The National Income of Thailand covers 3 sides of approaches covering production, expenditure and income, which reflects the overall economic activities of accounting of the country.

The National Income of Thailand 2019 edition, following the International System of National Accounts (SNA), is compiled using the chained volume measures (CVMs) in measuring the real terms. In this 2019 edition, data are revised back to 2014 in accordance with the latest available primary data. This is to ensure the accuracy and consistency of the entire system of national accounts. Details of revisions are indicated in the revision note on the following pages.

On this occasion, we would like to express our gratitude to agencies and individuals who constantly supply basic data as well as contribute suggestions on enhancing compilation of the National Income of Thailand and other statistic accounts.

Revisions to the National Income of Thailand 2019 Edition

In this publication, the estimates have been revised back to 2014. The revisions are made based on the most recent data from the primary sources as follows:

1. Revising data

- Agricultural, forestry and fishing sector: revising agricultural figures back to 2017
 according to the Agricultural Statistics of Thailand from the Office of Agricultural
 Economics, and revising fishery production figures according to the Fisheries
 Statistics of Thailand 2018 and estimated data 2019 from the Department of
 Fisheries.
- Mining and quarrying sector: revising mineral production figures back to 2017 according to mineral production of Thailand from the Department of Primary Industries and Mines, and the Department of Mineral Fuels.
- Manufacturing sector: revising industrial production figures back to 2017 according to the Manufacturing Product Index (MPI) from the Office of Industrial Economics, Ministry of Industry; revising imports and exports of merchandise data from the Customs Department, and revising other manufacturing data in relevant sectors.
- Construction sector: revising the construction data of the public sector back to 2018.
- Accommodation and catering services; real estate, renting and business services sector; other community, social, personal services activities sector; professional activities, science, and academic activities sector; and other services activities sector: revising income for the Value Added Taxes assessment back to 2017.
- Human health and social work activities sector: revising the data back to 2017 according to the revised expenditure data of health services of general government and private health services.
- Financial and insurance activities sector; adding "National Savings Fund" back to 2014.
- Private final consumption expenditure: revising the data back to 2014 according to relevant data sources.
- General government consumption expenditure: revising the data back to 2016 according to relevant data sources.
- Gross fixed capital formation expenditure: revising the public construction data back to 2017 according to the latest report; revising the data of private construction according to the relevant data sources.
- Exports and imports of merchandise and services: revising the data back to 2018 according to the balance of payments of the Bank of Thailand.
- Updating other basic data according to the latest data available from original data sources.

2. Abbreviation

• In this publication, there are two letters assigned after data period (s) in tables (r and p). Letter "r" stands for "revised" representing revision figures based on most recent data, coverage, and compilation methodology. And letter "p" stands for "preliminary" annual figure, which is subject to revisions in the next series of publication.

Executive Summary

The Thai economy in 2019, measured by the Gross Domestic Product (GDP), increased by 2.3%, compared to a rise of 4.2% in 2018. The deceleration was from non-agricultural production, especially the manufacturing, which decreased as exports of goods decreased due to the stagnant international trade conditions and the intensity of the China-United States trade war, as well as the slowdown in domestic demand. Moreover, the service sectors showed decelerated growth in line with the deceleration in the production and the number of foreign tourists.

Production increased by 2.3% as the manufacturing sector decreased by 0.7%, in contrast to a rise of 3.4% in 2018, due to lower export-oriented production in motor vehicles; chemicals and chemical products; and computer, electronic and optical products in line with the international trade conditions. However, service activities increased by 3.9%, lower than in 2018. The deceleration resulted from the slowdown in accommodation and food services, transportation and storage, construction, and financial and insurance activities. Meanwhile, agriculture production decreased by 0.6%, owing mainly to lower the yields of the major crops, namely paddy, sugarcane, and maize in line with drought conditions, despite the expansion in cassava, chicken, cattle, and marine fishing.

Domestic demand showed decelerated growth. The deceleration contributed by final consumption expenditure and investment of the public sector and the private sector. Household expenditure grew by 4.0%, lower than 4.6% in 2018, due to lessened household income in line with slowdown domestic economic conditions which caused households cautious their spending. General government final consumption expenditure increased by 1.7%, compared to 2.6% in 2018. Gross fixed capital formation expanded by 2.0%, compared to 3.8% in 2018. In particular, both public and private investment showed slowdown growth, both construction, and machinery and equipment investment. For the external sector, exports and imports of goods and services dropped by 3.0%, and 5.2%, respectively.

National income in 2019 posted a value of 16,275,574 million baht, which rose by 4.5%. Sources of income were from a return to labor with a value of 5,165,494 million baht or a 2.4% rise. Moreover, a return to capital, land, and operation valued at 6,549,690 million baht, increased by 7.0%. Taxes on production and import less subsidies valued at 1,651,922 million baht, increased by 1.0%. Consumption of fixed capital valued at 2,911,468 million baht, increased by 4.9%. In per capita terms, national income per capita in 2019 was 234,806 baht, rising from 225,384 baht in 2018. Disposable income per capita was 132,321 baht and consumption expenditure per capita was 121,272 baht. Consequently, per capita personal savings valued at 13,280 baht in 2019.

For overall economic stability, recently gross saving increased by 3.1%, accelerating from 0.2% in 2018, whereas gross investment decreased by 2.7%. Consequently, the saving-investment gap (equivalent to current account) postulated a surplus with the value of 1,179,732 million baht, accounting for 7.0% of GDP. However, it was higher than a surplus of 912,130 million baht in 2018.

GDP implicit price deflator expanded by 0.9%, compared to 1.4% in 2018. The slow expansion contributed from the non-agricultural price index with a rise of 0.7%, lower than 1.8% in 2018. However, the agricultural price index accelerated by 3.3%, improving from a fall of 2.8% in 2018. Meanwhile, the consumer price index (CPI) rose by 0.7%, whereas the producer price index (PPI) dropped by 1.0%.

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
Thai Economy in 2019 National Accounts Perspectives

Overview

GDP in 2019 rose by 2.3%, compared to 4.2% in 2018, due to subsided external demand in line with the international trade conditions.

Gross Domestic Product of 2019 expanded by 2.3%, compared to a rise of 4.2% in 2018. The deceleration resulted from a slowdown in non-agricultural production. Moreover, agricultural production diminished. The non-agricultural production increased by 2.5%, slowing down from 4.0% in 2018 due mainly to a drop in the manufacturing sector in line with the subsided international trade conditions and the China-United States trade war. However, the service sector showed a slower pace of growth, contributed mainly by a slow increase in the number of foreign tourists and cautious spending of households, which resulted unfavorably in accommodation and food service activities, trade, construction, and transportation. The agricultural production decreased due mainly to a decline in main crop yields in response to the unfavorable weather conditions despite the expansion in fishing production.

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) in 2019 at current market prices valued at 16,898,086 million baht. After deducting 622,512 million baht of net factor income from the rest of the world, Gross National Income (GNI) registered at 16,275,574 million baht, with an expansion of 4.5%. While per capita NI was 234,806 baht higher than 225,384 baht in 2018 or a 4.2% growth.



