The Office of the National Economic and Social Development Council (NESDC) is responsible for compiling the National Income of Thailand in compliance with the International System of National Accounts (SNA). The National Income of Thailand covers 3 sides of approaches covering production, expenditure and income, which reflects the overall economic activities of accounting of the country.

The National Income of Thailand 2021 edition, following the International System of National Accounts (SNA), is compiled using the chained volume measures (CVMs) in measuring the real terms. In this 2021 edition, data are revised back to 2018 in accordance with the latest available primary data. This is to ensure the accuracy and consistency of the entire system of national accounts. Details of revisions are indicated in the revision note on the following pages.

On this occasion, we would like to express our gratitude to agencies and individuals who constantly supply basic data as well as contribute suggestions on enhancing compilation of the National Income of Thailand and other statistic accounts.

Revisions to the National Income of Thailand 2021 Edition

In this publication, the estimates have been revised back to 2018. The revisions were made based on the most recent data from the primary sources as follows:

1. Revised data

- Agricultural, forestry, and fishing: revised agricultural figures back to 2019 according to the Agricultural Statistics of Thailand 2019 and 2020 from the Office of Agricultural Economics, and amended fishery figures back to 2019 according to the Fisheries Statistics of Thailand 2020 and estimated data of 2021 from the Department of Fisheries.
- Mining and quarrying: revised mineral production figures back to 2020 according to mineral production of Thailand from the Department of Primary Industries and Mines, and the Department of Mineral Fuels.
- Manufacturing sector: revised industrial production figures back to 2019 according to the Manufacturing Product Index (MPI) from the Office of Industrial Economics, Ministry of Industry; revised imports and exports of merchandise data from the Custom Department.
- Construction sector: revised the construction data of public and private sectors back to 2019.
- Wholesale and retail; trade and repair of motor vehicles and motorcycle: revised data back to 2019 due to updated production data of manufacturing and agriculture sectors.
- Transportation and storage: revised data back to 2019 due to updated statistical data of land, water, and air transport by the main source.
- Accommodation and catering services: revised income for the Value Added Taxes assessment back to 2019.
- Financial and insurance activities: revised data back to 2019 according to the updated annual reports of specialized financial institutions and other financial institutions; revised life and non-life insurances from the Office of Insurance Commission (OIC).
- Private final consumption expenditure and General government consumption expenditure: revised data back to 2019 according to relevant data sources.
- Gross fixed capital formation expenditure: revised the machinery and equipment data back to 2019 according to the latest report; and the public construction data back to 2019.
- Change in inventories: revised data back to 2019 according to relevant data sources.
- Exports and Imports merchandise and services: revised the data back to 2020 and the primary income data from the rest of the world back to 2018 according to the updated balance of payments of the bank of Thailand.
- Primary income of households and NPISHs: revised the income from households and non-profit institutions serving households back to 1999; revised the compensation of employees back to 2019; and revised property income back to 2018.
- Primary Income payments of households and NPISHs: revised the data and accounting record of investment income payable on pension entitlement back to 1999.
- Secondary income and payments of households and NPISHs revised back to 2019.
- The allocation for profits of corporations revised back to 2018 conforming to relevant data sources.
- Updated other basic data according to the latest data available from original data sources.

2. Abbreviation

• This publication has two letters assigned after data period (s) in tables (r and p). The letter "r" stands for "revised" representing revision figures based on most recent data, coverage, and compilation methodology. Moreover, the letter "p" stands for "preliminary" annual figure, subject to revisions in the next series of publications.

Executive Summary

The Thai economy in 2021, measured by the Gross Domestic Product (GDP), increased by 1.5%, in contrast to a contraction of 6.1% in 2020. The expansion was from both agricultural and non-agricultural productions. Hence, the agricultural production improved moderately as a result of a growth in main crop production. The non-agricultural production was uplifted by the declined COVID-19 spread nationwide and worldwide, in addition to the announcement by the Royal Thai Government to lift the nationwide COVID-19 restrictions in line with the country's plan to downgrade the measures, which encouraged people to fully get vaccination. Moreover, the Thai government assured that the economic stimulus will be taken continually, in consistence with the entry policies started with entry screening of international arrivals in order to travel domestically. Furthermore, the international trade recovery was one of the important circumstances, which positively reflected to the domestic production.

Total production increased by 1.5% as a consequence to a 2.3% rise in agricultural production, specifically in main crop production and a 1.4% increase in non-agricultural production. The improvement of the non-agricultural production was mainly from the significant expansion in industrial sector compared to the previous year, according to higher domestic and external product requirements in line with the less amount of production in 2020. Furthermore, the service sector greatly accelerated in conformance to the Royal Thai Government announcement that to relax the COVID-19 restrictions. This reassured that people could participate more normal activities by providing vaccines and encouraging people's incentive of vaccination in order to prevent the disease. The reassurance reflected to people's living confidence. Moreover, the economic stimulus and people's expenditures greatly contributed to expansions in service productions, for example, wholesale and retail trade, accommodation and food services, transportation and storage, etc.

Domestic demand increased by the increases of private final consumption expenditure, general government final consumption, investment, and the import and export of goods and services. The private final consumption expenditure rose by 0.6%, compared to a contraction of 0.8% in 2020 conforming to the reduction of COVID-19 widespread, which was strictly controlled by the government measures in the past year. Moreover, the government has provided vaccines and allocated the vaccination throughout the nation, along with the relaxation measures against the spread. Therefore, the economic activities turned into normal, as a consequence of higher employments and household's incomes. Furthermore, the expenditure stimulus measures and cost of living allowance attributed to a higher household's purchasing power. General government final consumption expenditure increased by 3.7%, compared to 1.4% in 2020. Gross fixed capital formation rose by 3.1%, in contrast to a fall of 4.8% in 2020. In particular, private investment accelerated from a reduction last year, while public investment decelerated. For the external sector, exports and imports of goods and services grew by 11.1% and 17.8%, orderly.

National income in 2021 registered a value of 15,590,257 million baht, which increased by 1.8%. Sources of income were from a return to labor with a value of 5,059,533 million baht which expanded by 1.1%. Moreover, a return to capital, land, and operation valued at 6,053,155 million baht, expanded by 2.7%. On the contrary, Taxes on production and import less subsidies valued at 1,437,424 million baht, decreased by 0.4%. Consumption of fixed capital valued at 3,040,145 million baht, grew by 2.2% in this year. In per capita terms, national income per capita in 2021 was 223,715 baht, rising from 220,368 baht in 2020. Disposable income per capita was 133,962 baht and consumption expenditure per capita was 121,329 baht. Consequently, per capita personal savings valued at 14,121 baht in 2021.

For overall economic stability, gross saving decreased by 1.9%, compared to a fall of 15.9% in 2020, in contrast to a 24.5% increase in gross investment. Consequently, the saving-investment gap (equivalent to current account) postulated a deficit with the value of 333,003 million baht, accounting for 2.1% of GDP. However, it was lower than a surplus of 658,576 million baht in 2020.

GDP implicit price deflator increased by 1.7%, compared to a contraction of 1.3% in 2020. The expansion contributed from the non-agricultural price index with a rise of 1.8%, higher than a fall of 1.6% in 2020. In addition, the agricultural price index increased by 1.0%, compared to a 2.7% rise in 2020. Meanwhile, the consumer price index (CPI) and the producer price index (PPI) expanded by 1.2% and 4.7%, consecutively.

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
Thai Economy in 2021 National Accounts Perspectives

Overview

GDP in 2021 increased by 1.5%, accelerating from a fall of 6.1% in 2020.

Gross Domestic Product of 2021 increased by 1.5%, in contrast to a fall of 6.1% in 2020. The acceleration resulted from increases in both non-agricultural and agricultural productions. The agricultural production rose by 2.3%, accordingly to the higher amount in main crop yields. Similarly, the non-agricultural production expanded by 1.4%, accelerating from a 6.3% fall in 2020. The positive contributors included the reduction of worldwide COVID-19 spread, in addition to government measures which proceeded continually and strictly. Thus, the vaccination was the urgent action to support people preventing the transmission. In 2021, the government downgraded the measures in order to control the spread nationwide and worldwide. Moreover, the Thai government assured that the economic stimulus will be taken continually, in consistence to the entry policies started with entry screening of international arrivals. Furthermore, the international trade recovery was one of the important circumstances, which positively reflected to the domestic production.

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) in 2021 at current market prices valued at 16,166,598 million baht. After deducting 576,341 million baht of net factor income from the rest of the world, Gross National Income (GNI) registered at 15,590,257 million baht, increasing by 1.8%. Whereas per capita NI was 223,715 baht, higher than 220,368 baht in 2020, or an expansion of 1.5%.



Domestic Demand: increased from 2020, attributed to 0.6% and 3.1% rises in private final consumption expenditure and investment, compared to falls of 0.8% and 4.8% in 2020, orderly. In addition, government final consumption expenditure increased by 3.7%, compared to 1.4% growth in 2020. Supporting factors were from (1) the ease of government measures with regard to control the COVID-19 spread, which greatly contributed to economic activities (2) an increase in household's income (3) the expenditure stimulus measures and cost of living allowance attributed to a higher household's purchasing power, and 4) the expansion in machinery and equipment investment of private sector.

