contrast, the services sector accelerated as the number of foreign tourists and domestic travelling activities simultaneously expanded.

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) in 2023 at current market prices valued at 17,954,667 million baht. After deducting 449,493 million baht of net factor income from the rest of the world, Gross National Income (GNI) registered at 17,505,174 million baht, increased by 4.0%. Per capita NI was 249,928 baht, higher than 240,860 baht in 2022, or expanded by 3.8%.



Domestic Demand: Private final consumption expenditure in 2023 increased by 6.9%, accelerated from 6.2% in 2022. On the contrary, government final consumption expenditure dropped by 4.7%, from a rise of 0.1% in 2022. Gross fixed capital formation rose by 1.2%, decelerated from 2.2% in 2022. Supporting factors for domestic demand included (1) an increase in tourist-related activities as the number of foreign tourists visiting Thailand rose; (2) lower unemployment rate boosted household income; (3) expenditure stimulus measures and a cost of living allowance for energy consumption contributing to higher purchasing power of household; and (4) an expansion in machinery and equipment investment in the private sector.

External Sector: Exports of goods and services at current market prices in 2023 expanded by 3.4%, continued from 19.9% in 2022. There was a 2.1% drop in merchandise exports, while service receipts increased by 43.9%. On the import side, imports of goods and services at current market prices fell by 3.0%. In particular, merchandise imports decreased by 4.5%, while service payments rose by 3.7%. As a result, the trade and services balance at current market prices valued a surplus of 370,766 million baht, after two years of deficit during COVID-19 pandemic. This was attributed to a trade surplus of 683,212 million baht, compared to a surplus of 465,175 million baht in 2022. In contrast, services registered a deficit of 312,446 million baht, lower than the deficit of 832,404 million baht in 2022. However, net factor income was recorded at a deficit of 449,493 million baht, improved from a deficit of 553,723 million baht. The improvement was from both compensation of employees and property income. On the other hand, net current transfers recorded a surplus of 345,450 million baht, higher than that of 2022. Ultimately, the current account registered a surplus of 266,723 million baht in 2023, from a deficit of 602,207 million baht in 2022.

National Income (NI) or income from factors of production in 2023 recorded the value of 17,505,174 million baht, increased by 4.0%. This expansion was propelled by the compensation of employees, constituting 32.1% of NI and experiencing an increase of 3.9%. Net property income and operating income, accounting for 40.3% of NI, rose by 2.9%. Moreover, consumption of fixed capital, representing 18.1% of NI, with a rise of 1.2%. Taxes on production and imports less subsidies, constituting 9.5%, recorded a gain of 16.1%.

Gross Domestic Savings in 2023 registered with value of 4,299,434 million baht, reflecting a rise of 1.4%, compared to a 1.3% drop in 2022. Consequently, overall net savings, valued at 1,378,349 million baht, fell by 5.1%, from an increase of 2.7% in 2022. The drop was contributed by a decrease of 35.1% in private saving, while public saving rose by 132.3%.

Overall Economic Stability saving revealed a rise of 1.4%. Meanwhile, overall investment decreased by 16.7%. As a result, the saving-investment gap (equivalent to the current account) registered a surplus of 266,723 million baht, from a deficit of 602,207 million baht in 2022. The surplus accounted for 1.5% of gross domestic product.

GDP Implicit Price Deflator increased by 1.3%, decelerated from 4.7% in 2022. The agricultural price index fell by 0.6%, compared to a 5.1% rise in 2022. Furthermore, the non-agricultural price index increased by 1.5%, slowed down from 4.6% in 2022. The consumer price index (CPI) expanded by 1.2%, and the producer price index (PPI) dropped by 2.4%.

Gross Domestic Product

GDP in 2023 expanded by 2.0%, after 2.6% in 2022.

Gross domestic product in 2023 increased by 2.0%, decelerated from 2.6% in 2022, driven by slowdown in both agricultural and non-agricultural sector. Agricultural sector grew by 2.0%, lower than 2.4% in 2022. This slowdown was attributable to the El Niño phenomenon, which resulted in a decrease in rainfall, led to lower yields of major crops. Besides, non-agricultural sector rose by 2.0%, compared to a rise of 2.6% in 2022. The key factor was the decline in industrial sector due to reduced external demand in response to the economic conditions of trading partner countries. Meanwhile, the service sector accelerated, propelled by the increasing number of foreign tourists and the continuous growth in domestic tourism, resulted in continual expansion of tourism-related sectors.

Agricultural production rose by 2.0%, slowed down from 2.4% in 2022. This growth was propelled by lower yields of main crops, including paddy, sugarcane, oil palm, and rubber. Meanwhile, livestock production increased due to higher production of swine and broiler. Additionally, fishery production expanded due to an increase in marine fishery production.

Non-agricultural production increased by 2.0%, lower than 2.6% in 2022. Industrial sector declined by 1.9%, compared to a rise of 0.6% in 2022. The decrease was driven by manufacturing production which dropped by 2.7%, after an increase of 1.3% in 2022, owing to reduced external demand in response to the economic conditions of trading partners. In addition, service sector expanded by 4.2%, accelerated from 3.7% in 2022. This growth was propelled by an expansion in tourism-related sectors including accommodation and food service activities; wholesale and retail trade, and repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles; and transportation and storage.

Agricultural sector Overall agricultural pro-

Agricultural production grew by 2.0%. Prices of agricultural products decreased by 0.6%.

Overall agricultural production grew by 2.0%, slowed down from 2.4% in 2022. Production of both non-perennial crops and perennial crops rose by 0.5% and 0.9%, orderly. Livestock production grew by 6.9%. Agricultural services expanded by 11.9%. Production of forestry and fishery increased by 0.9% and 4.0%, respectively. Moreover, implicit prices of agricultural products decreased by 0.6%, compared to a rise of 5.1% in 2022.

Agriculture, forestry and fishing


Total production expanded by 2.0%, consisted of several production activities as follows:

- **Non-perennial** grew by 0.5%, due to higher yields of main crops such as vegetable and maize which rose by 5.8% and 5.7%, respectively. Meanwhile, production of paddy declined by 0.4% due to the El Niño phenomenon, causing a reduction in rainfall, led to a drought.
- **Perennial crops** increased by 0.9%, driven by higher yields of major crops, particularly fruits, which grew by 6.5%. These included durian, mangosteen, and other fruits. However, there was a decrease in the yields of oil palm and rubber.
- **Livestock** grew by 6.9%, primarily due to an increase in production of swine and broiler, despite a decrease in production of hen's eggs, cattle, and buffalo.
- **Agricultural services** grew by 11.9%, driven by an increase in planting and harvest services corresponding to expanded planting area.
- Forestry and logging rose by 0.9%, propelled by an expansion in silviculture and other forest activities; and logging. Meanwhile, production of firewood and charcoal; and gathering of non-wood forest products declined.
- **Fishing** increased by 4.0%, resulted from an increase in marine fishery despite a decrease in freshwater fishery.

Implicit prices of agricultural products decreased by 0.6%, compared to a rise of 5.1% in 2022. The decline was attributable to lower prices of maize, oil palm, rubber, swine, cattle, and fishing products. Meanwhile, prices of paddy, sugar cane, pineapple, and other fruits increased.

Non-agricultural sector

Non-agricultural sector expanded by 2.0%.



Mining and quarrying

Mining and quarrying decreased by 1.2%, improved from a fall of 12.3% in 2022. The contraction was attributable to natural gas and crude oil production which declined by 0.8%, continued from a drop of 15.9% in 2022. This was driven by a 10.0% decline in crude oil production, continued from a 19.5% fall in 2022, in line with lower production in main sources; namely, Sirikit and others in the S1 group; Tantawan Benchamas group; and Erawan group. Additionally, the natural gas and condensate production decreased by 2.6%, after a fall of 14.7% in 2022, due to lower production in main sources including Erawan group; Bongkot; Sirikit; and Arthit. Similarly, the quarrying of stone, sand, and clay decreased by 0.6%, following a fall of 1.5% in 2022.

Manufacturing

Manufacturing decreased by 2.7%, compared to a rise of 1.3% in 2022. This was propelled by weak external demand in response to the economic conditions of trading partners. The industries with negative contributions included food products; chemical and chemical products; beverages; and computer, electronic and optical products, along with deceleration in refined petroleum products and motor vehicles. In 2023, production capacity utilization rate stood at 59.6%, lower than 63.6% in 2022.