Domestic Demand: slowed down from 2018, attributed to a 4.0% rise in private final consumption expenditure, a 1.7% rise in government final consumption expenditure, and a 2.0% rise in investment, compared to 4.6%, 2.6%, and 3.8% in 2018, respectively. Supporting factors were from 1) lower household income, in particular farm and non-farm income, which resulted in lower household purchasing power 2) cautious spending of households according to the anxiety in domestic economic conditions, together with the China-United States trade war 3) a slowdown in commercial banks' loans for personal consumption 4) the decrease in construction investment and machinery and equipment investment of both public and private sectors, and 5) no new investment in large-scale projects from state enterprises.

External Sector: exports of goods and services at current market prices decreased by 5.3%, in contrast to a rise of 2.8% in 2018. Such a decrease mainly contributed to a 7.1% drop in merchandise exports despite a 0.6% rise in service receipts. For the import side, imports of goods and services at current market prices dropped by 7.6%. In particular, merchandise imports fell by 9.3%, and service payments decreased by 0.5%. Trade and services balance at current market prices valued a surplus of 1,578,846 million baht, attributed to 826,931 million baht for a trade surplus, compared to a surplus of 720,436 million baht in 2018 and 751,915 million baht for service surplus. However, net factor income recorded at a deficit of 622,512 million baht. Net current transfers recorded a surplus of 223,398 million baht. Ultimately, a current account registered a surplus of 1,179,732 million baht in 2019, increasing from a surplus of 912,131 million baht in 2018.

National Income (NI) or income from factors of production in 2019 recorded the value of 16,275,574 million baht, expanded by 4.5%. The expansion was found from compensation of employees, accounting for 31.7% of NI, with a rise of 2.4%. Meanwhile, net property income and operating income, accounting for 40.2% of NI, grew by 7.0%. Moreover, consumption of fixed capital, and net primary income from the rest of the world, accounting for 17.9% and 10.1% of NI, increased by 4.9% and 1.0%, respectively.

Gross Domestic Savings in 2019 registered the value of 5,190,016 million baht, increasing by 3.1%, improving from a fall of 0.2% in 2018. Overall net savings valued at 2,447,048 million baht increased by 1.6%, decelerating from 3.9% in 2018, contributed by the fall of net private sector saving, despite the expansion in net public sector saving.

Overall Economic Stability: recently, saving showed expansion, with a rise of 3.1%. Meanwhile, overall investment decreased by 2.7%. As a result, the saving-investment gap (equivalent to current account surplus) registered a surplus of 1,179,732 million baht, accounting for 7.0% of gross domestic product, compared to a surplus of 912,130 million baht in 2018.

GDP Implicit Price Deflator increased by 0.9%, decelerating from 1.4% in 2018. The agricultural price index grew by 3.3%, in contrast to a fall of 2.8% in 2018. Meanwhile, the non-agricultural price index rose by 0.7%, decelerating from 1.8% in 2018. Consumer prices index (CPI) increased by 0.7%, while producer prices index (PPI) fell by 1.0%.

Gross Domestic Product

GDP in 2019 expanded by 2.3% compared to a rise of 4.2% in 2018.

Gross domestic product in 2019 expanded by 2.3%, slowing down from 4.2% in 2018, due mainly to the non-agricultural sector with a rise of 2.5%, lower than 4.0% in 2018. Moreover, the agricultural sector dropped by 0.6%. The deceleration of the non-agricultural production contributed from the industrial sector growth remaining unchanged. Additionally, the service sector slowed down.

Agricultural production declined by 0.6%, in contrast to an increase of 5.8% in 2018. The contraction resulted from lower yields of paddy, sugarcane, and maize due to drought conditions since the middle of 2019, although cassava yield expanded. Livestock production also increased, driven by the higher production of chicken and cattle despite a decrease in swine production. Additionally, fishing production also built up, driven by marine fishing, but freshwater fishing dropped.

Non-agricultural production increased by 2.5%. The industrial sector growth leveled off, compared to a rise of 2.9% in 2018. The deceleration mainly contributed by manufacturing with a contraction of 0.7%, in contrast to an expansion of 3.4% in 2018 due to lower production in major industries such as motor vehicles; petroleum refinery; and computer, electronic and optical products as a consequence of the China-United States trade war. Meanwhile, the service sector expanded by 3.9%, lower than 4.7% in 2018. The service sector with slowdown growth included construction; wholesale and retail trade, repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles; accommodation and food service; and financial and insurance activities. However, the service sectors with a continual expansion were information and communication; and arts, entertainment, and recreation activities.

Agricultural sector

Agricultural production decreased by 0.6% whilst the prices of the agricultural products improved.

Overall agricultural production decreased by 0.6%, in contrast to a rise of 5.8% in 2018. This decline was attributable to a 3.2% decrease in non-perennial crops, a 2.3% increase in perennial crops, a 0.7% increase in livestock production, a 1.8% decrease in agricultural service, a 3.3% decrease in forestry, and a 2.4% increase in fishing production. The prices of agricultural products increased by 3.3%, improving from a fall of 2.8% in 2018.

Agriculture, forestry and fishing


Total production decreased by 0.6%. Major production activities were as follows:

- Non-perennial crops decreased by 3.2%, due to the contraction in paddy, sugarcane, and maize with a fall of 5.1%, 16.0%, and 3.6%, respectively in line with drought conditions since the middle of 2019, although cassava yield expanded.
- **Perennial crops** increased by 2.3%. Yields of oil palm and other fruits increased by 7.8% and 3.4%, respectively, despite decreases in pineapple and rubber.
- **Livestock** increased by 0.7%, driven by higher production of chicken and cattle. Meanwhile, the production of swine decreased.
- **Agricultural services** decreased by 1.8% due to a decrease in planting and harvest services in line with reduced planting areas.
- **Forestry** decreased by 3.3% due to a contraction in firewood and charcoal production.
- **Fishing** increased by 2.4%, propelled by an expansion in marine fishery, however, freshwater fishery dropped.

Implicit prices of agricultural products grew by 3.3%, improving from a fall of 2.8% in 2018, resulting from rising prices of paddy, rubber, pineapple, other fruits, swine, and chicken. The prices of oil palm and sugarcane, however, declined.

Non-agricultural sector expanded by 2.5%.

Non-agricultural sector



Mining and quarrying

Mining and quarrying grew by 1.7%, improving from a drop of 2.9% in 2018. This expansion was attributable to a 2.1% increase in natural gas and crude oil production, in contrast to a fall of 3.0% in 2018. The natural gas and condensate production increased by 3.9%, improving from a fall of 1.1% in 2018, in line with higher production sources, namely Erawan group, Bongkot, South Bongkot, and Arthit. However, crude oil production decreased by 2.8%, compared to a decline of 8.4% in 2018, due to lower production sources, namely the Erawan group, Jasmine-Banyen, Bualuang and Nongyao. Moreover, the quarrying of stone, sand, and clay declined by 3.3%, in contrast to a rise of 7.3% in 2018.

Manufacturing

Manufacturing decreased by 0.7%, resulting from a contraction in export-oriented manufacturing products, namely motor vehicles; computer electronic and optical products. Meanwhile, production of chemical and chemical products, food products, basic pharmaceutical products and pharmaceutical preparations, and other transport equipment increased in response to domestic and external demand from trading partners.