External Sector: exports of goods and services at current market prices increased by 17.5%, in contrast to a contraction of 19.8% in 2020. Such a rise mainly contributed to 22.1% in merchandise exports, on the contrary of 15.6% fall in service receipts. For the import side, imports of goods and services at current market prices improved by 30.6%. In particular, merchandise imports and service payments rose 27.0% and 45.5%, respectively. As a result, trade and services balance at current market prices valued a surplus of 5,261 million baht, lower than the surplus of 812,831 million baht in the previous year, attributed to a trade surplus of 1,276,220 million baht, compared to a surplus of 1,281,270 million baht in 2020. In contrast, services registered a deficit of 1,270,959 million baht, higher than a deficit of 468,439 million baht in 2020. However, net factor income was recorded at a deficit of 576,341 million baht. On the other hand, net current transfers recorded a surplus of 238,077 million baht. Ultimately, the current account registered a deficit of 333,003 million baht in 2021, declining from a surplus of 658,576 million baht in 2020.

National Income (NI) or income from factors of production in 2021 recorded the value of 15,590,257 million baht, increased by 1.8%. The expansion was from the compensation of employees, accounting for 32.5% of NI, with a 1.1% increase. Particularly, net property income and operating income, accounting for 38.8% of NI, rose by 2.7%. Moreover, consumption of fixed capital, accounting for 19.5% of NI, with a rise of 2.2%. On the contrary, taxes on production and imports (net), accounting for 9.2%, decreased by 0.4%.

Gross Domestic Savings in 2021 registered the value of 4,295,079 million baht, decreasing by 1.9%, compared to a drop of 15.9% in 2020. As a result, overall net savings valued at 1,381,291 million baht decreased by 3.9%, improving from a significant fall of 41.1% in 2020, contributed by a 33.9% reduction in net public sector saving, in contrast to an increase of 9.7% in net private sector saving.

Overall Economic Stability: saving revealed a downturn, with a fall of 1.9%. Meanwhile, overall investment increased by 24.5%. As a result, the saving-investment gap (equivalent to current account surplus) registered a deficit of 333,003 million baht, compared to a surplus of 658,576 million baht in 2020. The deficit accounted by 2.1% of gross domestic product.

GDP Implicit Price Deflator increased by 1.7%, improving from a fall of 1.3% in 2020. The agricultural price index grew by 1.0%, compared to a rise of 2.7% in the previous year. Furthermore, the non-agricultural price index increased by 1.8%, on the contrary of 1.6% decline in 2020. The consumer prices index (CPI) expanded by 1.2%, and the producer prices index (PPI) rose by 4.7%.

Gross Domestic Product

GDP in 2021 increased by 1.5%, compared to a 6.1% decrease in the previous year.

Gross domestic product in 2021 increased by 1.5%, rebounding from a drop of 6.1% in 2020, propelled by both agricultural and non-agricultural sectors. Agricultural sector grew by 2.3%, driven by higher yields of main crops. Besides, non-agricultural sector rose by 1.4%, improving from a 6.3% shrink in 2020. This expansion was attributable mainly to a recovery sign of overall situation of the global and domestic epidemic of COVID-19, due to intensive COVID-19 measures implementation control the spread of the disease and an accelerating vaccination in 2021. Additionally, the government also relaxed several COVID-19 restrictions including reopening the country to foreign tourists. In addition, international trade conditions began to recover which was a positive contribution to economic growth in this year.

Agricultural production increased by 2.3%, compared to a 3.3% fall in 2020. The expansion resulted from higher yields of main crops, including paddy, maize, cassava, sugarcane, pineapple and rubber. However, livestock production declined, originated by lower production of cattle, swine, broilers and hen's egg. Similarly, fishing production also decreased. Due to a drop of marine fishing.

Non-agricultural production increased by 1.4%, rebounding from a 6.3% fall in 2020. Industrial sector grew by 3.7%, compared to a 5.8% drop in 2020. This expansion was driven by manufacturing sector which increased by 4.7%, accelerating from 5.3% in the previous year, due to higher domestic and external demand and the previous year's low base. In addition, service sector increased by 0.3%, improving form a 6.6% shrink in 2020. This recovery was attributable to a relaxation of COVID-19 restrictions which allowed usual daily activities. In addition, vaccination roll-out and campaign also supported aspect of consumer's daily lives. Besides, the government implemented several stimulus packages to boost domestic production and spending which provided a positive contribution to several sectors such as wholesale and retail trade, repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles; accommodation and food service; and transportation and storage activities.

Agricultural sector

Agricultural production grew by 2.3%. Prices of the agricultural products also increased by 1.0%.

Overall agricultural production increased by 2.3%, compared to a drop of 3.3% in 2020, owing to a great amount of rain at the end of 2020 and the beginning of 2021 and a global economic recovery after an improved COVID-19 situation. Non-perennial crops, perennial crops and forestry increased by 4.1%, 3.7% and 5.2% respectively, leading to a growth of 7.4% in agricultural services. However, livestock and fishing production decreased by 4.7% and 2.8%, orderly. Prices of agricultural products increased by 1.0%, following an increase of 2.7% in 2020.

Agriculture, forestry and fishing


Total production expanded by 2.3%, consisting of major production activities as follows:

- **Non-perennial crops** grew by 4.1%, due to a higher yields of main crops, namely, paddy, sugarcane, cassava and maize.
- **Perennial crops** increased by 3.7%, due to a higher yields of major crops including oil palm, pineapple, and rubber.
- **Livestock** decreased by 4.7%, owing to lower production of swine, cattle, broiler and hen's eggs. Meanwhile, the production of buffalo and duck increased.
- **Agricultural services** grew by 7.4%, driven by an increase in planting and harvest services in line with planting areas.
- **Forestry** rose by 5.2%, due to an expansion in firewood and charcoal production.
- **Fishing and aquaculture** declined by 2.8%, resulted by an decease in marine fishery despite an increase in freshwater fishery.

Implicit prices of agricultural products increased by 1.0%, decelerating from a 2.7% rise in 2020. This expansion was attributable to higher prices of main crops, namely, sugarcane, maize, oil palm, rubber, swine and cattle as well as fishing products, despite decrease in prices of paddy, pineapple, other fruits and broiler.

Non-agricultural sector increased by 1.4%.





Mining and quarrying

Mining and quarrying decreased 5.3%, following a 9.1% drop in 2020. This contraction was attributable to a drop of 6.1% in natural gas and crude oil production, compared to a fall of 10.0% in the previous year. This reduction was mainly caused by a 16.7% decline in crude oil production, continued decreasing from a 6.9% fall in 2020, in line with lower production in main sources, namely, Sirikit and others in the S1 group, Erawan group and Tantawan Benchamas group. Additionally, the natural gas and condensate production declined by 3.5%, compared to a 10.9% drop in the previous year, due to lower production in main sources, namely, Erawan group, South Bongkot and Tantawan Benchamas group. Similarly, the quarrying of stone, sand, and clay dropped by 1.7%, continually decreasing from a fall of 1.2% in 2020.

Manufacturing

Manufacturing increased by 4.7%, recovering from a fall of 5.3% in 2020. This expansion was driven by higher domestic and external demand due to an ease of several COVID-19 restrictions and an implementation of several stimulus packages from the government to boost domestic consumption. Additionally, Thailand reopened a country welcoming foreign tourist on the end of 2021 as well as a recovery of international trade which experienced a deep contraction in 2020. In 2021, major manufacturing which increased are food products; chemical products; computer and electronic components; vehicle and parts; and rubber and plastic products.

Manufacturing with an expansion

- **Food products** increased by 3.8%, compared to a decrease of 4.6% in 2020, due to higher production of processed and preserved meat, processing and preserving of fruit, vegetable oil and prepared animal feeds in response to consumer's demand which was supported by economic recovery. However, manufacture of processing and preserving of fish, tea, coffee and bakery products decreased.
- **Leather and other products** grew by 6.8%, improving from a 17.0% shrink in the previous year. This growth was propelled by increases in every product, due partly to an increase in export of leather, tanning leather, and footwear.
- Wood and products of wood increased by 4.2%, continually growing from 2020, as a result of strong demand for construction and wooden products.
- **Paper and paper products** rose by 3.9% in accordance with a great demand from downstream industry and an expansion in courier activities.
- **Printing** grew by 0.7%, compared to a decrease of 7.6% in 2020, due to an increase in manufacture of newspaper and magazines and service activities related to printing.