Manufacturing with a contraction

- Food products decreased by 0.3%, compared to a rise of 7.3% in 2022. The manufacture of sugar; processed fruit and vegetable products; animal feed; and vegetable oil decreased. Meanwhile, that of whole-grain products; dairy products; and bakery products increased.
- **Beverages** declined by 1.0%, after a 4.0% increase in 2022. The manufacture of beer, wine, and energy drinks decreased, despite a slowdown in drinking water and expansion in alcohol and soft drinks.
- **Tobacco products** dropped by 6.7%, improved from a 10.7% fall in 2022, due to decrease in manufacture of tobacco products, and cigarettes and cigars, in line with domestic demand.
- Textile decreased by 9.5%, compared to a rise of 1.2% in 2022. The decline was found in manufacture of made-up textile articles, except apparel; weaving from synthetic fibers; and spinning of natural fibers.
- Wearing apparel decreased by 17.1%, continued from a decrease of 0.6% in 2022, due to lower manufacture of outerwear and other clothing accessories, such as scarves and shawls. Meanwhile, manufacture of underwear and sleepwear increased.
- Leather and other products dropped by 10.4%, compared to an expansion of 31.8% in 2022. The decline was driven by lower production in every product such as leather bag; footwears; and tanning and dressing of leather.

- Paper and paper products declined by 1.4%, improved from a fall of 7.0% in 2022. The recovery was attributable to an increase in manufacture of pulp; and other articles of paper and paperboard in response to demand from related industries. However, manufacture of corrugated paper and paperboard continually decreased.
- Chemical and chemical products fell by 1.9%, after a drop of 6.0% in 2022. The improvement was driven by recovery in manufacture of plastic pellets and primary plastics; soap and detergents; and cosmetic products, along with an increase in chemical fertilizers and gases used in industrial production.
- **Rubber and plastic products** decreased by 4.3%, following a decrease of 1.2% in 2022, owing to lower manufacture of tyre, sheet rubber and rubber blocks; fiberglass products; and plastic packaging, in line with demand from related industries.
- Other non-metallic mineral products dropped by 5.1%, compared to a 1.4% rise in 2022. This was driven by a decline in the production of all products, such as concrete products, cement, plaster, porcelain products, and glass and glass products.
- Basic metals dropped by 8.2%, improved from a fall of 10.8% in 2022, driven by a recovery in manufacture of basic iron and steel in response to demand from related industries.
- Fabricated metal products declined by 3.9%, continually decreased from 0.1% in 2022. This was attributable to a decrease in manufacture of tanks, construction metals, and metal cans. Meanwhile, manufacture of steam generators, wire products, chain, springs, bolts and screws increased.
- Computer, electronic and optical products declined by 16.0%, compared to a fall of 11.1% in 2022. This contraction was attributable to a lower manufacture of electronic components and boards; and computers and peripheral equipment. However, manufacture of watches and clocks; optical products; and photographic equipment increased.
- Electrical equipment dropped by 3.9%, after a 2.3% decline in 2022, due to a decrease in the manufacture of wiring and cables; air conditioners; refrigerators; and electric motors and generators, in line with domestic demand.
- Machinery and equipment fell by 6.2%, following a fall of 3.3% in 2022, due to lower manufacture of other general-purpose machinery; agricultural machinery except tractor; and engines and turbines, except aircraft, vehicle and cycle engines.
- Other transport equipment decreased by 4.2%, compared to an increase of 5.4% in 2022, due to a decline in building of ships and a slowdown in motorcycle production, in line with the domestic demand.
- **Furniture** contracted by 12.2%, lower than a drop of 11.7% in 2022, due to a decrease in manufacture of wooden and metal furniture in response to decline in domestic demand.
- Other manufacturing declined by 0.3%, in contrast to a rise of 4.6% in 2022. This was driven by decrease in manufacture of jewelry and related articles; and other manufacturing such as games and toys; and medical equipment.

Manufacturing with an expansion

- Wood and products of wood and cork increased by 5.2%, continually rose from 5.2% in 2022. The growth was driven by manufacture of veneer sheets and wood-based panels; and sawmilling and planing of wood.
- **Printing and reproduction of recorded media** rose by 1.0%, continually expanded from 0.7% in 2022, due to an increase in manufacture of newspaper and magazines.
- Coke and refined petroleum products rose by 3.7%, slowed down from 6.3% in 2022, in accordance with decelerated domestic demand.
- Basic pharmaceutical products and pharmaceutical preparation grew by 1.8%, decelerated from 13.8% in 2022. This increase was a response to heightened domestic demand of pharmaceutical products.
- Motor vehicles grew by 3.3%, slowed down from 10.3% in 2022. This growth was driven by an acceleration in manufacture of personal cars while that of parts and accessories for motor vehicles slowed down. However, manufacture of pickup truck decreased, in line with reduced domestic demand.

Electricity, gas and air conditioning supply

Electricity, gas, and air conditioning supply grew by 4.3%, from 3.4% in 2022. This growth was driven by electric power generation and transmission which expanded by 4.2%, from 4.8% in 2022. The expansion of electric power generation and transmission was propelled by an increase in electricity consumption in residential users, small and medium enterprises, despite a decrease in large enterprise. Besides, gas separation grew by 5.9%.

Water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities

Water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities increased by 5.0%, accelerated from 2022. This was attributable to water supply which grew by 5.6%, higher than 2.1% in 2022. Additionally, waste collection, treatment, disposal activities, and materials recovery expanded by 4.0%, compared to an 8.3% rise in 2022. This included a 3.1% increase in non-hazardous waste collection and a 4.8% rise in materials recovery, both of which slowed from 7.9% and 8.7% in 2022, respectively.

Construction

Construction decreased by 0.6%, marking an improvement compared to a 2.3% decrease in 2022. This was attributable to the continual expansion of non-dwelling construction especially for industrial plants and an increase in permitted construction areas. However, government construction experienced a decline, and state enterprise construction also slowed down.

Wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles

Wholesale and retail trade, and repair of motor vehicle and motorcycles grew by 3.9%, from 3.3% in 2022, owing to a continual increase in retail sales. The retailed trade was driven by accelerated private consumption expenditure as well as an increase in the number of foreign tourists. Meanwhile, sales of motor vehicles and motorcycles slowed down in response to a deceleration in domestic demand.

Transportation and storage

Transportation and storage rose by 8.8%, following an increase of 7.9% in 2022. The expansion was attributable to land, water, and air transport services, which increased by 4.6%, 0.2%, and 43.0%, respectively. These were attributable to an increase in passenger transport due partly to the foreign tourists whose number rose continually as well as an expansion in domestic travelling. Moreover, postal and courier activities grew by 4.5%, after 4.2% in 2022, in accordance with private operators' turnover.

Accommodation and food service activities

Accommodation and food service activities grew by 19.3%, following a rise of 34.9% in 2022. This increase was driven by expansions in accommodation and food services with 45.0% and 10.7% increase, compared to 88.9% and 23.5% in 2022, respectively. In 2023, the number of foreign tourists stood at 20,054,665 people, led by Malaysian, Chinese and South Korean orderly while the number of foreign tourists in 2022 recorded at 11,065,226 people, In addition, domestic travelling also increased.

Information and communication

Information and communication expanded by 3.6%, decelerated from 5.2% in 2022. This was mainly driven by telecommunication activities with a rise of 2.1%, lower than 4.8% in 2022, in line with communication operators' turnover. In addition, computer programming and consultancy activities grew by 7.3%, from 7.8% in 2022. Besides, programming and broadcasting activities; and motion picture, video and television program production, and sound recording activities rose by 0.3% and 3.2%, orderly.

Financial and insurance activities

Financial and insurance activities grew by 1.4%, compared to a decrease of 2.3% in 2022. This resulted from an expansion in volume of credits, deposits, and fees in commercial banks and specialized financial institutions. In addition, the net interest margin on loans and deposits increased, but the inflation rate decreased. Furthermore, credit-card business in non-banks expanded. Similarly, insurance mostly increased from life insurance. However, nonlife insurance continually dropped from the prior year due to decreased premiums from a deceleration in cars sales. Meanwhile, the overall operation of security companies continually decreased from a dropping turnover and fee incomes in 2022.

Real estate activities

Real estate activities increased by 1.5%, slowed down from 2.5% in 2022. This growth resulted from real estate activities with own or leased property which grew by 2.0%, compared to 3.0% in 2022. Meanwhile, real estate brokerage activities declined by 4.6% owing to the tightening credit approval by financial institutions, which affected consumer decision-making for purchase, along with the high level of household debt.