Manufacturing with a contraction

- Food products declined by 2.6%, in contrast to a rise of 7.7% in 2018, due to lower manufacture of starch, sugar, processed and preserved meat, and processing and preserving of fruit and vegetables together with decelerations in the manufacture of milk and vegetable oil.
- **Cigarette** declined by 7.2%, driven by all type of products with an exception of pipe tobacco.
- **Textile** declined by 7.4%, continually decreasing from 2018. The contraction was found in almost all activities, except for the manufacture of fabric printing and silk, which showed increasing growth.
- Wearing apparel declined by 2.1%, in contrast to a rise of 4.1% in 2018. The manufacture of other wearing apparel such as cap and shawl declined, together with a slowdown in the manufacture of the jackets in response to external demand.
- **Paper and paper products** declined by 0.1%, led by the pulp, paper, and paperboard according to lower demand from downstream industry.
- **Printing** declined by 1.9% due to lower demand for several printings, including newspapers and magazines. Service activities related to printing also decreased.

- **Petroleum refinery** declined by 4.2% in response to domestic demand.
- **Rubber and plastic products** declined by 4.5%, continually decreasing from 2018, due to lower exports of the block rubber and rubber sheets together with contractions of plastic articles for the packaging of goods, and rubber tyres for vehicles.
- **Basic metals** declined by 9.3%, in contrast to a rise of 0.3% in 2018. The contraction resulted from lower production of all types of products in response to demand from downstream industries.
- **Machinery and equipment** declined by 0.5%, in contrast to a rise of 5.1% in 2018, due mainly to the decrease in agricultural machinery. Manufacture of industrial machinery slowed down despite a continual expansion in the manufacture of machinery for food.
- **Motor vehicles** declined by 5.1%, in contrast to a rise of 9.0% in 2018, in response to lower external demand and weakened domestic demand. The manufacture of parts and accessories for motor vehicles also declined.
- **Furniture** declined by 1.3%. The manufacture of metal furniture decreased despite a slight increase in wooden furniture in response to domestic demand.
- Other manufacturing declined by 0.1% due to lower external demand for gems and jewelry. Other manufacturing, including musical instruments, sporting goods, and medical equipment, also declined.

Manufacturing with an expansion

- **Beverages** increased by 9.7%, improving from a decrease of 4.0% in 2018, propelled by the manufacture of liquor, beer, soft drink and soda, and wine. The manufacture of energy drinks and drinking water slowed down.
- **Leather and other products** increased by 3.9%, compared to 5.0% in 2018. The manufacture of luggage and rubber footwear increased despite decreases in tanning and dressing of leather and leather footwear.
- **Wood and products of wood** increased by 2.1% due to higher demand for construction and wooden products.
- Chemical and chemical products increased by 1.6%, compared to 4.4% in 2018. This deceleration originated from the manufacture of fertilizer and the manufacture of cosmetics. Meanwhile, the petrochemical industry decreased in response to demand from downstream industries and external demand.
- **Basic pharmaceutical products and pharmaceutical preparation** increased by 8.2%, slowing down from 11.6% in 2018, in response to domestic demand.
- **Non-metallic mineral products** increased by 3.1%, owing to a continual expansion in concrete for use in construction.
- **Fabricated metal products** increased by 1.3%, decelerating from 2018. The expansion was attributable to decreases in the manufacture of structural metal products for construction, and cans, despite an increase in the manufacture of tanks.
- Computer, electronic and optical products increased by 0.2%, slowing down from 2018. The deceleration was seen in the manufacture of computer, telecommunication equipment, and electronic boards in line with external demand. The production of watches and clocks, however, increased.
- **Electrical equipment** increased by 4.8%. The manufacture of electrical equipment such as bulbs, electrical wire, and battery increased, despite decreases in domestic appliances, including electrical fan, refrigerator, washing machine, and electrical motor.
- Other transport equipment increased by 3.1%, continually rising from 2018, propelled by domestic and external demand for motorcycles.

Electricity, gas and air conditioning supply

Electricity, gas, and air conditioning supply grew by 4.6%, accelerating from 2.2% in 2018. The expansion was attributable to an increase in electric power generation with a growth of 5.0% in response to productions of the Electricity Generating Authority of Thailand (EGAT), the Metropolitan Electricity Authority (MEA), the Provincial Electricity Authority (PEA), and private power generation companies. In terms of electricity consumption by users, the expansion in electricity consumption was from residential customers, small and medium scale enterprises, and special enterprises. However, large-scale enterprises reduced electricity consumption. Gas separation increased by 1.3%, improving from a fall of 1.6% in 2018.

Water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities

Water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities grew by 5.8%, compared to 6.2% in 2018. Water supply; waste collection, and materials recovery grew by 4.9%; and 8.4%, compared to 3.4%; and 14.6% in 2018, respectively.

Construction

Construction increased by 1.6%, slowing down from 2.3% in 2018, mainly contributed by the deceleration in private sector construction, meanwhile public sector construction showed favorable expansion. The deceleration of private sector construction mostly caused by a slowdown in other construction, particularly from the on-going projects and no construction of large-scale new projects, while dwelling construction decreased. The expansion of public sector construction was driven by the construction of the general government, particularly the construction of roads and bridges. However, state enterprise construction showed a slower pace of growth due mainly to carrying out the construction of on-going projects, namely the Orange line project (Thailand Cultural Centre - Min Buri) of the Mass Rapid Transit Authority of Thailand, the construction of Electricity Power Transmission System of the Provincial Electricity Authority (PEA), the Construction of the Electricity Distribution Assets of the Metropolitan Electricity Authority (MEA), and Water Pipelines Construction Project of the Provincial Waterworks Authority (PWA).

Wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicle and motorcycles

Wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicle and motorcycles grew by 4.5%, lower than 6.4% in 2018, due mainly to a deceleration in sales of motor vehicles and motorcycles in response to domestic demand. Additionally, wholesale and retail trade also slowed down in line with household spending, the number of foreign tourists, meanwhile imported goods diminished.

Transportation and storage

Transportation and storage increased by 3.0%, lower than 4.0% in 2018. The deceleration contributed from land, water, and air transport services, which grew by 2.1%, 0.6%, and 0.1%, compared to 2.2%, 4.0%, and 0.3% in 2018, respectively. The slowdown in all transport modes was attributable to a deceleration in passenger transport in response to the number of foreign tourists and a slowdown in freight transport in line with agricultural and manufacturing production. Meanwhile, postal and courier activities grew by 17.7%, higher than 17.0% in 2018, in response to private operators' turnover.

Accommodation and food service activities

Accommodation and food service activities increased by 7.8%. Accommodation services grew by 6.7%, slowing down from 7.1% in 2018, resulting from the deceleration in the number of foreign tourists, which grew by 4.2%, lower than 7.3% in 2018. The number of East Asia tourists increased by 4.9%, which were mostly from China. Similarly, the number of tourists from America and South Asia increased, despite slowdowns from Europe, the Middle East, and Africa. Additionally, food and beverage services also expanded by 8.7%, propelled by an economic stimulus package from the government, Chim Shop Chai, in the last quarter of 2019.