- Chemical and chemical products increased by 6.6%, due to an expansion in manufacture of several products including fertilizers and polyethylene despite a decrease in soap and detergents.
- **Basic pharmaceutical products** and pharmaceutical preparation grew by 6.3%, continually increasing from the previous year, in response to higher domestic and external demand.
- **Rubber and plastic products** rose by 3.5%, owing to higher demand for automobile and motor vehicle tires as well as plastic products for construction. Manufacture of plastics articles for the packaging of goods, however, declined.
- **Non-metallic mineral products** increased by 2.2%, originated manly from higher manufacture of ceramic sanitary ware and article of concrete.
- **Basic metals** grew by 21.4%, in contrast to a drop of 4.6% in 2020, as manufacture of steel plate, tin plate, aluminum, zinc and copper favorably expanded.
- **Fabricated metal products** rose by 4.4%, driven by an expansion in all types of products such as metal can, steam generators, tanks and metals for construction.
- Computer, electronic and optical products increased by 6.5%, resulting from an increase in the manufacture of electronic components and boards of computer and electronic devices such as circuit boards and data storage devices.
- **Electrical equipment** rose by 7.5%, continually increasing from the previous year, led by higher manufacture of air conditioner, battery and electrical motor.
- **Machinery and equipment** increased by 5.2%, due to greater manufacture of engines, machinery and turbine, compressors, agricultural machinery and office machinery. However, manufacture of industrial machinery declined.
- Motor vehicles grew by 17.1%, compared to a drop of 24.8% in 2020, driven by a higher manufacture of motor vehicles and parts of motor vehicles, resulted from higher domestic and external demand. Manufacture of bodies (coachwork) for motor vehicles; and manufacture of trailers and semi-trailers, however, decreased.
- Other transport equipment increased by 4.8%, recovering from a 14.5% fall in the previous year, driven by increase in manufacture of motor vehicles and building ships and boats. However, manufacture of railway locomotives and rolling stock; and spacecraft decreased.
- **Furniture** rose by 23.2%, propelled by manufacture of wooden and metal furniture, in response to external demand.
- Other manufacturing rose by 6.6%. This expansion was attributable to an increase in manufacture of jewelry, musical instruments, sport goods and toys, in response to a recovery of domestic economic condition.

Manufacturing with a contraction

- **Beverages** decreased by 0.5%, following a drop of 7.2% in 2020. The manufacture of beer, water and non-alcohol declined, despite an increase in manufacture of alcohol beverages.
- Cigarette dropped by 5.5% due to decrease in manufacture of tobacco products and cigarettes and cigars, despite expansions in manufacture of snuff and incubating tobacco leaves.
- **Textile** declined by 3.7%, compared to a shrink of 17.2% in the previous year. The contractions were found in almost every textile product. Meanwhile, manufacture of made-up textile and silk expanded favorably.
- **Wearing apparel** decreased by 8.7%, due to lower manufacture of readymade wearing apparel.
- **Petroleum refinery** declined by 1.7%, owing to lower domestic demand.

Electricity, gas and air conditioning supply

Electricity, gas, and air conditioning supply increased by 0.3% in accordance with electricity consumption which grew by 1.9%, compared with a decrease of 3.2% in 2020. The greater consumption was found in residential users as well as an improvement in business users. However, gas separation declined by 6.4%, continually decreasing from the previous year.

Water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities

Water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities increased by 4.6%, accelerating from a 0.6% rise in 2020. This was attributable to water supply activities which grew by 2.2%, recovering from a 2.7% fall in the previous year. Besides, waste collection, treatment, and disposal activities; and materials recovery activities rose by 10.3% and 9.7%, following 3.6% and 14.4%, respectively.

Construction

Construction increased by 2.2%, accelerated from 1.3% in 2020. The main driver for this year was public construction which continuously rose from the prior year. It mainly contributed by other construction by the general government, which was precipitated by a rise in disbursement from the central budget, subsidies, and loans from the emergency decree authorizing the Ministry of Finance to raise loans to solve problems, remedy and restore the economy and society as affected by the Coronavirus disease pandemic. Whilst, the state enterprise construction suffered an ongoing downward growth because most of its operations were continuing projects from the last years, such as the Ninth Bangkok water supply improvement project and the pipeline improvement project of the Metropolitan Waterworks Authority (MWA), the Construction of Electricity Power Transmission System of the Provincial Electricity Authority (PEA), and petroleum exploration project of PTT Exploration and Production Public Company Limited (PTTEP). For private construction, it decreased this year. The dwelling construction was the main contributor to this unfavorable result, according to a rise in entrepreneur's cost, especially in construction materials, and a shrinking in a permitted construction area. In addition, as the major construction projects, like the Pink and Yellow rail line, had reached the end of the construction phase, the overall private construction was diminished. However, the non-dwelling construction by the private sector resumed on the upward side, which was attributable to the construction of industrial plants, particularly.

Wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles

Wholesale and retail trade, and repair of motor vehicle and motorcycles grew by 1.7%, compared a 3.2% fall in 2020, owing to acceleration in sales of motor vehicles and motorcycles and wholesale and retailed trade. These activities were driven by several government stimulus packages to propel domestic production and consumption as well as an ease of COVID-19 restrictions, together with a reopening to foreign tourists on the end of 2020.

Transportation and storage

Transportation and storage declined by 2.8%, following a 22.7% shrink in 2020. The contraction was attributable to land, water, and air transport services, which declined by 2.5%, 6.8%, and 40.0%, respectively. These were attributable to lower passenger transports, despite an improved COVID-19 situation. Besides, domestic travelling was still small compared to normal conditions although the government eased several COVID-19 restrictions. Additionally, the number of foreign tourists, allowed on the end of 2020, was still small. In this year, overall of passenger transports, however, reflected a sign of recovery in contrast to a deep decrease in 2020. The freight transport service for both agricultural and manufacturing product improved in accordance with the production and sales. Meanwhile, postal and courier activities rose by 38.4%, accelerating from 19.9% in 2020, in accordance with the significant growth of private operators' turnover.

Accommodation and food service activities

Accommodation and food service activities decreased by 15.0%, improving from a 36.9% shrink in the previous year. The recovery was attributable to improvements in both accommodation and food services with 34.9% and 7.5% decrease, compared to 49.5% and 26.9% drop in 2020, respectively. In this year, the number of foreign tourists stood at 427,869 people, driven by reopening country to foreign tourists since November 1, 2021 under Thailand Pass System in several programs, including Test and Go, Alternative Quarantine (AQ) and Sandbox, which requires to book an accommodation in advances. Besides, domestic travelling also showed a sign of recovery, propelled by a relaxation of COVID-19 restrictions and government's stimulus packages to boost domestic tourism such as Rao Tiew Duay Kan (We Travel Together) Program as well as several campaigns encouraging people to receive COVID-19 vaccine higher than two doses which allowed usual daily activities and increased tourists' confidence.

Information and communication

Information and communication expanded 5.5%, accelerating from 1.7% in 2020. This was mainly driven by telecommunication activities and computer programming and consultancy activities with growth of 6.6% and 6.6%, higher than 1.8% and 3.9% in the previous year. In addition, programming and broadcasting activities rose by 0.2%, improving a decrease of 1.0% in the previous year. However, activities of publishing of books, periodicals and other publishing and activities of motion picture, video and television program production, sound recording declined by 7.0% and 15.4%, respectively.

Financial and insurance activities

Financial and insurance activities expanded by 5.5%, slightly increased from a 5.3% growth in 2020. In 2021, the performances of commercial banks and other depository corporations revealed an improved growth in addition to increases in fee incomes, volume of credits, and deposits. The expansion is partly attributable to the government measures which stimulus the domestic economy. Furthermore, net interest margin on loans and deposits in commercial banks represented an enhanced growth in comparison to the previous year. For insurances, the overall operating result returned to rise, particularly in life insurance business. Hence, health insurance became more popular, according to people's consciousness in low-risk management from the hospital and medical expenses. However, non-life insurances slowed down, according to a decelerated premium, in contrast to a rise in claims. Moreover, the performance of securities continually developed, driven by a positive growth in turnover.

Real estate activities

Real estate activities increased by 1.7%, continually rising from 1.5% in 2020. This growth comprised a 2.8% increase in real estate activities with own or leased property. Meanwhile, real estate broker activities decreased by 10.4%, due partly to the COVID-19 pandemic and consumer's confidence towards economic situations, which resulted in an increase in consumer caution and a delay in the housing purchase decision.

Professional, scientific and technical activities

Professional, scientific and technical activities decreased by 3.1%, compared to a 4.9% fall in 2020. This contraction was attributable to a reduction in management consultancy activities; architectural and engineering activities; technical testing and analysis; legal and accounting activities; and advertising and market research activities. Meanwhile, activities of scientific research and development and activities of veterinary increased.

Administrative and support services activities

Administrative and support services activities decreased by 7.8%, improving from a 21.5% drop in 2020. This improvement was attributable to a recovery of travel agency, tour operator and reservation service activities in accordance with the number of foreign visitors which indicated a recovered figure by the end of 2020 and the number of domestic visitors which also reflected a sign of improvement driven by several government's stimulus packages, especially Rao Tiew Duay Kan (We Travel Together) Program. Additionally, activities of general cleaning of the building; activities of security and investigation; and activities of other employment placement agencies continually declined.

Education

Education increased by 0.3%. This expansion was represented by a 0.1% and a 2.3% increase of public and private education, orderly.