Professional, scientific and technical activities

Professional, scientific and technical activities grew by 3.2%, accelerated from 1.1% in 2022. The expansion was attributable to increase in legal and accounting activities; head offices and management consultancy activities; advertising and market research activities; other professional, scientific and technical activities; and veterinary activities.

Administrative and support services activities

Administrative and support services activities rose by 6.8%, accelerated from 4.8% in 2022. This expansion was attributable to a favorable expansion in rental and leasing activities; and security and investigation activities which rebounded from a decrease in 2022. In addition, travel agency, tour operator and reservation service activities decelerated in accordance with the number of foreign tourist arrivals and the changing travel habits. Additionally, general cleaning of the building activities; and other business support service activities also increased.

Education

Education increased by 0.6%, slowed down from 1.4% in 2022. Private education increased by 2.7% and public education rose by 0.9%, lower than 1.0% in 2022.

Human health and social work activities

Human health and social work activities grew by 4.1%, decelerated from 5.3% in 2022. This was attributable to an expansion in human health activities which grew by 4.5%, after 5.0% in 2022, driven by a slowdown in public health. However, other human health activities; residential care both with and without accommodation for the children and elderly; and other social work decreased.

Art, entertainment and recreation

Art, entertainment, and recreation increased by 2.1%, compared to a rise of 0.8% in 2022. The growth was propelled by acceleration in operation of sports facilities, along with an increase in activities of government lottery in accordance with the number of lotteries. Additionally, botanical garden activities; and creative, arts and entertainment activities increased.

Other service activities

Other service activities expanded by 2.6%, after a rise of 1.3% in 2022. This expansion was driven by an increase in membership organizations activities; repair of computers, and personal and household goods activities; and other personal service activities such as laundry service, spa, and haircut and beauty salon.

Expenditure on Gross Domestic Product

Private final consumption expenditure (PFCE) expanded by 6.9%.

Composition of Private Final Consumption Expenditure

Private final consumption expenditure increased by 6.9%, accelerated from 6.2% in 2022.



This expansion was driven by various factors, including the thriving tourism sector, particularly the increase in foreign tourists visiting Thailand, and supporting positive growth in food and beverage spending. Moreover, the lower unemployment rate resulted in higher household income, reflecting by the consumer confidence index in 2023 improving to 56.7%, compared to 43.9% in 2022. the government continued implementing policies to stimulate household spending and reduce the cost of living in energy by lowering fuel and electricity prices for vulnerable groups. Household spending on the non-durable goods and services, grew by 3.3% and 12.3%, accelerated from 3.0% and 10.4% in 2022, respectively. Meanwhile, spending on semi-durable goods increased by 2.5%, decelerated from 3.2% in 2022. However, spending on durable goods expanded by 2.4%, slowing from a 5.7% in 2022. The deceleration was mainly due to a slowdown in household vehicle purchases, partly as a result of tightened loan approval controls by financial institutions.

Private final consumption expenditure in the domestic market, excluding residents abroad, rose by 9.4%, compared to 8.7% in 2022. Household final consumption expenditure grew by 9.6%, accelerated from 8.9% in 2022. Non-profit institutions serving households increased by 0.4%, improved from a 1.7% decline in 2022.

Private final consumption expenditure in the domestic market, excluding the expenditure of residents abroad and non-residents in the country, grew by 5.3%, accelerated from 5.0% in 2022. When including the expenditure of residents abroad, which expanded by 73.7% and slowed from 112.4% in 2022, private final consumption expenditure increased by 6.9% from 6.2% in 2022.

Food and non-alcoholic beverages rose by 3.6%, from 3.4% in 2022. Consumption of non-alcoholic beverages expanded by 6.7%, accelerated from 3.0% in 2022. Meanwhile, spending on food grew by 3.3%, slightly below 3.4% in 2022. This was attributed to a slowdown in the consumption of cereals and cereal products, milk, other dairy products and eggs, sugar, confectionery and desserts, and ready-made food and other food products.

Alcoholic beverages and tobacco and narcotics expanded by 2.8%, continued from 2.0% in 2022. Alcoholic beverage consumption grew by 4.5%, accelerated from 3.4% in 2022. Meanwhile Tobacco and consumption remained unchanged, compare to a decline of 0.2% in 2022.

Clothing and footwear went up 3.1%, accelerated from 2.8% in 2022. This expansion was attributable to an improvement in clothing spending which grew by 3.4%, compared to a 2.6% decrease in 2022. Meanwhile, footwear purchases grew by 0.9%, slowed down from 4.8% in 2022.

Housing, water, electricity, gas, and other fuels increased by 3.6%, accelerated from 1.4% in 2022. This growth was due to a rise in expenses on electricity, gas, and other fuels, which rose by 6.3%, rebounded from a 0.8% decrease in 2022. In contrast, spending on housing rentals, water supply, and miscellaneous services related to the dwelling grew by 2.2%, decelerated from 2.3% in 2022.

Furnishings, household equipment and routine household maintenance fell by 0.7%, reversed from a 1.0% increase in 2022. This decline resulted from a 1.7% decrease in furniture, furnishings, and loose carpets, compare to a 2.0% expansion in 2022. Additionally, household textiles, household appliances, tools and equipment for house and garden, and goods and services for routine household maintenance slightly decreased 0.6%, following a 0.9% increase in 2022.

Health grew by 3.9%, slowed down from 9.4% in 2022. this growth was attributable to expenses on medicines and health products, outpatient care services and inpatient care services which increased by 2.3%, 6.5% and 4.3%, decelerated from 7.0%, 10.7% and 10.7% in 2022, respectively.

Transport expanded by 4.4%, decelerated from 8.8% in 2022. Spending on vehicle purchases, operation of personal transport equipment, and passenger transport services rose by 5.6%, 0.9% and 10.0%, lower than 12.3%, 3.8% and 14.4% in 2022, respectively. However, spending on transport service of goods expanded by 5.3%, accelerated from 4.7% in 2022.

Information and communication rose by 4.0%, accelerated from 0.6% in 2022. This growth was due to expenses on information and communication equipment and software (excluding games) which increased by 5.5% and 13.5%, rebounded from a drop of 2.9% and 2.8% in 2022, respectively. Additionally expenses on information and communication services grew by 2.9%, compared to a 0.3% decline in 2022.

Recreation, sport and culture increased by 6.4%, from 5.7% in 2022, mainly due to spending on other recreation and entertainment expanding, which expanded by 7.6%, compared to 7.0% in 2022. Moreover, spending on newspapers, books, and stationery increased by 3.0%, improved from a 0.1% fall in 2022. Meanwhile, spending on recreational durables fell by 15.2%, continued from a 6.6% decline in 2022.

Education services expanded by 1.5%, lower than 1.9% in 2022, primarily as a result of the deceleration of expenses on secondary education, post-secondary non-tertiary education and education not defined by level. However, expenses for early childhood and primary education and tertiary education continued to grow.

Restaurants and accommodation services grew by 46.6%, slowed down from 67.9% in 2022. This was attributable to expenses on restaurant services, and accommodation services, which rose by 32.7% and 88.5%, decelerated from 42.4% and 317.5% in 2022, respectively.

Insurance and financial services increased by 5.0%, improved from a 3.2% decline in 2022. This growth was mainly driven by expanses on insurance and financial services, which rose by 2.7% and 6.5%, rebounded from a 2.3% and 3.9% fall in 2022, respectively.

Personal care, social protection and miscellaneous goods and services expanded by 2.1%, from 1.0% in 2022. This increase was supported by higher expenses on personal care and other services, which rose by 5.9% and 1.1%, following increases of 4.7% and 0.0% in 2022, respectively. Meanwhile, expenses on personal jewelry slightly decreased by 0.8%, improved from a 1.7% decline in 2022.

Non-profit institutions serving households consumption expenditure rose by 0.4%, recovered from a 1.7% reduction in 2022. This expansion stemmed from spending on health services, education, and social protection services, which increased by 1.3%, compared to a 1.8% decline in 2022. On the other hand, other services dropped by 0.7%, compared to a 1.5% decrease in 2022.

Private consumption expenditure classified by durability 4 categories

Durable goods expanded by 2.4%, decelerated from 5.7% in 2022. Purchasing of vehicles rose by 5.6%, slowing from 12.3% in 2022. In addition, the spending on personal care, social protection and miscellaneous goods and services, as well as on furnishings, households equipment and routine maintenance, decreased by 1.9% and 2.4%, compared to a drop of 1.6% and 0.9% in 2022, orderly. However, expenses on information and communication increased by 5.5%, from 2.9% in 2022.