Information and communication

Information and communication increased by 12.3%, higher than 8.4% in 2018, driven by telecommunication activities; and programming and broadcasting activities with a rise of 20.6%, and 0.9%. Computer programming and consultancy activities increased by 1.3%, following 4.1% in 2018. Motion picture, video and television programme activities; sound recording and music publishing activities also grew by 1.5%, compared to 2.2% in 2018.

Real estate activities

Real estate activities increased by 3.8%, compared to 5.4% in 2018. The expansion was attributable to an increase in real estate activities with own property for dwelling with a growth of 4.5%. Meanwhile, real estate broker activities declined by 2.3%, in contrast to a rise of 6.8% in 2018.

Financial and insurance activities

Financial and insurance activities increased by 2.2%, decelerating from 3.6% in 2018. The deceleration resulted from weakened performances of commercial banks, other depository institutions, and insurance. However, the businesses of other financial services generally declined. Furthermore, the fee-income and net interest margin on loans and deposits increased while the volume of credits and deposits decelerated in line with a slowdown performance in commercial banks. For insurances, life insurances slowed down, while non-life insurances maintained steady. According to a decreased performance in other financial services, the main factor was the contraction in the turnover in the Stock Exchange of Thailand and commission sales in security companies.

Professional, scientific and technical activities

Professional, scientific and technical activities increased by 1.7%, slowing down from 2.8% in 2018, due mainly to decelerations in activities of head offices; management consultancy, and activities of scientific research and development. Activities of advertising and market research, and activities of other professionals, scientific and technical increased.

Administrative and support services activities

Administrative and support services activities increased by 2.8%, lower than 3.2% in 2018, contributed by the slowdown in activities of renting of machinery and office equipment for construction and civil engineering; activities of renting of the personal motor vehicle; activities of other employment placement agencies, and travel agency and tour operator in line with the number of foreign tourists. However, activities of general cleaning of the building; activities of office administrative, office support and other business support; and activities of security and investigation expanded.

Education

Education increased by 1.2%, compared to 1.0% in 2018. Public education increased by 1.2%, meanwhile private education grew by 0.9%, in line with the number of students in formal vocational education, private universities, and special education.

Human health and social work activities

Human health and social work activities increased by 3.6%, slowing down from 4.8% in 2018. Human health activities grew by 2.7%, compared to 3.6% in 2018. Meanwhile, dental practice and social work activities slowed down.

Art, entertainment and recreation

Art, entertainment, and recreation increased by 14.4%, higher than 12.2% in 2018. This expansion was attributable to government lottery activities with a growth of 19.2%, moreover the favorable increases in sports activities; creative, arts and entertainment, and other amusement and recreation activities.

Other service activities

Other service activities increased by 3.0%, decelerating from 4.2% in 2018. The expansion was from personal service activities, which increased by 1.8%, slowing down from 5.0% in 2018. However, activities of membership organizations declined by 0.1%, in contrast to a rise of 3.9% in 2018, resulting from activities of business employers membership organizations, activities of trade unions, activities of religious organizations, and activities of political organizations. However, repair of computers, and personal and household goods rose by 5.0%, higher than 3.6% in 2018, propelled by repair of household appliances, and repair of other personal and household goods.

Expenditure on Gross Domestic Product


Private final consumption expenditure in 2019 increased by 4.0%.

Composition of private final consumption expenditure

Private final consumption expenditure (PFCE) in 2019 increased by 4.0%, slowing down from 4.6% in 2018.

Private final consumption expenditure decelerated from 2018, mainly contributed by household caution about their spending. The key factor was the economic slowdown, which caused the reduction in household income in both agricultural and non-agricultural sectors. Additionally, the consumer confidence index stood at 75.5%, lower than 80.9% in 2018. Meanwhile, personal credit loans from commercial banks continued to decline. Nevertheless, the factors which supported the expansion included the low level of the inflation rate and the unemployment rate. Furthermore, the government's welfare card program and other economic stimulus schemes to stimulate economic growth in the short term supported household's purchasing power at the end of the year.

Spending on durable goods, semi-durable goods and net services increased by 2.3%, 2.7% and 5.8%, compared to 10.0%, 4.0%, and 6.8% in 2018, respectively. Particularly, spending on durable goods decelerated, owing to a slowdown in spending on personal vehicles. Nonetheless, spending on non-durable goods rose by 3.0%, accelerating from 1.7% in 2018, in line with expenses on food and non-alcoholic beverages, alcoholic beverages and tobacco, and dwelling.



Private final consumption expenditure in the domestic market-excluding residents abroad grew by 3.7%, compared to 3.8% in 2018. It comprised household final consumption expenditure with a rise of 3.7%, and the final consumption expenditure of non-profit institutions serving households with a rise of 2.8%.

Private final consumption expenditure in the domestic market-excluding the expenditure of non-residents in the country and the expenditure of residents abroad expanded by 4.3%, compared to 4.4% in 2018. Meanwhile, private final consumption expenditure in the domestic market-including the expenditure of residents abroad declined by 3.2%, thus private final consumption expenditure expanded by 4.0%, slowing down from 4.6% in 2018.

Household consumption expenditure classified by goods and services items.

Food and non-alcoholic beverages increased by 2.5%, rising from 2.2% in 2018. Food items rose by 2.3%, compared to 2.1% in 2018, mainly contributed by the expansion in consumption of bread and cereals, meat, seafood, vegetables, sugar, and other food products. Spending on non-alcoholic beverages grew by 3.7%, accelerating from 3.1% in 2018, particularly spending on coffee, tea, and cocoa.

Alcoholic beverages and tobacco increased by 2.1%, accelerating from a fall of 1.9% in 2018. Alcoholic beverage consumption expanded by 3.5%, improving from a decline of 2.6% in 2018 due to increased sales volume in liquor, beer, and wine. Nevertheless, tobacco consumption decreased by 0.1%, improving from a decrease of 0.9% in 2018 due to sale volumes of cigarettes from the Tobacco Authority of Thailand.

Clothing and footwear increased by 1.8%, rising from 1.2% in 2018. Such expansion contributed from expenditures on clothing and footwear with rises of 1.7% and 2.3%, compared to 1.1% and 2.0% in 2018, respectively.

Housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels increased by 4.1%, compared to 3.2% in 2018. A rental for housing, electricity consumption, expenses on gases and other fuels, and household water supply consumption expanded by 7.2%, 6.5%, and 4.3%, compared to 6.1%, 1.5%, and 1.9% in 2018, respectively.

Furnishing, household equipment and routine maintenance of the house increased by 3.1%, slowing down from 5.1% in 2018 due to spending on household equipment and routine maintenance, household textiles, glassware, tableware and household utensils with a growth of 2.3%, 2.0%, and 3.0%, decelerating from 7.4%, 6.2%, and 8.1% in 2018, respectively. Moreover, the purchase of goods and services for routine household maintenance slightly decelerated from 2018.

Health increased by 5.1%, compared to 5.3% in 2018. An expenditure of outpatient services and hospital services grew by 3.0% and 4.4%, slowing down from 5.7% and 7.4% in 2018, respectively; whereas, expenses on other medical products rose by 6.5%, compared to 3.2% in 2018.

Transport increased by 1.2%, decelerating from 5.9% in 2018. A considerable deceleration resulted from spending on vehicle purchases with a rise of 0.5%, compared to 13.2% in 2018, in response to lower vehicle sales volume. Morever, expenses on personal transport equipment and transport services expanded by 1.1% and 2.0%, compared to 1.8% and 3.6% in 2018, respectively.