Human health and social work activities

Human health and social work activities rose by 3.5%, continuing to increase from 3.2% in 2020. This was attributable to continual expansions in both public and private health. However, social work activities both with and without accommodation for the children and elderly decreased, due partly to COVID-19 pandemic.

Art, entertainment and recreation

Art, entertainment, and recreation increased by 4.9%, rebounding from a 12.9% drop in the previous year, driven by activities of government lottery with a growth of 15.6%, in contrast to a 11.2% drop in the previous year. Botanical garden activities; sport activities; and creative, arts and entertainment activities still declined due to COVID-19 restrictions to control the pandemic, especially in the first half of 2020.

Other service activities

Other service activities declined by 6.1%, continually decreasing from 7.9% in 2020. This reduction was from membership organizations activities; repair of computers, and personal and household goods activities; and other service activities which fell by 8.8%, 0.1% and 13.4%, respectively.

Expenditure on Gross Domestic Product

Private final consumption expenditure in 2021 expanded by 0.6%.

Composition of private final consumption expenditure

Private final consumption expenditure (PFCE) in 2021 expanded by 0.6%, compared to a 0.8% decrease in 2020.

Private final consumption expenditure began to recover from a contraction in the previous year. The main factor came from the improvement of the COVID-19 pandemic, which became milder and less severe. This is partly a result of the strict measures to control the spread in the last year, along with the accelerated provision and distribution of vaccines. Moreover, the government sector gradually relaxed the COVID-19 control measures, which has had a positive impact on employment and household income as a consequence. Furthermore, on account of stimulus measures and the cost of living support, household purchasing power improved. However, inflation rate is high, especially in the energy sector, causing people to be concerned with the economic recovery, which is reflected in the consumer confidence index standing at a low level, recorded at 44.7%, compared to 52.6% in 2020.

Spending on non-durable goods and net services increased by 2.1% and 1.0%, compared to a rise of 1.7% and 2.9% in 2020, orderly. Non-durable goods mainly expanded from food items and non-alcoholic beverages. In contrast, spending on durable and semi-durable goods decreased by 4.4% and 4.9%, compared to a drop of 16.5% and 11.8% in 2020, orderly.



Private final consumption expenditure in the domestic market, excluding residents abroad, fell by 1.8%, compared to a decrease of 12.8% in 2020. An expenditure of household final consumption and non-profit institutions serving households decreased by 1.7% and 5.3%, compared to a drop of 12.9% and 4.9% in 2020, orderly.

Private final consumption expenditure in the domestic market, excluding the expenditure of non-residents in the country and the expenditure of residents abroad, increased by 0.9%, compared to 2.0% in 2020. Whereas private final consumption expenditure in the domestic market, including the expenditure of residents abroad, dropped by 22.1%, compared to a fall of 65.5% in 2020. Therefore, private final consumption expenditure increased by 0.6%, improving from a fall of 0.8% in 2020.

Household consumption expenditure classified by goods and services items.

Food and non-alcoholic beverages increased by 3.0%, compared to a growth of 2.2% in 2020. Food items expanded by 3.2%, continually growing from 2.8% in 2020. The expansion was driven by the consumption of bread and cereals; meat; oil and fat; vegetable; fruit. Spending on non-alcoholic beverages grew by 1.2%, improving from a decrease of 2.1% in 2020.

Alcoholic beverages and tobacco dropped by 1.7%, improving from a decrease of 4.2% in 2020. Alcoholic beverage consumption fell by 2.0% from a decrease of 6.3% in 2020. Meanwhile, tobacco consumption fell by 1.4%, continually declining from a decrease of 0.7% in 2020.

Clothing and footwear decreased by 9.1%, compared to a drop of 18.8% in 2020. The main factor was a decrease in expenses on clothing and footwear, which dropped by 8.7%, and 12.4%, compared to 19.0%, and 17.1% decline in 2020, respectively.

Housing, water, electricity, gas, and other fuels grew by 2.6%, decelerated from 3.3% in 2020. Expenses on electricity, gases and other fuels expanded by 2.3%, slowing down from a 5.3% rise in 2020. A rental for housing and repair of housing expanded by 2.6% and 1.3%, compared to a growth of 2.1% and a decrease of 5.4% in 2020, respectively. Meanwhile, household water supply consumption diminished by 0.2% from a 4.0% rise in 2020.

Furnishing, household equipment and routine maintenance of the house expanded by 0.9%, improving from a 2.6% decrease in 2020. The recovery was from household textiles, household appliances and glassware, tableware, household utensils, tools and equipment for house and garden, goods and services for routine household maintenance expanded by 1.2%, 0.8%, 4.5%, 1.6%, compared to decrease of 3.5%, 1.4%, 5.2% and 2.0% in 2020, orderly.

Health increased by 8.3%, accelerating from 6.3% in 2020. The improvement was contributed by expenses on outpatient and hospital services, which grew by 6.0% and 11.1%, accelerating from 1.6%, and 7.6% in 2020, respectively. Purchasing of medical products grew by 6.3%, slightly slowed down from 6.5% in 2020. The deceleration was from a decrease in demand for medical products following the relaxation of COVID-19 situation.

Transport dropped by 6.1%, compared to a decrease of 17.4% in 2020. Spending on vehicle purchases, personal transport equipment, transport services dropped by 3.3%, 4.1% and 13.0%, from a fall of 19.2%, 4.2% and 31.9% in 2020, respectively.

Communication grew by 1.7% from a rise of 1.1% in 2020. The expansion was mainly from postal services, which rose by 18.2%, compared to a 4.8% growth in 2020, consistent with entrepreneurs' turnover and private postal service consumption. Additionally, expenses on telephone equipment also well expanded. However, spending on telephone services grew by 0.7%, slowed down from a 1.0% rise in 2020.

Recreation and culture diminished by 2.9%, improving from a drop of 20.3% in 2020. Spending on recreational and cultural services expanded by 5.1%, accelerating from a 15.5% decrease in 2020. This expansion was mainly from lottery spending. Nevertheless, spending on package holidays dropped by 71.2% from a fall of 74.9% in 2020. Meanwhile, spending on newspapers, books, stationery, and other durable goods for recreation and culture continued to decrease from the previous year.

Education rose by 1.6%, compared to a drop of 1.3% in 2020. Expenses on vocational education, higher education and other education well expanded. Moreover, expenses for pre-primary education slightly improved from the previous year.

Restaurants and hotels fell by 18.8%, compared to a decrease of 48.1% in 2020. The expenditure of restaurant and hotel services decreased by 13.5% and 44.8%, improving from 31.3% and 74.3% fall in 2020, respectively. The improvement resulted from the relaxation of COVID-19 restrictions, which prompted people to resume living like before the pandemic. In addition, the government measures to support and stimulate household spending were also a positive factor that enhanced the outlook.

Miscellaneous goods and services decreased by 0.4%, compared to a drop of 5.9% in 2020. Purchasing on personal effects and other services fell by 7.1% and 6.5%, improving from a fall of 19.7% and 13.9% in 2020, orderly. Purchasing on personal care and financial service increased by 4.2% and 2.5%, continually rose from 0.3% and 1.3% in 2020, orderly.

Individual consumption expenditure of non-profit institutions serving households (NPISHS) fell by 5.3%, continually dropped from a 4.9% decrease in 2020. Spending on health services, education, and social protection declined by 4.0% from a drop of 1.7% in 2020. Other services declined by 6.9%, compared to an 8.7% fall in 2020.

Private consumption expenditure classified by durability 4 categories

PFCE by durability of 4 factors.

Durable goods decreased by 4.4%, compared to a drop of 16.5% in 2020. Purchasing on vehicles, furniture and furnishing, as well as personal jewelry, dropped by 3.3%, 1.5%, and 6.2%, compared to a fall of 19.2%, 3.2%, and 23.6% in 2020, orderly. However, spending on therapeutic appliances and equipment, along with photographic and cinematographic equipment expanded by 3.5% and 8.4%, compared to a drop of 7.4% and 3.4% in 2020, respectively.

Semi-durable goods declined by 4.9%, compared to an 11.8% depletion in 2020. Expenses on clothing and footwear dropped by 9.1%, compared to a fall of 18.8% in 2020. Nonetheless, glassware, tableware and household utensils; spare parts and accessories for personal transport equipment; toys and hobbies rose by 0.8%, 3.6% and 5.2%, compared to a drop of 1.4%, 7.0% and 1.6% in 2020, orderly.

Non-durable goods grew by 2.1%, continually rose from a 1.7% growth in 2020. Expenses on food and non-alcoholic beverages; medicine and medical products; personal care grew by 3.0%, 18.2% and 8.2%, continually grew from a rise of 2.2%, 7.2% and 6.3% in 2020, orderly. Whereas spending on alcoholic beverages and tobacco declined by 1.7%, compared to a 4.2% depletion in 2020.

Services increased by 1.0%, decelerated from 2.9% in 2020. Expenses on accommodation services, telephone services, and financial services expanded by 4.4%, 0.7% and 2.5%, decelerated from an expansion of 4.6%, 1.0% and 5.3% in 2020, respectively. Whereas, the expenses on restaurant and hotel declined by 18.8% compared to a drop of 48.1% in previous year.