Semi-durable goods increased by 2.5%, decelerated from 3.2% in 2022. Specifically, expenses on clothing and footwear rose by 3.2%, slowing from 4.3% in 2022. Nonetheless, expenses on furnishings, households equipment and routine maintenance, as well as transport, dropped by 0.3% and 3.8%, compared to increases of 1.7% and 2.0% in 2022, respectively.

Non-durable goods increased by 3.3%, from 3.0% in 2022. Expenses on food and non-alcoholic beverages and alcoholic beverages, tobacco and narcotics grew by 3.6% and 2.8%, from 3.4% and 2.0% in 2022, respectively. Meanwhile, spending on health and transport expanded by 2.5% and 1.1%, lower than 7.3% and 4.1% in 2022, orderly.

Services expanded by 12.3%, accelerated from 10.4% in 2022. The expansion was driven by expenses on recreation, sport and culture; and personal care, social protection and miscellaneous goods and services which grew by 8.2% and 2.0%, accelerated from 7.6% and 1.2% in 2022, respectively. Spending on information and communication, and insurance and financial services grew by 3.5% and 5.0%, improved from a drop of 0.1% and 3.2% in 2022, orderly. Meanwhile, restaurants and accommodation services expanded by 46.6%, decelerated from 67.9% in 2022.

Composition of general government final consumption expenditure

General Government final consumption expenditure in real terms decreased by 4.7%.

General government final consumption expenditure at current market prices in 2023 was recorded at 2,983,435 million baht, reflecting a decrease of 3.1%, compared to an expansion of 4.3% in 2022. This decline was primarily due to reduced expenditure associated with Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19). Specifically, purchases from enterprises and abroad were valued at 852,312 million baht, marking a decrease of 0.5%, compared to a 3.3% expansion in the previous year. Social transfers in kind–purchased market production recorded a value of 310,849 million baht, decreased by 30.5% from an expansion of 11.5% in 2022, mainly due to a reduction of health expenditure. Meanwhile, government compensation of employees was valued at 1,742,535 |million baht, expanded by 3.3%, continued from a 3.6% expansion in 2022. Consumption of fixed capital recorded a value of 338,871 million baht, reflecting a 1.3% increase, decelerated from 2.8% in the previous year. Moreover, purchases by households and enterprises amounted to 261,132 million baht, rose by 5.8%, slowed down from 6.0% in 2022.

By the functions of government, total general government final consumption at current market prices in 2023 consisted of the following: education services accounted for 28.9%; health services accounted for 20.8%; general public services accounted for 13.7%; economic affairs accounted for 12.5%; defense accounted for 9.0%; public order and safety accounted for 8.7%; and remaining services, including housing and community amenities; recreation, culture and religion; environmental protection; and social protection, accounted for 6.4%.

General government final consumption expenditure in real terms decreased by 4.7%, compared to an expansion of 0.1% in 2022. This decline was driven by a 1.4% decrease in purchases from enterprises and abroad, following a 2.4% decrease in the previous year. Social transfers in kind–purchased market production decreased by 31.4%, reversing from an expansion of 4.8% in 2022. Meanwhile, compensation of employees increased by 1.2%, accelerated from 0.1% in 2022. Consumption of fixed capital increased by 0.8%, decelerated from 1.2% in 2022. Lastly, purchases by households and enterprises increased by 5.4%, accelerated from 0.4% in 2022.

Gross capital formation

Gross capital formation in 2023 at current market prices recorded a value of 4,032,711 million baht, consisting of 4,117,222 million baht of gross fixed capital formation and 84,511 million baht of depleted inventories.

In real terms, gross fixed capital formation grew by 1.2% in 2023, slowed down from 2.2% in 2022. The main contributing factor was private investment which increased by 3.1%, decelerated from 4.6% in 2022. Meanwhile, public investment contracted by 4.2%, after a 3.9% decrease in 2022.

Private Investment

Private investment in 2023 at current market prices recorded a value of 3,102,317 million baht, consisting of 589,091 million baht of private construction and 2,513,226 million baht of private machinery and equipment. In real terms, private investment expanded by 3.1%, decelerated from 4.6% in 2022.

Private construction at current market prices recorded a value of 589,091 million baht, comprising dwelling construction at 306,492 million baht, non-dwelling construction at 194,655 million baht, and other construction at 73,124 million baht. In real terms, private construction increased by 2.8%, rebounded from a decrease of 1.5% in 2022. This growth was driven by the following segments: other construction increased by 2.9, accelerated from a 33.1% decrease in 2022; dwelling construction increased by 2.0%, slowed down from 2.9% in 2022; and non-dwelling construction grew by 4.5%, decelerated from 11.4% in 2022. In contrast, the cost of ownership transfer decreased by 4.7%, higher than a fall of 4.2% in 2022.

Private investment in equipment and machinery at current market prices recorded a value of 2,513,226 million baht. In real terms, it increased by 3.2%, decelerated from 6.2% in 2022. A key contributing factor was increased investment in office equipment, particularly in a computing machinery with related parts; software; and radio broadcast and television receiver. This rise was partly attributed to the growing role of technology in the society, which boosted demand for these items. Additionally, investment in other vehicles expanded, mainly due to an increase in ship imports. On the other hand, investment in industrial equipment decreased, and transport equipment also dropped, in line with the decline of registration for road vehicles, particularly passenger cars.

Public Investment

Public investment at current market prices recorded a value of 1,014,905 million baht, consisting of 787,535 million baht of public construction and 227,370 million baht of public machinery and equipment. In real terms, public investment decreased by 4.2%, compared to a 3.9% decrease in 2022. This reduction was driven by a decrease in government investment, while state enterprise investment slowed down.

Public construction at current market prices recorded a value of 787,535 million baht, comprising 18,335 million baht in dwellings, 132,714 million baht in non-dwellings, and 636,486 million baht in other construction. In real terms, public construction dropped by 2.8%, after a 2.7% decrease in 2022. This decline was primarily attributed to a 6.2% reduction in government construction projects, compared to a 6.4% decrease in 2022. The main reason was a reduction in investment value from loans under the Emergency Decree authorizing the Ministry of Finance to borrow funds for addressing, mitigating, and recovering the economy and society affected by the COVID-19 pandemic and delays in the enactment of the Fiscal Year 2024 Budget which hindered the disbursement of investment budgets in the Q4/2023 as planned. Meanwhile, state enterprise construction increased by 3.6%, slowed down from 5.4% in 2022. This growth was primarily driven by ongoing projects, such as the electrical distribution system project, the water pipeline construction system and ongoing construction works in other construction category.

Public investment in machinery and equipment at current market prices recorded a value of 227,370 million baht. In real terms, it decreased by 8.6%, compared to a 7.6% decrease in 2022. Government machinery and equipment investment dropped by 10.3%, after a fall of 18.6% in 2022. Meanwhile, state enterprise machinery and equipment investment decreased by 7.1%, in contrast to an expansion of 4.7% in 2022, primarily due to reductions in industrial equipment investment.

Investment classified by type of assets

Tangible fixed assets at current market prices recorded a value of 3,941,000 million baht, consisting of 324,827 million baht in dwelling construction, 957,497 million baht in non-dwelling construction, 2,644,277 million baht in machinery and equipment, and 14,399 million baht in cultivated assets. In real terms, the investment in tangible fixed assets increased by 1.5%, decelerated from 1.8% in 2022. In further detail: dwelling construction increased by 2.5%, lower than 3.4% in 2022; non-dwelling construction increased by 0.3%, rebounded from a fall of 5.5% in 2022; machinery and equipment grew by 1.8%, while cultivated assets increased by 0.7%, both slowed down from 4.6% and 24.2% respectively, in 2022.

Intangible fixed assets at current market prices recorded a value of 161,402 million baht, comprising 74,918 million baht in mineral exploration and 86,484 million baht in computer software. In real terms, the investment in intangible assets decreased by 4.0%, reversed from a 14.5% increase in 2022. This was largely due to a 17.4% reduction of mineral exploration investment, compared to a 22.8% increase in 2022. Meanwhile, the investment on computer software increased by 11.0%, accelerated from 6.3% in 2022.

Costs of ownership transfer at current market prices recorded a value of 14,820 million baht. In real terms, it decreased by 4.7%, after a 4.2% drop in 2022.