Communication increased by 3.4%, slowing down from 4.8% in 2018. Postal services grew by 1.9%, compared to 3.1% in 2018 in response to the entrepreneurs' turnover and a deceleration in spending on postal services. Furthermore, spending on telephone services slowed to 3.5%, compared to 5.1% in 2018. Consequently, the overall perspective of communication consumption showed a slower pace of growth.

Recreation and culture increased by 2.6%, decelerating from 4.8% in 2018. Spending on recreational and cultural services grew by 3.4%, decelerating from 8.2% in 2018. In addition, spending on newspapers and periodicals decreased by 1.3%, compared to a decline of 1.2% in 2018.

Education increased by 3.9%, slowing down from 5.1% in 2018 as a result of the slowdown in spending on higher education, including the decline in spending on pre-primary education, primary education, and secondary education.

Restaurants and hotels increased by 7.6%, accelerating from 4.3% in 2018 as a consequence of expenditure on restaurants and hotels services with a growth of 8.6% and 6.0%, compared to 5.8% and 2.0% in 2018, respectively .

Miscellaneous goods and services increased by 4.0%, decelerating from 5.7% in 2018. The slowdown was mainly attributable to the spending on personal effects, insurance, and other services with a growth of 5.4%, 1.2%, and 3.0%, compared to 10.7%, 8.2%, and 4.7% in 2018, respectively. However, spending on personal care grew by 6.7%, accelerating from 1.9% in 2018.

Non-profit institutions serving households consumption expenditure increased by 2.8%, compared to 1.1% in 2018 due to the expenditure of social protection and other services with a growth of 2.3% and 3.5%, accelerating from 1.3%, and 0.1% in 2018, respectively.

PFCE by durability of 4 factors

Private consumption expenditure classified by durability 4 categories

Durable goods increased by 2.3%, slowing down from 10.0% in 2018. The main factor was spending on vehicle purchases with a growth of 0.5%, compared to 13.2% in 2018. Moreover, expenses on furniture and furnishings, therapeutic appliances and equipment, and personal jewelry grew by 2.4%, 8.6%, and 3.6%, decelerating from 8.0%, 10.5%, and 10.2% in 2018, respectively.

Semi-durable goods increased by 2.7%, slowing down from 4.0% in 2018. The deceleration was from spending on other articles of clothing and clothing accessories, household textiles, and recording media with a rise of 4.8%, 2.0%, and 1.3%, decelerating from 10.4%, 6.2%, and 5.2% in 2018, respectively. Moreover, spending on spare parts and accessories for personal transport equipment grew by 2.0%, decelerating from 2.7% in 2018.

Non-durable goods increased by 3.0%, accelerating from 1.7% in 2018. The expansion was from the spending on the consumption of food items increased by 2.3%, compared to 2.1% in 2018. Furthermore, spending on alcoholic beverages and tobacco expanded by 2.1%, accelerating from a decline of 1.9% in 2018. Moreover, spending on other medical products grew by 6.3%, accelerating from 1.5% in 2018.

Services increased by 5.8%, slowing down from 6.8% in 2018. The sluggish growth was from the expense on transport services, medical services, and life insurance with rises of 2.0%, 3.5%, and 1.0%, lower than 3.6%, 7.4%, and 8.4% in 2018, respectively. Nevertheless, PFCE excluding the expenditure of non-residents in the country rose by 0.9%, compared to 1.5% in 2018, due mainly to the number of foreign tourists with slow expansion. Meanwhile, PFCE including the expenditure of residents abroad decreased by 3.2%. Therefore, domestic net services consumption for Thai residents in 2019 showed slow growth.

Composition of general government final consumption expenditure

General government final consumption expenditure in real terms increased by 1.7%.

General government final consumption expenditure at current market prices recorded a value of 2,734,485 million baht with an increase of 3.3%, lower than 4.9% in 2018. Thoroughly, government compensation of employees valued at 1,521,079 million baht, or a rise of 4.0%, lower than 4.3% in 2018. The deceleration was partially due to the falloff in wages and other personnel expenses. Moreover, purchases from enterprises and abroad recorded a value of 810,567 million baht, an increase of 2.0%, lower than 10.9% in 2018. Consumption of fixed capital recorded a value of 310,087 million baht with a 3.1% increase. Social transfers in kind – purchased market production recorded a value of 278,493 million baht with a rise of 4.1%.

By the functions of government, total general government final consumption at current market prices recorded a value of 2,734,485 million baht, consisting of education services with a 28.7% share of general government final consumption expenditure. The remains of government services by function comprised 17.9% share for health services, 14.1% share for general public services, 12.5% share for economic affair, 10.9% share for defence, 8.8% share for public order and safety, 7.1% share for remains of instance housing and community amenities, recreation, culture and religion, environmental, and social protection.

General government final consumption expenditure in real terms grew by 1.7%, due to a 1.5% rise in compensation of employees, 2.2% in purchases from enterprises and abroad, 3.2% in social transfers in kind – purchased market production, and 1.6% in consumption of fixed capital. Lastly, purchases by households and enterprises increased by 4.6%.

Gross capital formation

Gross capital formation consists of gross fixed capital formation and the change in inventories. In 2019, gross capital formation at current market prices recorded the value of 4,010,284 million baht, comprising 3,805,464 million baht of gross fixed capital formation and 204,820 million baht of the change in inventories.

Gross fixed capital formation in real terms grew by 2.0%, compared to 3.8% in 2018. The deceleration was due to the weakened investment of both private and public sectors. The private sector grew by 2.7%, slowing down from 4.1% in 2018, and the public sector expanded by 0.1%, lower than 2.8% in 2018.

Private Investment

Private investment at current market prices in 2019 recorded the value of 2,842,691 million baht, consisting of 571,075 million baht of private construction and 2,271,616 million baht of private machinery and equipment.

In real terms, the private investment increased by 2.7%, compared to 4.1% in 2018. This slowdown originated from construction and machinery and equipment.

Private construction at current market prices recorded the value of 571,075 million baht, consisting of 309,458 million baht of the residential building, 165,039 million baht of non-residential building, and 77,657 million baht of other building constructions. In real terms, private construction grew by 0.9%, slowing down from 4.9% in 2018, which can be described the contributors in each specific sectors as followed: the residential building with a fall of 2.9%, non-residential building with a rise of 3.2%, other construction with 10.7%, and cost of ownership transfer with 6.8%, compared to 3.6%, 1.4%, 19.7%, and 6.5% in 2018, consecutively.

Private investment in equipment and machinery at current market prices recorded the value of 2,271,616 million baht. In real terms, it increased by 3.1%, slowing down from 3.9% in 2018. The deceleration was from the slowdown in industrial machinery and vehicle equipment investment due to domestic production. Moreover, the number of newly-registered vehicles under the Motor Vehicle Act and the Land Transport Act diminished. On the other hand, the investment in office equipment and other vehicle were increasing, following the higher imports of office equipment and sky trains in 2019.

Public Investment

Public investment at current market prices recorded the value of 962,773 million baht, consisting of 726,206 million baht of construction and 236,567 million baht of machinery and equipment. In real terms, public investment grew by 0.1%, compared to 2.8% in 2018, resulting from a continual increase in construction despite a fall in machinery and equipment.