Composition of general government final consumption expenditure

General government final consumption expenditure in real terms increased by 3.7%.

General government final consumption expenditure at current market prices recorded a value of 2,951,725 million baht, with an increase of 5.9%, accelerating from 2.1% in 2020. Comprehensively, government compensation of employees valued at 1,625,987 million baht with an increase of 2.8%, decelerating from 3.7% in the previous year. Meanwhile, purchases from enterprises and abroad registered a value of 842,502 million baht, which increased by 3.3% following a 1.2% rise in the prior year. Social transfers in kind—purchased market production recorded a value of 390,277 million baht with an increase of 37.9%, from 1.4% in 2020. The increase is attributable to health expenditure related to Covid-19 disease. Consumption of fixed capital recorded a value of 324,967 million baht with a 2.2% increase, decelerated from a 2.5% increase in 2020. Moreover, purchases by households and enterprises valued at 232,008 million baht rose by 10.3%, slowed down from an 11.9% increase in the previous year.

By the functions of government, total general government final consumption at current market prices recorded the value of 2,951,725 million baht, composed of education services with a 27.2% share of general government final consumption expenditure. The rest of government services by function comprised a 23.1% share for health services, 13.5% share for general public services, 11.2% share for economic affairs, 9.8% share for defence, 8.6% share for public order and safety, and 6.6% share for remaining services containing housing and community amenities, recreation, culture and religion, environmental, and social protection.

General government final consumption expenditure in real terms grew by 3.7% due to a 0.4% rise in compensation of employees, 1.4% in purchases from enterprises and abroad, 35.3% in social transfers in kind–purchased market production, and 0.7% in consumption of fixed capital. Nonetheless, purchases by households and enterprises increased by 8.0%.

Gross capital formation

Gross capital formation in 2021 at current market prices recorded the value of 4,628,082 million baht, consisting of 3,805,475 million baht of gross fixed capital formation and 822,607 million baht of the change in inventories.

In real terms, gross fixed capital formation grew by 3.1%, accelerating from a 4.8% drop in 2020. The positive outcome from both private and public sectors contributed 3.0% growth, rose from 8.1% decrease in 2020, and public investment expanded by 3.4%, decelerating from an increase of 5.1 in 2020.

Private construction at current market prices recorded the value of 559,878 million baht, consisting of dwelling 281,578 million baht, non-dwelling 160,442 million baht, and other constructions 102,736 million baht. In real terms, private construction dropped by 0.6%, compared with a fall of 2.0% in 2020. For a particular sector is described as follows, dwelling construction fell by 3.2%, continuing from 6.7% drop in 2020 and non-dwelling construction grew by 1.0%, improving from a decline of 4.5%; moreover, other construction increased by 5.9%, slowed down significantly from 24.2% in the previous year. Meanwhile, the cost of ownership transfer decreased by 10.1%, consecutively constricted from 11.9% in 2020.

Private investment in equipment and machinery at current market prices recorded a value of 2,187,046 million baht, which in real term expanded by 4.0%, accelerated from a 9.7% plunge in 2020. The improvement was evidently seen in machinery and equipment investment, particularly a rise in machinery and office equipment purchases. This positive result could be explained by an ease of COVID-19 restrictions, resulting in an uplift of economic activities. Meanwhile, investment in transportation fell due to a reduction in road motor vehicle purchases, which was seen by a shrink in records of newly registered cars and personal trucks. Nevertheless, the investment of other vehicles rose according to higher imports of aircraft and ships.

Public Investment

equipment Public investment

Public investment at current market prices recorded the value of 1,058,551 million baht, consisting of 802,179 million baht of public construction and 256,372 million baht of public machinery and equipment. In real terms, public investment rose by 3.4%, and decelerated from 5.1% in 2020. Such an improvement was contributed by a slowdown of government investment, while state enterprise showed a slight recovery.

Public Investment

Public construction at current market prices recorded the value of 802,179 million baht, comprising dwelling 13,806 million baht, non-dwelling 133,367 million baht, and other constructions 655,006 million baht. In real terms, public construction grew by 4.4%, compared to a 4.9% rise in 2020. The government construction expanded by 7.0%, moderately slowed down from 8.3% in 2020. Partly, it was affected by a rise in disbursement from the central budget, subsidies, and loans from the emergency decree authorizing the Ministry of Finance to raise loans to solve problems, remedy, and restore the economy and society. Meanwhile, the state enterprise construction fell by 0.9%, continuing from 1.4% drop in 2020. Most of the projects in this year were ongoing projects such as the Ninth Bangkok water supply improvement project and the pipeline improvement project of the Metropolitan Waterworks Authority (MWA), the Construction of the Electricity Power Transmission System of the Provincial Electricity Authority (PEA), and petroleum exploration project of PTT Exploration and Production Public Company Limited (PTTEP).

Public investment in machinery and equipment at current market prices recorded the value of 256,372 million baht. In real terms, public machinery and equipment increased by 0.5%, which slowed down from a rise of 5.6% in 2020. The government equipment investment dropped by 2.5%, plunging from an expansion of 23.4% in 2020, partly contributed by a constrict in the disbursement of durable articles from the government agencies, not under the direct supervision of the Prime minister and ministries. For state enterprises, the investment rose by 4.0%, which improved from a 9.2% drop last year. The projects happening this year were from the Expressway Authority of Thailand (EXAT), the Electricity Generating Authority of Thailand (EGAT), and the Metropolitan Waterworks Authority (MWA).

Investment classified by type of assets

Tangible fixed assets at current market prices recorded the value of 3,655,717 million baht, consisting of 295,384 million baht in dwelling construction, 981,476 million baht in non-dwelling construction, 2,368,163 million baht in machinery and equipment, and 10,694 million baht in cultivated assets. In real terms, the investment in tangible fixed assets increased by 2.7%, which improved from a fall of 5.1% in 2020. For an individual sector could be explained as follow, dwelling construction shrank by 2.4% following a 7.9% minus in the prior year, non-dwelling construction increased by 3.2%, slowed down from a rise of 6.2%, machinery and equipment and cultivated assets expanded by 3.2%, and 6.9%, accelerated from a reduction of 8.8%, and 17.2% in 2020, respectively.

Intangible fixed assets at current market prices, the value was 134,636 million baht, comprising 66,584 million baht in mineral exploration and 68,052 million baht in computer software. In real terms, the investment in intangible assets expanded by 16.3%, growing faster from 6.8% in 2020, mainly driven by a surge of 15.2% in mineral exploration investment, which greatly improved from 5.2% growth in 2020. However, the expense of computer software decelerated from a growth of 25.6% to 17.4% in the current year.

Costs of ownership transfer at current market prices recorded the value of 15,122 million baht. In real terms, it decreased by 10.1%, continuously fell from 11.9% drop in 2020.

Change in inventories

Change in inventories at current prices rose with a value of 822,607 million baht in 2021. The overall outlook for the accumulated stock of agricultural products, manufacturing products, gold, and crude oil showed a positive sign. In contrast, paddy's stock level declined since there were lower yields compared to the last year. Although, yield of paddy evidently increased, in contrast to an average price which decreased continually. Therefore, this resulted in the decline in the value of paddy. The expansion of agricultural stock was underpinned by the rise in rubber and cassava, while the positive outlook for the industrial-accumulated stock was attributable to computers and peripheral equipment, electronic components and circuit boards, plastics and synthetic rubber in primary forms, and refined petroleum products. The favorable outcome for this year resulted from various factors, including the easing measures to contain COVID-19 and the economic recovery in trade partner countries, which helped revive consumer demand. In addition, the ongoing recovery of private investment improved overall outcomes, according to consumer confidence and overall economic improvement. As a result, the manufacturing capacity had been expanded to support domestic and external demand expansion. On the other hand, the stocks of manufacturing products that declined in 2021 were preparing and spinning textile fibers, motorcycles, coffee tea, and herbal tea. Nonetheless, the inventory of gold soared because of substantial imports in the initial quarter of this year, partially influenced by the base effect since there was little export this year due to the peaking price that happened in 2020, causing a rush in gold export. Meanwhile, crude oil accumulation increased this year due to a significant global market increase in crude oil prices.

External Sectors

Exports of goods and services expanded

Exports of goods and services

Exports of goods and services at current market prices in 2021 disclosed the value at 9,479,767 million baht, increased by 17.5%, improved from a 19.8% contraction in 2020. This was mainly contributed by mounting exports of goods, while services receipts continually subsided.