Change in inventories

Overall change in inventories at current prices decreased with the value of 84,511 million baht in 2023. A decline in stock covered manufacturing and mining, while agricultural products rice and gold increased. In particular, the crude oil, where inventory has depleted due to a decrease in the value of imports and domestic crude oil production, while petroleum products continue to be produced, driven by the recovery of the transportation sector. The decline in manufacturing inventories led by plastics and synthetic rubber in primary forms; electronic components and boards; engines and turbines, except aircraft, vehicle and cycle engines; and computers and peripheral equipment, while, there were increase in stocks of manufacturing including jewelry; related articles, motor vehicles, and processing; and processing and preserving of fish and fish products, fresh, chilled or frozen. The increase in inventory of agricultural products covered cassava, rubber and paddy. The stock of gold increased slightly due to lower imports compared to the previous year.

External Sectors

Exports of goods and services expanded.

Exports of goods and services

Exports of goods and services at current market prices in 2023 presented a value of 11,750,353 million baht, which expanded by 3.4%. This was due to the increase in service receipts, while merchandise exports declined.

Merchandise exports at current market prices recorded a value of 9,777,620 million baht, which represented a 2.1% decrease, principally derived from a decline in the export of manufactured products. A decline in manufactured product exports was primarily driven by a decrease in the export of computer parts and accessories, attributed to the growing popularity of solid-state drives (SSD) which replaced hard disk drives (HDD). Additionally, export of other major manufactured products such as air conditioners, metal and chemicals and petrochemical products also decreased. In addition, export of agro-industrial products decreased, particularly canned fish, palm oil, rubber products, and animal feed. In contrast, export of some manufacturing products, such as sugar, telecommunication equipment, parts of electrical appliances, passenger cars and pickup trucks increased.

Export of agricultural products slightly expanded. Rice exports quantity in 2023 was 8.8 million tons, which met the target of 8.0 million tons set by the Ministry of Commerce. The increase in rice exports was partly derived from a large import volume from Indonesia, along with other trading partners such as U.S.A. and Africa, driven by food security challenge in several nations. Furthermore, India, the largest rice export country, controlled the export of non-basmati rice to control food prices and inflation. Moreover, export of fruits expanded particularly in durian in accordance with demand from China.

Overall exports was partly diminished by lower non-monetary gold exports. In 2023, the whole exports in real term decreased by 2.6%, reversed from an expansion of 1.1% in 2022, while prices of export increased by 0.5%. Exports to major destinations such as Japan, ASEANs and Europe decreased.

Service receipts at current market prices recorded a value of 1,972,733 million baht, which grew by 43.9%. This was principally originated from an increase in the number of foreign tourists, in consequence, travel and transportation receipts significantly rose. Furthermore, other business services also expanded.

Imports of goods and services

Imports of goods and services decreased.

Imports of goods and services at current market prices in 2023 revealed a value of 11,379,587 million baht, which contracted by 3.0%, reversed from 23.4% expansion in 2022. This reduction was established from decrease in import of goods, while service payments increased.

Merchandise imports at current market prices recorded a value of 9,094,408 million baht, which declined by 4.5%. The decrease was due to a reduction in raw material and intermediate goods imports, which resulted from lower crude oil import values, aligned with the global oil price situation. In addition, imports of chemicals and petrochemical products also decreased. An expansion in consumer goods imports was driven by higher vehicle imports, in line with household purchases of vehicles. Capital goods imports increased, particularly in the category of computer products, in response to the growing demand for machinery and equipment. Overall, imports of goods in volume terms decreased by 4.3%, while import prices slightly decreased by 0.2%.

Service payments at current market prices showed a value of 2,285,179 million baht, which rose by 3.7%. This was mainly attributable to expansion of travel and transportation payments. Besides, other business service payment also rose.

Trade and services balance and current account

Trade and services balance at current market prices registered a surplus of 370,766 million baht, presented a turnaround after 2 years consecutive deficit following the COVID-19 pandemic. Trade balance showed a surplus of 683,212 million baht which larger than a surplus of 465,175 million baht in preceding year. Meanwhile, service balance presented a deficit of 312,446 million baht, better than a deficit of 832,404 million baht in 2022. Primary income posted a deficit of 449,493 million baht, better than a deficit of 553,723 million baht in 2022, driven by a smaller deficit in the levels of compensation of employees and property income. Secondary income presented a surplus value of 345,450 million baht, larger than the surplus in 2022. Ultimately, current account which comprises of trade and services balance, primary income and secondary income, registered a surplus of 266,723 million baht, improved from a deficit of 602,207 million baht in 2022.



Exchange rate

In 2023, exchange rate presented an average value of 34.8 Thai baht per US dollar, slightly appreciated from 35.1 Thai baht per US dollar in 2022.

National income and savings

National income



Gross National Income at current market prices in 2023 was recorded a value of 17,505,174 million baht, which grew by 4.0%, compared to a rise of 7.7% in 2022. Compensation of employees, accounting for 32.1% of gross national income, expanded by 3.9%. Return on capital, land, and entrepreneurship, representing 40.3% of gross national income, increased by 2.9%, principally due to an expansion in net return on income from property and return on entrepreneurship ,which grew by 2.6% and 3.0%, respectively. Taxes on production and imports less subsidies rose by 16.1%, an improvement from 0.2% decrease in 2022. Lastly, consumption of fixed capital increased by 1.2%.

The compensation of employees grew by 3.9%, slow down from 6.8% expansion in 2022

Compensation of employees

Compensation of employees or return on labor in 2023 presented value at 5,618,954 million baht, equivalent to 32.1% of Gross National Income (GNI), and increased by 3.9%, compared to a rise of 6.8% in 2022. Compensation of employees in public sector increased by 3.2%, slightly decelerated from a growth of 3.4% in 2022, whereas compensation of employees in private sector grew by 4.3%, slowed down from 8.8% in 2022. On the other hand, compensation of employees can be divided in to two parts as follows: (1) wages and salaries increased by 2.8%, and (2) employer's contribution in social security fund and other welfare, rose by 10.3%. In 2023, there was no new minimum wage promulgated, while salaries in the government sector were increased in usual pattern, and no special salary adjustment was applied. Labor force survey by the National Statistical Office (NSO) in 2023 indicated that the total number of employed persons increased by 1.8%. The number of employed persons with employee status increased by 1.7%. Public employees dropped by 0.2%. Private employees, accounting for 80.8% proportion of total employees, increased by 2.6%, aligned with the increase in the number of insured person under section 33 of social security act at the end of 2023 which increased by 2.2%, compared to 4.5% in 2022.

Private sector and public sector compensation of employees

Compensation of employees in the public sector, 36.0% of overall compensation of employees of the nation, increased by 3.2%, slightly lower than 3.4% in 2022. Compensation of government employees increased by 3.3%. Compensation of state enterprises and public corporations increased by 2.6%. Compensation of employees in the private sector (including net compensation of employees from abroad), accounting for 64.0% of the total compensation of employees, grew by 4.3%, slowed down from 8.8% in 2022. Considering production activities, compensation of employees expanded in both the agricultural and non-agricultural sectors.

Compensation of employees by economic activities

Compensation of employees in the agricultural sector amounted to 238,058 million baht, representing 4.2% of the total compensation of employees, increased by 2.6%. This was partly originated from larger planting area, particularly for maize and off-season rice. Furthermore, the increase was supported by higher values of major agricultural products, such as food crops, fruits and vegetables. These reasons were contributable to the increase in compensation of employees in the agricultural sector.

Compensation of employees in the non-agricultural sector amounted to 5,408,181 million baht, representing 96.2% of the total compensation of employees, with an increase of 3.8%, compared to 6.1% growth in 2022. This expansion can be observed from both industrial and service activities.

- Compensation of employees in the industrial sector, accounting for 27.9% of the total compensation of employees, expanded by 0.2%, a slowdown from 9.0% in 2022. The largest proportion in the industrial sector is manufacturing activities which declined by 0.1% in 2023, compared to 0.9% increase in 2022. Compensation of employees in mining and quarrying fell by 1.3%, from an 8.3% expansion in the preceding year. Compensation of employees in electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply activities together with water supply; and sewerage, waste management, and remediation activities grew by 3.6%, and 6.3%, respectively.
- Compensation of employees in the services sector, accounting for 68.4% of the total compensation of employees, increased by 5.4%, from 4.9% in 2022. Compensation of employees in human health and social work activities; education activities; and public administration, defence, and compulsory social security activities, grew by 6.3%, 3.7%, and 3.1%, respectively, which mainly derived from an increase in compensation of public employees. Compensation of employees in accommodation and food service activities; and transportation and storage activities grew by 28.9% and 6.3% in 2023, followed increases of 34.0% and 7.1% in 2022, respectively. These were primarily due to the increase in the number of foreign tourists. Compensation of employees in wholesale and retail trade, and repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles activities; and construction increased by 6.5% and 5.9%, orderly. Compensation of employees in financial and insurance activities expanded by 4.0%, recovered from 1.1% decline in 2022, mainly due to an increase in financial service activities, especially in commercial banks, and insurance and pension fund. On the contrary, activities auxiliary to financial service and insurance activities contracted. Lastly, compensation of employees in other services activities increased by 4.3%, accelerated from 3.3% in 2022.