Public Investment

Public construction at current market prices recorded the value of 726,206 million baht, comprising 17,374 million baht of the residential building, 139,026 million baht of non-residential building, and 569,806 million baht of other constructions. In real terms, public construction grew by 2.3%, compared to 1.8% in 2018. The expansion came from a 1.0% rise in government construction, recovering from a fall of 1.8% in 2018. The increase was stimulated by the accelerated disbursement on the investment of land and building items. Concurrently, the state enterprise construction expanded by 4.7%, compared to 9.6% in 2018 due to carrying out the on-going projects, namely the Orange line project (Thailand Cultural Centre - Min Buri) of the Mass Rapid Transit Authority of Thailand, the Construction of Electricity Power Transmission System of the Provincial Electricity Authority (PEA), the Construction of the Electricity Distribution Assets of the Metropolitan Electricity Authority (MEA), and Water Pipelines Construction Project of the Provincial Waterworks Authority (PWA).

Public investment in machinery and equipment at current market prices recorded the value of 236,567 million baht. In real terms, it dropped by 6.1%, in contrast to 5.7% in 2018. Such contraction came from a reduction in government investment of machinery and equipment items; and no large-scale new projects from state enterprise investment.

In real terms, the investment in tangible fixed assets grew by 1.9%, compared to 3.8% in 2018, owing to the reduction of 2.2% in residential building construction, compared to 3.3% in 2018. Meanwhile, non-residential building construction rose by 2.6%, improving from 2.2% in 2018. Moreover, investment in machinery and equipment, and cultivated assets grew by 2.2%, and 12.6%, slowing down from 4.4%, and 21.6% in 2018, respectively.

Intangible fixed assets at current market prices recorded the value of 115,537 million baht, comprising 70,666 million baht in mineral exploration and 44,871 million baht in computer software. In real terms, the investment in intangible assets rose by 3.1%, improving from 1.7% in 2018, mainly contributed by a 9.6% expansion in the expense of mineral exploration, rising from 3.4% in 2018.

Costs of ownership transfer at current market prices recorded the value of 18,921 million baht. In real terms, it increased by 6.8%, compared to 6.5% in 2018.

Change in inventories

Change in inventories at current prices increased with the value of 204,820 million baht in 2019. The accumulated stock covered agricultural products and manufacturing products, while the stock level of rice, crude oil, and gold decreased. The increase in the stock level of agriculture products included paddy, rubber, and cassava. Meanwhile, the accumulated stock of manufacturing products included electronic components and boards, motor vehicles, and engines and turbines. In particular, the stock level of electronic components and boards has piled up due to the slowdown of partner countries' economies, especially, the United States of America, the European Union, and Japan. Besides, protectionist trade policies between the United States and China resulted in the contraction in the exports of electronic products. The stock of motor vehicles increased due to the deceleration in the exports, the decrease in domestic demands according to the domestic economic situation, along with the stringent measure of financial institutions in an auto loan approval. Meanwhile, the decline in the stock of manufacturing products covered plastics and synthetic rubber in primary forms, computers and peripheral equipment, and manufacture of coffee, tea and herb. The gold inventory decreased due to higher export in response to the rising price of gold in the world market.

External Sectors

Both exports of goods and services decreased.

Exports of goods and services

Exports of goods and services at current market prices in 2019 disclosed the value at 10,052,248 million baht, diminished by 5.3%, in contrast to a rise of 2.8% in 2018. The decrease was mainly contributed by lower export goods and a continual slowdown in the export receipt.

Merchandise exports at current market prices exposed the value at 7,534,817 million baht, fell by 7.1%, due to a decrease in exports of agriculture, fishery and manufacturing products. Agricultural products decreased, mainly resulting from a reduction in rice exports due to higher price than other export countries. Moreover, China, a high rice's stock country, offloaded tonnes of rice in African markets. Rubber exports dropped in line with lower demand from China, the largest importer. Additionally, rubber export quantity was limited due to implementation of rubber export restriction by the International Tripartite Rubber Council (Thailand, Indonesia and Malaysia). However, exports of fruits greatly expanded in response to higher demand in durians, longans, and mangosteens from China. Manufacturing products exports declined from the reduction in many major products. The decrease in refined fuels originated from lower exports to CLMV countries, major export market. Sluggish global electronic market led to declining in electronic products export. Furthermore, other major manufacturing products, for example, machinery, petro-chemical and vehicles also lessened. On the contrary, air-conditioner, one of the major manufacturing products, was principally boosted from exports to Vietnam and U.S.A markets. The increase was partly supported by the expansion in real estate activities in Vietnam, and higher demand from the U.S.A. Additionally, the acceleration of gold exports kept overall exports from deeper diminution level. Meanwhile, export quantity subtracted by 3.7%, in contrast to a rise of 3.8% in 2018, whereas export prices decreased by 3.6%.

Service receipts at current market prices valued at 2,517,431 million baht, expanded by 0.6%. The expansion resulted from travel, most principal service receipts, due to the rising number of foreign tourists. Furthermore, other business service weakened.

Imports of goods and services declined.

Imports of goods and services

Imports of goods and services at current market prices in 2019 presented the value of 8,473,402 million baht, dropped by 7.6%, in contrast to a rise of 9.2% in 2018. This contraction originated from the decline in both imports of goods and service receipts.

Merchandise imports at current market prices showed the value of 6,707,886 million baht, contracted by 9.3%, in contrast to a rise of 8.5% in 2018. Diminishing in consumer goods principally derived from non-durable goods especially animal and fishery products. A reduction in manufacturing production, especially in export-oriented industries resulted in lower raw material and intermediate goods imports, particularly in integrated circuits and computer parts. Moreover, crude oil import value also decreased in line with the lower global oil price. Capital goods import subtracted largely in machinery and communication equipment in accordance with the slowdown in machinery and equipment investment. Furthermore, the overall import quantity and import prices were also declined at a rate of 5.8%, and 3.7%, respectively.

Service payments at current market prices valued at 1,765,516 million baht, dropped by 0.5%. The contraction mainly contributed by lower freight payment, in line with the international trade situation. Moreover, the travel payment declined. On the other hand, other business service payment continually increased.

Higher surplus in trade and service balance. Surplus in current account.

Trade and services balance and current account

Trade and services balance at current market prices revealed a surplus of 1,578,846 million baht, larger than 1,446,473 million baht surplus in 2018. Trade balance registered a surplus of 826,931 million baht which was higher than a surplus of 720,436 million baht in 2018. Meanwhile, service balance presented a surplus of 751,915 million baht, better than a surplus of 726,037 million baht in 2018. Primary income posted a deficit of 622,512 million baht, better than a deficit of 793,104 million baht in 2018. Secondary income showed a surplus of 223,398 million baht, smaller than a surplus in 2018. Ultimately, current account, comprising trade balance, service balance, primary income and secondary income, registered a surplus of 1,179,732 million baht, higher than a surplus of 912,131 million baht in 2018.


Exchange rate

Exchange rate presented an average value at 31.0 Thai Baht per U.S. dollar in 2019, appreciating from 32.3 Thai Baht per U.S. dollar in 2018.