Merchandise exports at current market prices recorded the value at 8,665,055 million baht, hiked up by 22.1%, on account of surge in exports of agriculture, fishery and manufacturing products. The expansion in agricultural products mainly resulted from increases in rubber, fruits and tapioca. The demand for rubber increased by exports to China. Exports of fruits grew not only from a double export value of durians to China, but also an increase in exports of longan and mangosteen. In addition, an export of tapioca increased from higher demand from China using as materials for producing feedstuff and alcohol, instead of maize which had significantly higher cost. However, exports of rice continued to drop, which partly due to comparatively higher price comparing with competitors. As a result, rice export quantity registered the value at 6.3 million ton, achieved the target set by Ministry of Commerce at 6 million ton. Manufacturing exports boosted from a rise of automotive product exports consisting of cars, pickup trucks and vehicle parts which resulted from low base in 2020 when there was a temporary shutdown of several automobile plants. Furthermore, other main manufacturing products, for instance electronic products, electrical appliances, metals, machinery and petro-chemicals stepped up. Moreover, agro-industry products rose on account of an increase in export of palm oil to India where palm oil import duty was decreased by the government in order to relieve palm oil shortage. Meanwhile, overall export of goods in terms of quantity built up by 15.3%, accelerating from 5.8% reduction in preceding year, while overall export prices increased by 5.8%.

Exports to major markets, for example japan, U.S.A., Australia, China and ASEAN increase, which indicated the improvement of global demand, as a result of Covid-19 vaccination, a relief of Covid-19 restriction and stimulus packages performed by governments of trading partners.

Service receipts at current market prices posted the value at 814,712 million baht, shrank by 15.6%. This was principally resulted from the extremely low number of tourists, due to lockdowns and international travel restrictions in preventing the spread of COVID-19 disease. Consequently, travel and transportation receipts uncommonly decreased. On the contrary, other business services still expanded.

Imports of goods and services

Imports of goods and services increased

Imports of goods and services at current market prices in 2021 revealed the value of 9,474,506 million baht, increased by 30.6%, from a 14.4% decrease in 2020. This upturn was originated from both import of goods and service payments.

Merchandise imports at current market prices recorded the value of 7,388,835 million baht, scaled up by 27.0%, comparing to a decrease of 13.3% in 2020. The imports of consumer goods expanded principally by soaring households' purchasing power particularly in food products. Furthermore, mobile phones imports also grew up in accordance with work from home lifestyle. An increase in manufacturing production especially in export-oriented industries resulted in the expansion of raw material and intermediate goods imports, particularly in vehicles parts, integrated circuits, metal and fuel. Capital goods import increased especially for machineries, in line with a rise in investment in both industrial machinery and office equipment. As a result, overall import of goods in terms of quantity, rose by 18.2%, uplifting from a 10.6% fall in 2020, while overall prices of import goods present rose by 7.5%.

Service payments at current market prices showed the value of 2,085,671 million baht, rose by 45.5%. This was mainly due to expansion of freight payment, in line with increased world's freight prices. The value of other business service payment also increased. On the contrary, measures for preventing the spread of COVID-19 still resulted in international transportation restriction, which brought about lower travel payments.

Negligible surplus in goods and services balance. Current accounts deficit.

Trade and services balance and current account

Trade and services balance at current market prices registered a surplus of 5,261 million baht, lower than 812,831 million baht surplus in 2020. Trade balance showed a surplus of 1,276,220 million baht which was less than a surplus of 1,281,270 million baht in preceding year. While, service balance presented a deficit of 1,270,959 million baht, worse than a deficit of baht 468,439 million in the previous year. Primary income posted a deficit of 576,341 million baht, compared to a deficit of baht 343,616 million in prior year. Secondary income presented a surplus value of 238,077 million baht, larger than a surplus in the previous year. Ultimately, current account, comprising trade and services balance, primary income, and secondary income, registered a deficit of 333,003 million baht, from a surplus of 658,576 million baht in 2020.



Exchange rate presented an average value at 32.0 Thai Baht per U.S. Dollar in 2021, depreciating from 31.3 Thai Baht per U.S. Dollar in 2020.

National income and savings

National income

Gross National Income in 2021 recorded a value at 15,590,257 million baht, rose by 1.8%, improved from a 5.8% decline in 2020. Compensation of employees which accounted for 32.5% of gross national income, expanded by 1.1%. Return on capital, land, and entrepreneurship which comprised 38.8% of gross national income, increased by 2.7%, principally due to expansion in net return on income from property and return on entrepreneurship, grew up by 4.0% and 2.5%, respectively. In contrast, taxes on production and imports less subsidies dropped by 0.4%, improving from a 14.4% decrease in the previous year. Furthermore, consumption of fixed capital increased by 2.2%.

Compensation of employees

Compensation of employees expanded by 1.1%, rebound from 3.2% reduction in 2020.

Compensation of employees or return on labor in 2021 presented a value at 5,059,533 million baht which is equivalent to 32.5% of gross national income (GNI), increased by 1.1%, from a 3.2% contraction in 2020. Compensation of employees in public sector increased by 2.1%, accelerated from a growth rate of 0.9% in the previous year. Compensation of employees in private sector grew by 0.5%, compared to a 5.5% drop in prior year. Compensation of employees can be divided into (1) wages and salaries increased by 0.9% and (2) employer's contribution in social security fund and other welfare, rose by 2.3%. Moreover, minimum wage in 2021 remained intact, while salaries in the government sector increased as usual without special salary account adjustment. Labor force survey by the National Statistical Office (NSO) in 2021 indicated that total employed persons slightly increased by 0.2%. Number of employed persons with employee status decreased by 4.0%. Public employees built up by 0.9% while private employees, 79.8% proportion of total employees, declined by 5.2%. However, the number of insurers under M33 increased by 0.1%, compared to a 4.8% drop in 2020.

Private sector and public sector compensation of employees

Public compensation of employees, 37.4% of total compensation of employees, increased by 2.1%, accelerating from a 0.9% rise in the preceding year. Compensation of employees of government officers stepped up by 2.8%, while compensation of employees of state enterprises decreased by 2.4%. Compensation of employees of private sector (net compensation of employees from abroad), include 63.8% share of total compensation of employees, slightly grew by the rate of 0.5%, compared to a 5.5% fall in 2020.

Compensation of employees by economic activities

Compensation of employees in the agricultural sector presented a value at 217,015 million baht, accounted for 4.3% of total compensation of employees, scaled up by 4.3%, rebounded from a 0.2% drop in 2020. This increment was from the expansion of planting area, particularly in paddy field, and an increase in overall agricultural product value. In addition, average annual precipitation was also higher than previous year.

Compensation of employees in the non-agricultural sector recorded a value at 4,901,620 million baht, 96.9% of total compensation of employees, increased by 0.7%, improved from a 3.4% drop in 2020. The expansion can be observed from both industrial and service sectors.

Compensation of employees in the industrial sector, 28.4% of total compensation of employees, expanded by 1.2%, from a 5.3% decrease in 2020. The largest proportion in the industrial sector was from manufacturing which ascended by 1.1%, from a 4.6% reduction in 2020. Compensation of employees in mining and quarrying expanded by 9.9%, contrasted with a 11.1% decline in the preceding year. Compensation of employees in electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply together with water supply; sewerage, waste management, and remediation activities grew by 0.2%, and 5.2%, respectively.

Compensation of employees in the service sector, 68.5% share of total compensation of employees, increased by 0.5%, compared to a 2.6% fall in 2020. Compensation of employees in financial and insurance activities grew by 1.7%, improved from a drop of 2.1% in prior year. An improvement was from higher compensation of employees in financial service activities especially in commercial bank. In addition, activities auxiliary to financial service and insurance activities also expanded. On the contrary, compensation of employees in insurance activities descended. Compensation of employees in public administration and defence; compulsory social security activities, education activities, and human health and social work activities boosted by 2.7%, 2.3%, and 6.0%, respectively. The increase was from compensation of employees from public sector which constituted major shares in these activities. In contrast, compensation of employees in construction declined by 1.1%, from an increase of 0.8% in the previous year. Compensation of employees in accommodation and food service activities, transportation and storage activities, and wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles reduced by 16.0%, 5.6% and 0.4%, respectively. The downturn persisted from a fall of 33.8%, 17.7%, and 2.2% in prior year. Lastly, compensation of employees in other services activities dropped by 2.1%, continued from a 5.6% decrease in 2020.

*Net compensation of employees from the rest of the world*¹ recorded a deficit value at 59,102 million baht. Compensation of employees from the rest of the world registered at 36,369 million baht, which was less than 95,471 million baht of compensation of employees to the rest of the world.

Compensation of employees expanded in both agricultural and non-agricultural activities.

¹ For the coverage to be more complete, the Bank of Thailand has revised its compilation method of compensation of employees from (to) rest of the world in 2020.

Returns on land, capital, and entrepreneurs

Net return on land, capital, and entrepreneurship valued at 6,053,155 million baht which was equivalent to 38.8% of gross national income, grew by 2.7%, accelerating from a decline of 9.3% in 2020.

Income from farming and households and non-profit institutions serving households (NPISHs): valued at 2,976,431 million baht, accounted for 19.1% of gross national income, decreased by 4.0%, improved from a 9.3% reduction in 2020. Income from farms rose by 3.1%, from a 0.3% contraction in the preceding year. Such an improvement was primarily due to an increase in quantities of agricultural products in particular; rice, sugar cane, cassava, and palm oil, together with a rise in overall agricultural products' prices. Average annual precipitation was also higher than the previous year which enhanced production of main crops. Furthermore, other mixed income decreased from the preceding year as economy was still gradually recovering from COVID-19 pandemic, yet at lower rate of contraction.