Compensation of employees expanded in both the agricultural and non-agricultural sectors.

Net compensation of employees from the rest of the world recorded a deficit of 27,285 million baht. Compensation of employees received from the rest of the world was 31,261 million baht, which was lower than 58,546 million baht paid as compensation to the rest of the world.

Returns on land, capital, and entrepreneurs

Net return on land, capital, and entrepreneurship was valued at 7,048,418 million baht, equivalent to 40.3% of Gross National Income. It grew by 2.9%, lower than 12.7% in 2022.

Income from farming and households and non-profit institutions serving households (NPISHs): gross mixed income was valued at 3,979,089 million baht, representing 22.7% share of Gross National Income. This increase of 18.6%, improved from 12.7% in 2022. Income from farms increased by 1.9%, driven primarily by an expansion in overall agricultural production, especially major crops such as rice, rubber, vegetables and maize, partly due to an increase in irrigated areas. Additionally, prices for major agricultural product, including rice, also increased. Furthermore, other mixed income showed an improvement compared to 2022.

Income from entrepreneurship or profit of corporations was recorded at 2,208,569 million baht, a decline of 16.8%.

Net income from property of households and non-profit institutions serving households (NPISHs) was valued at 911,883 million baht, which increased by 7.4%, compared to a rise of 10.5% in 2022. This slowdown resulted from greater expansion in property income payments compared to property income receipts.

- Households and NPISHs property income receipt were valued at 1,292,224 million baht, which increased by 7.4%, slightly accelerated from 7.3% in 2022. This increase resulted from a 28.6% boost in interest income, higher than 4.6% in 2022. The rise in interest income was driven by higher interest rates, in accordance with higher interest income received from banks, incorporated with a rise in policy rate. In addition, other property income receivables, such as provident funds, government pension funds, and life insurance, increased by 6.0%, accelerated from 3.3% in 2022. Income from land rent for agricultural areas increased by 4.3%, compared to a rise of 3.0% in 2022. Meanwhile, dividend grew by 1.4%, decelerated from 10.4% in 2022. Households and NPISHs received dividends from various establishments, including private corporations, commercial banks, and state-owned enterprises which continued to increase. However, dividends received from cooperatives and listed companies declined.
- Households and NPISHs property income payment were valued at 380,341 million baht, which increased by 7.5%, accelerated from 0.4% in 2022. This was mainly due to an increase of 8.6% in interest payments, which rebounded from 0.4% decrease in 2022. The increase in interest payments resulted from higher interest paid by households and NPISHs to banks, to pawnshops, on loans from life insurance policies, to cooperatives and to mortgage interests. The key factor contributing to an increase, was the higher average interest rate compared to 2022, in line with the prevailing policy rate. Moreover, consumer loans (excluding loans for land, dwelling and real estate, and working abroad) experienced a slight deceleration.

General government income from property decreased by 1.8%, from a drop of 2.7% in 2022. The decline was mainly from interest received and dividend. Income from dividends dropped by 8.1%, comprised of dividend receivable, income from special state enterprise, dividend received from income of state enterprise groups; including, the transport, industrial, and commercial sectors, and dividend income from other sources. In addition, interest received fell by 7.3% which was partly from a decrease in interest received from financial institutions. In contrast, rental income increased by 34.6%, driven by higher real estate rental fees.

Saving and saving - investment gap

Gross saving

Gross saving was valued at 4,299,434 million baht, which increased by 1.4%, a rebound from 1.3% decrease in 2022. Net saving was valued at 1,378,349 million baht, which decreased by 5.1%, compared to a 2.7% increase in 2022. This decline in net saving was from a 32.5% decline in households and NPISHs, and a 35.4% contraction in private corporations. However, government net saving accelerated compared to the previous year, due to a lower deficit, recording a deficit of 335,197 million baht, an improvement from a deficit of 750,904 million baht in 2022. Furthermore, net saving by public corporations and state enterprises grew by 58.8%, compared to an increase of 26.3% in 2022. Consumption of fixed capital registered a value of 3,168,244 million baht, which grew by 1.2%, slowed down from 2.9% in 2022.

Private sector net savings

Private net savings comprising households, non-profit institutions serving households (NPISHs), private corporations, and cooperatives were valued at 1,233,305 million baht, which decreased by 35.1%.

1) Net savings of households and non-profit institutions serving households (NPISHs)

Net savings of households and NPISHs were valued at 146,446 million baht, representing a 32.5% decline. The details were as follows.

Households and NPISHs income receipts were valued at 12,285,255 million baht, which increased by 8.0%, accelerated from 3.5% in 2022. Primary income receipts, the principal source of income, expanded by 9.1%, compared to 8.6% in 2022. This primary income consisted of: (1) compensation of employees, accounting 45.7% share of households and NPISHs income, increased by 3.9%, (2) property income increased by 7.4%, slightly higher than 7.3% in 2022 (3) households and NPISHs mixed income, a 34.3% share of total income, increased by 17.5%, compared to 12.1% in 2022. As a result, primary income expanded by 9.1%, driven by growth in compensation of employees, gross mixed income and operating surplus, and property income receivable. Secondary income receipts, comprising social benefits other than social transfers in kind and other current transfers, decreased by 1.1%, recovered from a deep contraction in 2022.

Primary and secondary income payment were valued at 1,712,541 million baht, which increased by 10.9%, an improvement from a 9.1% in 2022. The majority of expenses were from property income payable which increased by 7.5%, compared to a slight increase in 2022. Additionally, income taxes rose by 6.4%, lower than a rise of 18.4% in 2022. Net social security contributions expanded by 14.4%. Meanwhile, transfers to government and rest of the world also increased by 14.2%.

The effect of the increase in receipts and expenses of Households and NPISHs, was a 7.6% increase in disposable income, accelerated from 2.7% in 2022. After deducting by Private Final Consumption Expenditure, which increased by 8.8%, and exceeded the growth rate of household disposable income, and adjusting for the change in pension entitlements, net savings of households and NPISHs contracted by 32.5%. In other words, per capita net savings of households and NPISHs were value at 2,091 baht, which decreased by 32.7%.

2) Net savings of private corporations and cooperatives

Net savings of private corporations and cooperatives, adjusted according to the national accounts definition, were valued at 1,086,859 million baht, a decrease of 35.4%, compared to a 13.4% decline in 2022. Net savings of private corporations were recorded at 1,078,345 million baht, which decreased by 35.7%, in contrast to 13.7% expansion in 2022. Such a decline originated from a decrease in other private corporations and commercial banks. On the contrary, the profit by national accounts definition of listed companies in the Stock Exchange of Thailand (excluding private commercial banks and public corporations) expanded compared to the preceding year. Saving of cooperatives were valued at 8,514 million baht, which increased by 17.0%, recovered from a 21.0% reduction in 2022.

Public sector net savings

Public net savings, consisting of general government, public corporations and government enterprises, were valued at 145,044 million baht, with an increase of 132.3%. Government net savings were recorded a deficit of 335,197 million baht, smaller than a 750,904 million baht deficit in 2022. This deficit has persisted since 2014. Meanwhile, net savings of state enterprises were valued at 480,241 million baht, which rose by 58.8%, compared to an increase of 26.3% in 2022.

1) General government net savings

General government net savings recorded a deficit of 335,197 million baht in 2023, marking another consecutive year of deficit. However, the value of deficit narrowed from 750,904 million baht in 2022. General government revenue amounted to 4,903,593 million baht, with an increase of 4.6%. The increase was driven by taxes, the primary sources of revenue, which rose by 4.8%. Meanwhile, government expenditure on non-investment items were valued at 4,771,141 million baht, which fell by 4.6%. The value of adjustment for the change in pension entitlement was valued at 128,778 million baht, which expanded by 27.7%, and consumption of fixed capital was valued at 338,871 million baht with an increase of 1.3%. As a result, general government net saving increased by 55.4%.