National income and savings

National income

Gross National Income in 2019 recorded a value at 16,275,574 million baht, expanded by 4.5%, lower than 5.3% in 2018. Compensation of employees, 31.7% of gross national income, rose by 2.4%. Return on capital, land, and entrepreneurship, 40.2% of gross national income, increased by 7.0%, mainly due to an acceleration in return on entrepreneurship. While net return on income from property decelerated. Moreover, taxes on production and imports less subsidies, and consumption of fixed capital increased by 1.0%, and 4.9%, respectively.

Compensation of employees

Compensation of employees grew up by 2.4%, slowing down from 3.9% in 2018.

Compensation of employees or return on labor in 2019 presented a value at 5,165,494 million baht, equivalence to 31.7% of Gross National Income (GNI), increased by 2.4%, slower than 3.9% in 2018. Compensation of employees in the public sector accelerated, while compensation of employees in the private sector decelerated. On the other hand, compensation of employees can be divided into 2 parts as follows: (1) wages and salaries increased by 1.5%, decelerated from 3.7% in 2018, and (2) employer's contribution in social security fund and other welfare rose by 8.5%. In 2019, no new minimum wage promulgation but new labor protection act (No. 7) B.E. 2562 (2019) were enforced new severance pay scheme which increased from 300 days (10 months) to 400 days (13.3 months) of wages for terminating an employee with an employment period of 20 years or more. While salaries in the government sector were increased as a normal pattern, special salary account adjustment was not applied. The labor force survey by the National Statistical Office (NSO) in 2019 indicated total employed persons dropped by 0.7%. The number of employed persons with employee status increased by 1.8%. Public employees fell by 0.9%, while private employees, 81.3% proportion of total employees, grew up by 2.4%.

Private and public compensation of employees

Public compensation of employees, 35.4% of total compensation of employees, increased by 4.7%, better than 3.7% in 2018. Compensation of employees of government officers and state enterprises increased by 4.0% and 8.2%, respectively. Compensation of employees of private sector (net compensation of employees from abroad included), 64.6% share of total compensation of employees, grew up at the rate of 1.2%, less than 4.0% in 2018. While compensation of employees classified by economic activities presented a slowing down direction in both agricultural and non-agricultural sectors with a slowdown in the industrial sector and an acceleration in the service sector.

Compensation of employees by economic activities

Compensation of employees in the agricultural sector presented a value at 208,587 million baht, 4.0% of total compensation of employees, increased by 2.9%, decelerating from 3.1% in 2018. This deceleration was not only originated from lower planting area, particularly in paddy, and slowdown in agricultural product value, but average precipitation also diminished.

Compensation of employees in the non-agricultural sector recorded a value at 5,032,229 million baht, 94.7% of total compensation of employees, increased by 4.0%, lower than 4.1% in 2018. This expansion can be observed from both industrial and services sectors.

Compensation of employees in the industrial sector, 29.0% of total compensation of employees, expanded by 2.0%, lower than 3.9% in 2018. The largest proportion in the industrial sector was manufacturing, which descended from 3.6% in 2018 to 1.5% in 2019. Compensation of employees in mining and quarrying slightly declined by 0.1%, worse than 6.1% in 2018. Compensation of employees in electricity, gas, steam, and air conditioning supply together with water supply; sewerage, waste management, and remediation activities grew up by 7.6% and 14.9%, respectively..

Compensation of employees in the service sector, 68.4% of total compensation of employees, lifted by 4.9%, better than 4.1% in 2018. Compensation of employees in information and communication activities, accommodation and food service activities, and transportation and storage activities boosted up by 9.9%, 9.5%, and 7.7%, respectively, derived by the expansion of production situation in these sectors. Compensation of employees in public administration and defence; compulsory social security, education, and human health and social work activities grew up by 3.9%, 3.7%, and 4.5%, compared to 4.0%, 4.8%, and 4.0% in 2018, respectively, which mainly resulted from an expansion in the government sector which was the largest proportion in each sector. Compensation of employees in financial and insurance activities improved from 4.5% in 2018 to 5.2% in 2019. Such an improvement originated from higher compensation of employees in financial service activities and activities auxiliary to financial service and insurance activities, especially in commercial banks, while insurance activities slightly slowed down. Moreover, compensation of employees in other services activities expanded by 4.6%, better than 3.3% in 2018.

Net compensation of employees from the rest of the world¹ recorded a deficit value at 75,322 million baht. Compensation of employees from the rest of the world registered at 36,434 million baht, less than 111,756 million baht of compensation of employees to the rest of the world.

Compensation of employees slowed down in both agricultural and non-agricultural sectors, especially in industrial sector despite an acceleration in service sector.

¹ For the coverage to be more complete, the Bank of Thailand has revised its compilation method of compensation of employees from (to) rest of the world in 2019.

Returns on land, capital, and entrepreneurs

Net return on land, capital, and entrepreneurship valued at 6,546,690 million baht, equivalence to 40.2% of gross national income, expanded by 7.0%, enhancing from 5.8% in 2018.

Income from farms and households and non-profit institutions serving households (NPISHs) or mixed income valued at 3,474,911 million baht, a 21.4% share of gross national income, increased by 8.8%, better than 5.9% in 2018. Income from farms expanded by 2.3%, slowing down from 3.2% in 2018. Such a deceleration was majorly due to lower agricultural product quantity, in particular, paddy, sugarcane, and vegetables, while overall agricultural product prices increased. Furthermore, other mixed income also posted as an acceleration trend with a growth of 10.9%.

Income from entrepreneurship or profit of corporations recorded the value at 2,321,029 million baht, which boosted up by 6.1%. Net savings of private corporations dropped, while the net savings of state enterprises drastically escalated.

Net income from property of households and non-profit institutions serving households (NPISHs) valued at 726,876 million baht, increased by 3.1%, less than 6.7% in 2018. The deceleration was mainly due to a slowdown in property income receipt, which stayed at a lower rate than property income payment.

Households and NPISHs property income receipt posted a value at 1,141,885 million baht, increased by 4.0%, less than 6.0% in 2018, on account of an increase in all receipt items. Income from interest receipts expanded by 6.4%, improving from 1.1% in 2018. Interest from banks expanded by 6.6%, on account of a 10.3% rise in interest from commercial banks in line with larger money deposit volume and a gradually increasing interest rate. In addition, other interest income continually expanded from 2018, especially a 16.0% rise in interest from cooperatives. Household dividends received from the business sector grew by 3.2%, decelerating from 8.1% in 2018, which is mainly attributed to the deceleration in dividends from private corporations. Rental income from the agricultural land, and other receipts expanded by 1.7%, and 4.4%, slowing down from 3.6% and 7.1% in 2018, respectively.

Households and NPISHs property income payment posted a value at 415,009 million baht, increased by 5.7%, higher than 4.8% in 2018. Such an increase mainly originated from interest payment, the main payment item, expanded by 7.2%, as a result of an increase in interest payment for banks, in keeping with a higher loan for consumption. However, the interest rate was slightly lower than the previous year. Moreover, interest payments for insurance policy loans and mortgage loans also increased. On the one hand, rent for the agricultural land decelerated.