Income from entrepreneurship or profit of corporations recorded a value at 2,332,781 million baht, rose by 12.0%, the increments were from both net saving of private corporations and state enterprises.

Net income from property of households and non-profit institutions serving households (NPISHs) valued at 753,659 million baht, expanded by 2.7%, from a 6.5% drop in 2020, resulting from rate of growth of property income receipt which was higher than that of property income payment.

Households and NPISHs property income receipt posted a value at 1,108,564 million baht, increased by 2.0%, from a 5.4% fall in 2020. This was mainly due to increased dividend which was a main property income, at the growth rate of 10.4% recovering from a 8.6% decline in 2020. Households and NPISHs dividend receipt increased in all categories; for example, cooperatives, public corporations, private commercial banks, listed companies in Stock Exchange of Thailand, and private corporations. This was partly contributed by an improvement of profits from listed companies, resulting in higher dividend payout per share in several sectors. Moreover, land rent for agricultural area also increased. On the contrary, both investment income disbursements and interest income decreased at the rate of 4.5% and 11.4%, respectively. The contraction resulted from interest receipt from banks shrinking by 13.8%, which mainly contributed by a 32.2% decline of commercial banks' interest. In addition, interest receipts from Government Saving Bank, Government Housing Bank, and Bank for Agriculture and Agricultural Cooperatives also diminished. Lower Interest income was in line with lower average interest rate, coupled with a decrease in deposit of households and NPISHs. On the other hand, government bond interest receipt still expanded.

Households and NPISHs property income payment posted a value at 354,905 million baht which rose by 0.6%, from a 3.2% reduction in 2020. A rise was mainly from interest payment which was a principal property income payment item, expanded by 0.3%, contrasted with a 4.9% decline from the previous year. Interest paid to commercial banks decreased due to a slowdown in consumer loan amount (loan for land, loan for dwelling and real estate, and loan for working abroad are excluded). In addition, interest on loan from life insurance policy, credit card interest, and interest paid to pawnshop diminished. In contrast, Interest paid to cooperatives, mortgage interest, and land rent for agricultural area slightly increased.

General government income from property increased by 14.0%, accelerating from a 19.4% drop in 2020. Income from dividends rose by 26.8%, comprised of dividends received from income of service branch; namely, the Electricity Generating Authority of Thailand (EGAT), the Provincial Electricity Authority (PEA), and the Metropolitan Electricity Authority (MEA). This also included income of special branch of state enterprises; namely, Government Savings Bank, and Government Housing Bank, and the other dividend income. In contrast, interest received dropped by 7.8% which was partly a reduction of deposit interest received from financial institutions. Additionally, a 13.0% decrease in rental income was a result of a fall in real estate rental fee.

Saving and saving - investment gap

Gross saving posted a value at 4,295,079 million baht, decreased by 1.9%, returned from a 15.9% decline in 2020. Net saving valued at 1,381,291 million baht, dropped by 3.9%, from a 41.1% fall in the previous year. This was mainly due to a deficit of 1,325,481 million baht in government net saving which was consecutively the eight year in deficit and was deeper than a deficit of 994,676 million baht in 2020. However, net saving of public corporations and government enterprises greatly expanded by 30.4%, accelerated from a 28.3% reduction in the preceding year. In addition, both net saving of households and NPISHs, and private corporation also grew, leading to the growth rate of 9.7% for private sector, from a 3.3% fall in 2020. Consumption of fixed capital registered a value at 3,040,145 million baht, grew by 2.2%, continued from a 2.1% rise in 2020.

Private sector net savings

Private net savings comprised of households, non-profit institute serving households (NPISHs), private corporations, and cooperatives presented a value of 2,469,946 million baht, expanded by 9.7%, improved from a 3.3% decline in 2020.

1) Net savings of households and non-profit institutions serving households (NPISHs)

Net savings of households and NPISHs showed a value at 984,076 million baht presenting the rate of growth at 5.9%. The details are as follows.

Households and NPISHs income valued at 10,975,687 million baht which increased by 2.2%, from a drop of 1.3% in 2020. Primary income receipt which was the principal source of income, slightly fell by 0.3%, improved from a 5.5% drop in 2020, consisting of (1) compensation of employees, 46.1% share of households and NPISHs income, increased by 1.1%, (2) property income increased by 2.0%, from a 5.4% contraction in 2020, owing to higher dividends from private corporations, public corporations, and cooperatives (3) gross operating surplus and households mixed income which was equivalent to 29.2% of total income, dropped by 3.3%, from a 8.8% decline in 2020. After including compensation of employees, property income, and gross operating surplus and households mixed income, Primary income receivable decreased by 0.3%. Secondary income receipt comprised of social benefit other than social transfers in kind and other current transfers, increased by 19.6%, decelerated from a high growth rate in the previous year.

Primary and secondary income payment, inevitable expenses valued at 1,415,193 million baht, slightly increased by 0.1%, from a 5.3% decline in 2020. Property income payable which was main expense item, increased by 0.6%, from a 3.2% drop in prior year. Income taxes fell by 2.9%, from a 5.7% decrease in the previous year. Net social security contribution expanded by 1.1%, while transfer to government and rest of the world increased by 1.1%.

As a result, households and NPISHs disposable income rose by 2.5%, improved from a 0.7% reduction in 2020. Deducting by private final consumption expenditure which revealed growth rate at 1.8% lower than that of disposable income, and adjusting by the adjustment for the change in pension entitlement, net savings of households and NPISHs expanded by 5.9%, improved from a 0.4% contraction in 2020. In other words, per capita net savings of households and NPISHs which posted a value at 14,121 baht, increased by 5.6%.

2) Net savings of private corporations and cooperatives

Net savings of private corporations and cooperatives, which adjusted by the national accounts definition, valued at 1,485,870 million baht, expanded by 12.4%, from a drop of 5.2% in 2020. The increase was partly attributable to a rise in net saving of cooperatives presented value at 10,669 million baht with 8.8% growth rate, recovered from a 20.8% contraction in 2020. In addition, net savings of private corporations registered a value at 1,475,201 million baht, increased by 12.5%, contrasted with a 5.1% drop in 2020. An increase in net savings of private corporations was mainly from an improvement in profitability of listed companies in the Stock Exchange of Thailand (excluding private commercial banks and public corporations) and private commercial banks in accordance with the conceptual framework of national accounts. In addition, other private corporations and net international transfer also grew.

Public sector net savings

Public net savings consisted of net savings from general government, public corporations and government enterprises presented a deficit at 1,088,655 million baht. The deficit remained at a high level, continued from 2020. Government net savings recorded a deficit of 1,325,481 million baht, deeper than a deficit of 994,676 million baht in 2020. This succession of deficit started in 2014. In contrast, net savings of public corporations and government enterprises posted a surplus at 236,826 million baht, increased by 30.4%, from a 28.3% reduction in the preceding year.

1) General government net savings

General government net savings recorded the deficit of 1,325,481 million baht, increased from 994,676 million baht in 2020, considered to be the eighth consecutive year deficit. General government revenue amounted to 4,475,768 million baht, with an increase of 2.3%. The increase was from taxes, the primary income, which rose by 2.6%. Concurrently, government expenditure in non-investment items posted at 5,372,556 million baht, which grew by 8.9%. The value of adjustment for the change in pension entitlement posted at 103,726 million baht with a decrease of 12.1%, and consumption of fixed capital valued 324,967 million baht with an increase of 2.2%. Consequently, general government net saving dropped by 33.3%.

A rise in general government income in 2021 came mainly from increases in taxes on production and imports, property income from the government, current taxes on income and wealth, which could be categorized as follows:

Taxes on production and imports are the primary sources of revenues, 34.9% of total general government revenue, rose by 2.4%. The increase of tax revenue was mainly from

(1) Value Added Taxes (VAT) as a result of a rise of VAT from domestic consumption and imports. VAT from domestic consumption increased as economy recovered from contraction in 2020 while private consumption expenditure expanded. Sectors of which VAT collection expanded were wholesale and retail trade, and auto and bicycle repair sector; manufacturing sector which included manufacture of refined petroleum products, vegetable oils, pharmaceutical and medical chemical products, and other chemical products; mining and quarrying sector; transportation and storage sector; information and communication sector; financial and insurance activities sector; real estate sector; and administrative and support service activities sector. Sectors of which VAT collection contracted were manufacturing sector which included manufacture of outerwear, malt liquors and malt, and other communication equipment; construction sector; accommodation and food service activities sector; professional, scientific and technical activities sector; and arts, entertainment and recreation sector. For VAT on imports, the increase was a result of higher imports both in value and quantity, incorporating with depreciation of Thai Baht and an increase of Dubai crude oil price. (2) Import duties rose by imports of motor vehicle parts, passenger cars, pharmaceutical and medical goods, and cosmetics. (3) Specific business tax expanded in accordance with credit and commercial banks income (4) Liquor tax and Liquor Stamps increased in Q4/2021 on account of an ease of COVID-19 prevention measure (5) Motor vehicle taxes and fees (6) Real estate registration fee increased in line with condominiums sales (7) The income of 23.0% of the lottery sales and interest increased as a result of discontinuation of several lottery prize draws in 2020. (8) Automobile tax rose from entrepreneurs in car industry, free zone and imports. This was partly attributable to increased sales from new models launch. (9) Stamp duty increased from contracts and instruments.