A rise in general government income in 2023 was primarily driven by increases in taxes on production and imports, as well as current taxes on income and wealth, which could be categorized as follows:

Taxes on production and imports accounted for 35.8% of total general government revenue, rose by 6.7%. The increase in tax revenue was mainly from

- (1) Value Added Taxes (VAT) increased due to a rise in VAT from domestic consumption while VAT from imports declined.
 - VAT from domestic consumption increased as private consumption expenditure expanded, especially in sectors related to tourism, including accommodation and food service activities; and electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply.
 - *VAT from imports*, the decrease was a result of dropping value of imports, incorporating with a fall in crude oil price.
- (2) Oil and oil product tax in 2023 increased for the first time in the last five years, resulting from the end of tax cut measure on July 20, 2023. Hence, tax collection increased in the second half of the year.
- (3) Specific business tax expanded in accordance with transactions in real estate and financial activities. Particularly, commercial banks' income increased as a result of a rise in interest received.
- (4) Liquor tax rose, thanks to an improvement in tourist-related activities, together with entertainment facilities opening business as usual
- (5) Land and building tax increased as the end of three-year period of tax cut measure.
- (6) Stamp duty increased both for cash payment and transfer of property rights.

Increases from other taxes on production and imports included taxes from non-alcoholic beverage, motorcycle, battery, mineral royalty, Bangkok metropolitan administration and provincial administration tax for petrol, hotel tax for provincial administration, and business registration fee, etc.

The types of taxes on production and imports with a decrease were import duties, petroleum royalty, automobile tax, beer tax, and tobacco tax.

Property income from government and investment income payable on pension entitlements accounted for 4.7% of total government revenue, decreased by 1.8%. The contraction was from the income from dividend with the share of 51.3% of total government property income, decreased by 8.1%, partly contributable to dividend receivable, income from special state enterprise, and income from state enterprise groups; namely, transport, industrial, and commercial sectors, while the other dividend income also fell. Interest received which accounted for 17.8% of total government property income, dropped by 7.3% both from banks and other financial institutions.

Meanwhile, other property income, namely investment income payable on pension entitlements accounted for 23.1% of total government property income, rose by 10.1%, due to a rise of interest and dividend received (child allowance and old-age program) from the social security fund. Moreover, rental income which constituted 7.8% of total government property income, rose by 34.6%, attributed partly to rental fees.

Current taxes on income, wealth, and etc. accounted for 24.2% of total government revenue, which increased by 2.1%.

- *Tax revenue* increment was mainly from corporate income tax, increased by 2.5%, due partly to (1) Tax collection on net profit rose by 1.0%, from an increase in companies' profits in 2022. The listed companies' profits dropped in the second half of 2022, while tax collection increased highly in 2022. (2) Tax collection on forecasted net profit rose by 0.2%, following an improvement of automotive industry. On the other hand, the first-half profit of listed companies in 2023 dropped. (3) Withholding tax collection by the private sector increased by 1.5%, and (4) Withholding tax on service and profit distribution rose by 14.5% partly form dividend payment to foreign juristic person.
- Personal income tax increased by 6.2%. This was partly due to withholding tax on salary income with a gain of 6.6% from higher level of employment in both public and private sectors. Moreover, withholding tax collection on interest and dividend increased by 8.5%. This was partly due to withholding tax from dividend paid by listed companies and for interest on deposits. Meanwhile, withholding tax collections on service fees expanded by 6.7%. Lastly, withholding tax on income on immovable property rose by 4.9% due to higher number of transactions resulting from reduction in fees for property transfer.
- *Petroleum income tax* collection dropped by 22.4%. resulting from a shift from concession contract to production-sharing system in 2023.

Social contributions, which accounted for 15.3% of total government revenue, expanded by 14.4%. This gain was partly attributable to an increase in employers' and household's actual social contributions from higher employment, together with the resumption of usual rate of social security contribution. As a result, employers' actual social contributions towards social security fund, local administration pension fund, and workmen's compensation fund increased. However, private teacher aid fund decreased. There was an increase in employers' imputed social contributions; namely pension, perpetuity, medical allowance, and children education allowance. Lastly, households' social contributions supplements increased from both interest and dividend receivable.

Miscellaneous current transfers receivable, which accounted for 1.1% of total government revenue, dropped by 3.9%. This reduction was mainly contributed by a drop of income from donations and traffic fines. However, government lottery office's unclaimed lottery prize and interest, and indemnification increased.

Interest paid, which accounted for 4.7% of total government expenditure, increased by 16.0%, from 0.4% in 2022. The increase was mainly from higher interest expenses on domestic and foreign debt. The interest expense on domestic debt increased by 15.2% from government bond, and promissory notes for financing deficit. However, short-term loan interest of commercial banks fell. On the contrary, interest expense on foreign debt expanded by 19.5%.

Subsidies, which accounted for 1.8% of total government expenditure, decreased by 57.9%, from a 66.4% rise in 2022. The drop was mainly from fuel subsidies, subsidies for agricultural products, and private education subsidy for the management of fundamental education. However, export subsidies continued to expand.

Social benefits other than social transfers in kind, which accounted for 15.4% of total government expenditure, increased by 5.9%, from a rise of 5.0% in 2022. The increase was from usual pension; perpetuity; monthly payment of perpetuities; inherited pension; medical expenses; children education allowances; allowances for the disabled; severance in case of old age pension, maternity, and the disabled. On the other hand, there was a declined in allowances for the elderly, newborn-child support grant, government contributions for elderly, and severance payments for unemployment, child support and death.

Miscellaneous current transfers payable, which accounted for 1.5% of total government expenditure, dropped by 53.2%. The decline was from the end of stimulus measure for economic activities regarding COVID-19 pandemic as a remedy and support for private consumption. On the contrary, there were increases in aids for victims of disasters, cost of indemnification, and cost for public training.

2) Net savings of public corporations and government enterprises

Net savings of public corporations and government enterprises were valued at 480,241 million baht, which increased by 58.8%, continued from a growth of 26.3% in 2022. The net profit of public corporations and government enterprises in business accounting for the 2022 calendar year amounted to 581,837 million baht, which rose by 98.2%, rebounded from a fall of 54.5% in 2022. After adjustments based on the national accounts definition, the net profit of public corporations and government enterprises in national accounts, before profit allocation, grew by 40.6%, accelerated from 19.5% in 2022. After deducting profit allocations, comprising (1) dividend (2) profit delivered to government and (3) bonus payment from net profit, that of increased by 9.4%.

Net savings of public corporations and state enterprises classified by organization establishments, public corporations net saving or performance in national accounts aspects were valued at 71,683 million baht, which increased by 61.0%, recovered from a 7.2% fall in 2022. Net savings of other state enterprises were valued 408,558 million baht, which rose by 58.4%, continued from 34.7% in the previous year.

Saving – investment gap

Gross saving was recorded at 4,299,434 million baht, which rose by 1.4%, improved from 1.3% decline in 2022. Gross Capital Formation or investment registered a value of 4,032,711 million baht, which reduced by 16.7%, from a 4.3% increase in 2022. Such gross saving and investment resulted in a surplus in the saving-investment gap of 266,723 million baht, equivalent to 1.5% of GDP. This surplus marked a rebound from two consecutive years of deficit in 2021 and 2022, which were valued at 345,873 million baht and 602,207 million baht, respectively.

GDP Implicit Price Deflator

Overall price level expanded by 1.3%, slowed down from 4.7% in 2022.

GDP Implicit Price Deflator

GDP Implicit Price Deflator in 2023 expanded by 1.3%, slowed down from 4.7% in 2022. Agricultural price deflator fell by 0.6%, from an increase of 5.1% in 2022, while the non-agricultural price deflator rose by 1.5%, decelerated from 4.6% in 2022. Several activities showed diminishing price level, including agriculture, forestry and fishing activities; mining and quarrying activities; manufacturing activities; water supply, sewerage, waste management and remediation activities; and information and communication activities. Conversely, some activities contributed to an increase in the overall price level, such as wholesale and retail trade, repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles activities; and accommodation and food service activities. Meanwhile that of electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply activities; construction activities; transportation and storage activities; financial and insurance activities; real estate activities; professional, scientific and technical activities; administrative and support service activities; public administration and defence, compulsory social security activities; education activities; human health; and social work activities decelerated.