Decreases in revenue included taxes from petroleum royalty, beer tax, and tobacco stamps corresponding to lower consumption. This was due to a shift away from working on-site, low frequency of transport services, and curfews. Moreover, the collection of building and land tax was still minimal resulting from reduced tax rates.

Property income from government and investment income payable on pension entitlements accounted for 5.2% of total government revenue, increased by 14.0%. The expansion was driven by the income from dividend with the share of 62.2% of total government property income, increased by 26.8%, partly contribute to dividend receivable, income from department of service, income of special public agencies, and the other dividend income. Meanwhile, other property income, namely investment income payable on pension entitlements

accounted for 20.4% of total government property income, rose by 4.1%, due to a rise of dividend received (child allowance and old-age program) from the social security fund. On the contrary, interest income which accounted for 15.3% of total government property income, fell by 7.8%, driven by a decline of interest rate for deposit of financial institutions. Moreover, rental income which was 2.1% of total government property income, decreased by 13.0%, attributed partly to a fall in real estate rental fees.

Current taxes on income, wealth, and etc., accounted for 21.8% of total government revenue, which increased by 2.9%. Tax revenue increment was mainly from corporate income tax, increased by 11.1% due partly to (1) Tax collection on forecasted net profit rose by 33.9%, following an improvement of first-half profit of listed companies and strengthening revenue department's tax collection (2) Withholding tax collection by the private sector increased by 21.5%, partly due to lower withholding tax rate from 3.0% to 1.5% starting in 2020, while the rates in 2021 were lower from 5.0% and 3.0% to 2.0% for the submission through e-Withholding Tax system. This incorporated with higher exports resulting in increased tax revenue. (3) Tax collection on service and profit distribution rose by 12.0% due to the recovery of companies' first-half net profit comparing with 2020. However, (4) Tax collection on net profit declined by 16.4%, from reduced companies' profits in 2020 resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic.

Personal income tax decreased by 3.3%, improved from a fall of 6.2% in 2020. This was partly due to tax collection on salary payments with a decline of 0.4%, compared to a 0.6% drop in 2020, following a recovery of employment and personal income. Withholding tax collection on salary payments of the private sector decreased by 0.4%, while that of public sector increased by 4.9%. Moreover, withholding tax collection on interest received increased by 1.1%. Meanwhile, withholding tax collections on service fees expanded by 8.6%. Withholding tax collection on real estate transactions rose by 9.5%.

Petroleum income tax collection decreased by 29.6% from lower petroleum sales and increased cost of decommission of oil rig.

Social contributions, which accounted for 13.3% of total government revenue, expanded by 1.1%. The gain was partly from an increase in employers' imputed social contributions; namely pension, perpetuity, and medical allowances. The employers' actual social contributions declined by a reduction of the rate of social security contribution as a remedy for insurers affected by Covid-19 pandemic. However, employers' actual social contributions towards government pension fund, local administration pension fund, and private teacher aid fund increased. Lastly, households' actual social contributions decreased in line with employers' actual contribution, resulting from reduction of the rates for contribution.

Miscellaneous current transfers receivable, which accounted for 1.3% of total government revenue, expanded by 6.0%. The expansion was mainly contributed by a rise in income from donations, indemnification, government lottery office's unclaimed lottery prize and interest, and fines for lawsuit settlement.

Interest paid, which accounted for 3.7% of total government expenditure, rose by 10.1%, contrasted with a fall of 2.3% in 2020. The increase was mainly from higher interest expenses from both domestic and foreign debt. For domestic debt, (1) government bond interest paid expanded by 8.3% in accordance with outstanding amounts especially from medium and long-term bond issuance in 2020 and 2021. (2) interest expense on promissory notes for financing deficit increased by 30.0%, while (3) interest expense on promissory notes for debt restructuring rose by 28.4%. In contrast, short-term loan interest of commercial banks declined by 25.6%, following a decrease in short-term interest rate. For foreign borrowings, interest expense highly increased.

Subsidies which accounted for 2.3% of total government expenditure, expanded by 50.4% as a result of (1) an increase in subsidy for HSD, Gasohol E20 and E85, and LPG of Fuel fund for alleviating the burden from living expense of the public from a hike in fuel prices, (2) subsidy of cane and sugar fund as a remedy for farmers and sugarcane mills, and (3) private education subsidy for the management of fundamental education.

Social benefits other than social transfers in kind, which accounted for 12.6% of total government expenditure, increased by 3.9%. The increase was from usual pension; perpetuity; monthly payment of perpetuities; medical expenses; allowance for the elderly; allowance for the disabled; child support grant; severance in case of old age pension and children's allowance, and government contributions for elderly and children's allowance. On the other hand, severance in case of unemployment and maternity decreased.

Miscellaneous current transfers payable, which accounted for 12.1% of total government expenditure, rose by 43.6%. The addition was from measures under the work plan to assist, remedy and compensate members of the public affected by the spread of the Coronavirus disease, including (1) "Rao Chana" aiming at reducing living expense of the public, (2) "M33 Rao Rak Kan" for supporting cost of living for insurers under Article 33, (3) an increase of purchasing power for State Welfare Card Holders, (4) a support of expenses for preschool, primary, secondary, vocational, and university education. (5) a relief of utilities expenses for electricity and water bills, (6), an increase of purchasing power for vulnerable groups, and (7) a relief for taxi drivers and motorcycle-taxi riders. There were also measures under the work plan to restore the economy and society as affected by the spread of the Coronavirus disease, including (1) "50-50 co-payment scheme" for supporting living expense of the public while increasing domestic consumption resulting higher business activities for small vendors, (2) "Rao Tiew Duay Kan", (3) "Tour Travel Thai" as a stimulus measure for domestic travel supporting tourism and related industries, and (4) "Ying Chai Ying Dai" stimulating domestic consumption. On the contrary, there were decreases in aids for victims of disasters, expenses for training outsiders, and cost of indemnification.

2) Net savings of public corporations and government enterprises

Net savings of public corporations and government enterprises valued at 236,826 million baht, increased by 30.4%, rebounded from a 28.3% drop in 2020. Public corporations and government enterprises net profit in business accounting figure of the 2021 calendar year showed a value at 650,458 million baht, rose by 156.5%. After consolidating with the adjustment according to national accounts definition, net profit of public corporations and government enterprises before profit allocation grew by 28.7%, accelerated from a fall of 32.9% in the previous year. After deducting by profit allocation, comprised of (1) dividend (2) profit delivered to government and (3) bonus payment from net profit, which increased by 26.2%, consequently, net savings of public corporations and government enterprises highly increased.

Considering net savings of state enterprises classified by organization establishment, public corporations net saving or performance in national accounts aspects posted at 48,532 million baht, increased by 107.1%, compared to a 73.2% decrease in 2020. Other state enterprises showed net savings of 188,294 million baht, rose by 19.0%, from a drop of 4.6% in 2020.

Saving – investment gap

Gross saving registered a value at 4,295,079 million baht, lessened by 1.9%, improved from a 15.9% contraction in 2020. Gross capital formation or investment registered at 4,628,082 million baht, increased by 24.5%, rebounded from a drop of 2.6% and 7.6% in 2019 and 2020, respectively. Such gross saving and investment brought about a deficit of saving-investment gap at 333,003 million baht, which was lower than a surplus of 658,576 million baht in 2020. The deficit was equivalent to 2.1% of GDP.

GDP Implicit Price Deflator

Overall price level increased by 1.7%.

GDP Implicit Price Deflator

GDP Implicit Price Deflator in 2021 increased by 1.7%, accelerating from a fall of 1.3% in 2020. Agricultural price deflator increased by 1.0%, slowing down from 2.7% in 2020. Moreover, non-agricultural price deflator expanded by 1.8%, in contrast to a decline of 1.6% in 2020 as a result of an increase in the deflators contributed chiefly to major activities, namely mining and quarrying; manufacturing; electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply; water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities; construction; transportation and storage; accommodation and food service; real estate activities; professional, scientific and technical activities; administrative and support services activities; public administration and defence; education; human health and social work activities; art, entertainment and recreation; and other service activities. Decreasing deflators were found in wholesale and retail trade; information and communication; and financial and insurance activities.

On the expenditure side, the overall price deflator rose by 1.2%, higher than a fall of 0.4% in 2020. Private consumption expenditure price deflator increased by 1.2%. Furthermore, the price deflator of government final consumption expenditure grew by 2.1%. The price deflator of investment also grew by 1.5%. For the external sector, the price deflator of exports goods and services expanded by 5.8%. Similarly, the price deflator imports of goods and services increased by 11.0%.

The consumer price index (CPI) in 2021 increased by 1.2%, compared to a fall of 0.8% in 2020. In particular, the producer price index (PPI) grew by 4.7%, compared to a fall of 1.8% in 2020.