On the expenditure side, the overall deflator expanded by 2.0%, compared to a rise of 3.5% in 2022. The price deflators for private final consumption expenditure, government final consumption expenditure, and gross fixed capital formation increased by 1.8%, 1.6%, and 0.2%, respectively. For external sector, price deflator of exports of goods and services increased by 1.1%, while price deflator of imports of goods and services diminished by 0.5%.

Consumer price index (CPI) in 2023 increased by 1.2%, slowed down from 6.1% expansion in 2022. Meanwhile, producer price index (PPI) dropped by 2.4%, compared to an expansion of 10.4% in 2022.

Appendix

Revision of Private Final Consumption Expenditure (PFCE) under Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (COICOP) 2018

The reclassification of Private Final Consumption Expenditure (PFCE) of Thailand based on Classification of Individual Consumption by Purpose (COICOP) 2018, has been undertaken by Office of the National Economic and Social Development Council. This initiative aims at studying and establishing guidelines for categorization of private final consumption expenditure. The prior classification based on COICOP 1999, has been updated in accordance with COICOP 2018. This recent framework was published by the United Nations Statistics Division (UNSD).

COICOP is an international standard for categorizing private final consumption expenditure. Its purpose is to provide a conceptual framework for classifying goods and services with similar characteristics based on their function or purpose within household consumption expenditure, non-profit institutions serving households (NPISHs), and government expenditure on individual consumption goods and services. As a key component of the System of National Accounts (SNA), COICOP is adopted in various statistical applications, such as household expenditure statistics from household budget surveys; analysis of living standards; consumer price indices; international comparison of Gross Domestic Product (GDP), and expenditure components through purchasing power parity; and other statistics related to culture, sports, food, health, and tourism.

The process of the revision of COICOP 2018 has been launched in 2015, leading by UNSD in collaboration with experts and users worldwide. This revised COICOP (COICOP 2018) offers higher details of classification than COICOP 1999 in response to an increase in demand from users for high level of granularity while addressing several issues. This improvement appropriately reflects significant changes in goods and services, and enhances linkages between COICOP and other classifications, resulting in alignment with the needs of statistical framework and policy applications across diverse international organizations.

The structure of COICOP 2018 consists of 15 divisions. Divisions 01–13 are designated for classifying individual consumption expenditure of households, while Division 14 is for individual consumption expenditure of NPISHs. The Division 15 is assigned for individual consumption expenditure of general government. COICOP 2018 has a hierarchical structure with four levels, coded with numerical digits, starting from two digits at the top level and extending to five digits at the most detailed level. For example, coding system for Division 03 Clothing and footwear.

The broad structure presents numerical codes with category names at the division and group levels (2-digit and 3-digit levels). For detailed structure, categories are further classified into class (4-digit level) and subclass (5-digit level) accordingly. Classes and subclasses are categorized by product durability as durable goods (D), semi-durable goods (SD), non-durable goods (ND), and services (S) to facilitate further analysis.

In addition, the division level in COICOP 2018 consists of 15 divisions, comparing to 14 divisions in COICOP 1999. Insurance and financial services are separated from miscellaneous goods and services. Consequently, the classification of household consumption expenditures has increased to 13 divisions, from 12 divisions in COICOP 1999. The numbers of categories at group level and class level have also increased from 58 and 157 categories to 63 and 186 categories, respectively. At the most detailed subclass level, there are 338 categories, while the subclass level does not exist in COICOP 1999.

Significant revisions of COICOP 2018

- 1) A new category, "Division 12 Insurance and financial services" in COICOP 2018 was separated from "Division 12: Miscellaneous goods and services" in COICOP 1999. In other words, "Division 12 Miscellaneous goods and services" in COICOP 1999 was divided into two categories: "Division 12 Insurance and financial services" and "Division 13 Personal care, social protection and miscellaneous goods and services". The reason for separation was partly due to highly diverse details of the "Division 12" in COICOP 1999. As a result, the expenditure of this division in some countries presented a substantially high share of total spending.
- 2) Renaming, redefining descriptions, as well as reorganizing categories within or between divisions for enhancing clarity. Key changes include:
 - Classification at the highest or division level remained mostly unchanged to minimize fragmentation and avoid disruption of time-series data. However, "Division 08 Communication" and "Division 09 Recreation and culture" should be reorganized into "Division 08 Information and communication" and "Division 09 Recreation, sport and culture".
 - Items related to information, such as televisions and computers, have been adjusted or relocated from "Division 09 Recreation and culture" to "Division 08 Communication", and also renamed to "Division 08 Information and communication". This change aims at improving reflection of details, while encompassing new equipment for communication and information reception. This will accommodate rapid advancement in technology and communication. However, the classification mainly relies on a purpose perspective and avoids dependence on technology advancement.

- Rename "Division 09 Recreation and culture" in COICOP 1999 to "Division 09 Recreation, sports, and culture" in COICOP 2018 in order to better reflect the details within division. "Class 09.1.1: Equipment for the reception, recording and reproduction of sound and pictures, 09.1.3: Information processing equipment and "09.1.4: Recording media" have been moved to "Division 08 Information and communication", as this equipment is used for information and communication purposes. Meanwhile, services for repairs and rentals of information and communication equipment, as well as television licensing fees and television network subscriptions, have been moved from Division 09 to Division 08.
- "Division 07 Transport" has been updated to include Postal services, which were previously in "Division 08 Communication". This change reflects main usage of postal services by household for sending and receiving parcels, while letter mailing has become rare. Therefore, to better represent the purpose of postal services in COICOP 2018, postal services have been moved to Transport Division.
- 3) While COICOP 1999 classified items into three levels: division, group, and class, COICOP 2018 distinguishes four levels, with the fourth level being the most detailed level: subclass (Goods and Services). Furthermore, there is an increase in categories for both group and class levels, as shown in the table above.

Revision of Thailand's Classification of Private Final Consumption Expenditure according to COICOP 2018

- 1) Mapping of COICOP 1999 codes to COICOP 2018 codes at the most detailed level depends on relational alignment.
 - One-to-one mapping (mapping item-to-item) compares corresponding items based on definition, meaning, scopes, and establishes code connections. In this case, data can be directly mapped and transferred, especially at the 5-digit detailed level (in case of Thailand) with the new 5-digit codes (COICOP 2018). However, in some instances there could be both cross group or class mappings within the same division, as well as across divisions.
 - Many-to-one mapping (mapping multiple items to one item) compares and links multiple items from the original 5-digit level (in case of Thailand) to one item at the new 5-digit level (COICOP 2018). Thailand's COICOP 1999 classification has previously been extended to 5-digit level, which provide more details than the COICOP 1999 at 4-digit level. This allows us to conveniently map our items in COICOP 1999 format to the COICOP 2018 at a detailed, 5-digit level.
 - One-to-many mapping (mapping one item to multiple items) involves breaking down a single item into multiple items according to new classification. This requires further study and information-gathering of relevant data for disaggregating the original item in alignment with the new classification. The information may include direct data, relevant surveys such as household socio-economic survey, or other relevant indicators.

In addition, classification at subclass level can specify items by durability which can be categorized into durable goods (D), semi-durable goods (SD), non-durable goods (ND), and services (S).

- 2) Summary of mapping and transfer of private final consumption expenditure data.
 - Divisions with no changes in the value of time-series data, include five categories: Alcoholic beverages, tobacco and narcotics; Housing, water, electricity, gas, and other fuels; Furnishings, household equipment and routine household maintenance; Education services; and Restaurants and accommodation services.
 - Divisions with an increase in the value of time-series data, include three categories: Food and non-alcoholic beverages, Transport, and Information and communication services.
 - Divisions with a decrease in the value of time-series data, include four categories: Clothing
 and footwear; Health; Recreation, sport and culture; and Personal care, social protection and
 miscellaneous goods and services.
 - New division: Insurance and financial services.

The adjustments and changes do not affect overall value at current market prices, as they represent reclassifications either between divisions or within the same division, in line with the new classification improvements. Each reclassified item corresponds to increases and decreases between divisions. However, differences arise in the value from chain volume measures (CVM) due to changes in the price structure of certain divisions. This can be particularly seen in items with many-to-one or one-to-many relations, which in turn having impacts on the compilation of real values. Nonetheless, these differences do not significantly affect the growth rates in real terms for private final consumption expenditure. In other words, the growth rate in real terms remains unchanged.

Comparison of the structures between COICOP 1999 and COICOP 2018.

The comparison of the structures between COICOP 1999 and COICOP 2018 at the main category level reveals some changes in names or descriptions, and this also include reallocation of sub-items within or between categories for clarity.

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