General government income from property grew by 0.9%, decelerating from 7.9% in 2018. The income from rent, interest, and dividend, accounting for 80.6% of total general government income from property, showed no increase in growth after a rise of 8.6% in 2018. The zero growth mainly resulted from a 4.8% rise in dividend, lower than 12.2% in 2018. Additionally, interest income grew by 4.3%, improving from a decline of 4.2% in 2018. This increase was offset by a 49.4% decrease in rental income. The components can be described in detail as follows the increase in the dividend received from the state enterprises as primary sources were mostly from the department of telecommunication and transportation, and the department of commercial and service. Next, the considerable improvement of interest income originated from increases in loan interest of Education Loan Funds and deposit interest rates from financial institutions. Lastly, the decrease in rental income resulted from a fall in the real estate rental fee.

Saving and saving - investment gap

Gross saving posted a value at 5,190,016 million baht, increased by 3.1%, rebounding from a 0.2% fall in 2018. Net saving amounted to 2,447,048 million baht, increased by 1.6%, lower than 3.9% in 2018. Such deceleration was mainly due to a 0.9% reduction in private net saving, from a 2.4% rise in 2018. The decline in private net saving contributed from private corporations; meanwhile, net savings of households and NPISHs grew up at a gradual rate. Net savings of the public sector increased by 50.0%, continually rising from 42.2% in 2018. The high expansion was due to a rise in the net saving of public corporations and government enterprises; meanwhile, government net saving posted a deficit of 173,941 million baht, deeper than a deficit of 84,560 million baht in 2018, which showed the sixth consecutive year deficit. Consumption of fixed capital registered a value at 2,911,468 million baht, grew by 4.9%, lower than 5.5% in 2018.

Private net savings

Private net savings comprising Households and NPISHs, private corporations, and cooperatives presented the value of 2,267,951 million baht, subtracted by 0.9%, worse than a rise of 2.4% in 2018.

1) Net savings of Households and Non-profit Institutions Serving Households (NPISHs)

Net savings of Households and NPISHs showed value at 920,495 million baht, grew by 0.4%, decelerating from 2.1% in 2018. The slowdown was due to receipts expanding at a lower rate than payments, which led to disposable income slowing down from 2018. Meanwhile, private final consumption expenditure grew at a higher rate than disposable income; hence net savings of households and NPISHs revealed low rate expansion.

Households and NPISHs income valued at 10,717,139 million baht, increasing by 5.5%, due to increases in both primary and secondary income receivable. Primary income receivable, the principal source of income, increased by 4.8%, consists of (1) compensation of employees, 48.2% share of households and NPISHs income, increased by 2.4%, (2) Households and NPISHs mixed income, a 32.4% share of total income expanded by 8.8%, (3) property income, 10.7% of total income, increased by 4.0%, smaller than 6.0% in 2018, owing to a slowdown in the dividend. Meanwhile, interest from banks grew up in line with larger money deposit volume and higher interest rates. Secondary income receivable comprises social benefits other than social transfers in kind, and other current transfers grew by 14.4%.

Primary and secondary income payment, inevitable expenses valued at 1,545,291 million baht, increased by 11.8%, accelerating from 5.4% in 2018. Property income payable rose by 5.7%, enhancing from 4.8% in 2018. Income taxes grew by 9.1%, accelerated from 4.4% in 2018. Net social security contribution grew by 7.9%. While the transfer to government and the rest of the world also increased by 60.6%, highly rising from 10.1% in 2018.

Households and NPISHs disposable income increased by 4.5%, smaller than 5.3% in 2018. After deducted by private final consumption expenditure, which grew up at a higher rate than disposable income, and adjusted by the adjustment for the change in pension entitlement, contributed to net savings of households and NPISHs with an expansion of 0.4%. In other words, net savings per capita of Households and NPISHs posted a value at 13,280 baht, slightly increased by 0.1%.

2) Net savings of private corporations and cooperatives

Net savings of private corporations and cooperatives, which adjusted by national accounts definition, valued at 1,347,456 million baht, contracted at the rate of 1.8%, in contrast to a rise of 2.6% in 2018. Net savings of private corporations registered at 1,336,163 million baht, decreased by 1.8%, in contrast to a 2.7% rise in 2018, mainly originated from a reduction of profits of listed companies in the Stock Exchange of Thailand (private commercial banks and public corporations excluded) and commercial banks in accordance with the conceptual framework of national accounts. However, other private corporations' profits increased at a slower rate. On the contrary, a net saving of cooperatives presented a value of 11,293 million baht, increased by 1.8%, rebounding from a 1.9% subtraction in 2018.

Net saving

Public net savings

Public net savings, consisting of the general government, public corporations, and government enterprises, presented a surplus at 179,097 million baht, escalated by 50.0%. Government net savings recorded a deficit at 173,941 million baht, deeper than a deficit of 84,560 million baht in 2018. Net savings of public corporations and government enterprises posted a surplus at 353,038 million baht, which increased by 73.1%, in contrast to a fall of 13.9% in 2018.

1) General government net savings

General government net savings recorded the 173,941 million baht deficit, higher than the 84,560 million baht deficit in 2018, considered the sixth consecutive year deficit. General government revenue amounted to 4,752,586 million baht, an increase of 2.1% in 2019, compared to 5.7% in 2018. The increase was from taxes, the primary income, which grew by 1.1%. Meanwhile, government expenditure in non-investment items posted at 4,461,822 million baht, which grew by 4.0%, the same rate as 2018. In the meantime, the value of adjustment for the change in pension entitlement valued 154,618 million baht or an increase of 4.3%, and consumption of fixed capital valued 310,387 million baht or an increase of 3.1%. Consequently, general government net savings decreased by 105.7% or an expansion in a saving deficit.

An increase in general government income in 2019 came mainly from increases in taxes on production and imports, property income from the government, current taxes on income and wealth, which enabled to categorize as follows:

Taxes on production and imports are the primary source of revenues, 36.1% of total general government revenue, increased by 0.1% due to the higher government tax collection. Expansion of tax revenue was from (1) Beer tax as all business operators have increased the amount of tax payment since the beginning of 2019 after the enforcement of the Excise Act B.E 2560 in 2018. (2) Liquor tax and Liquor Stamps as domestic business operators have developed their products and launched new sizes of blended liquor in September, together with the refinement of liquor packages to more modern and more premiums. Consequently, the business operators have made higher liquor tax payments, particularly for white wine and blended liquor. (3) Excise tax on imports. A deceleration in tax revenue was from (1) The income of 23.0 percent of the lottery sales and interest. (2) Non-alcoholic beverage tax. (3) Tobacco stamps as the tobacco consumption declined by 7.7% per year (according to the National Statistical Office's report) and a rising proportion of pipe tobacco blends consumption. (4) Petroleum royalty.

Declining in tax collection was (1) Value Added Taxes (VAT) as a result of a decrease in Value Added Taxes on imports. The main reason is that the United States-China trade war caused adversely the total value of imports, following the appreciation of Thai baht, a 4.0% decline in Dubai crude oil price, and a decrease in the total value of crude oil import. In terms of Value Added Tax on consumption, it increased by 1.8%. Sectors of which VAT collection decreased were electricity, gas, steam, and air conditioning supply; manufacture of motor vehicles, trailers, and semi-trailers; financial and insurance activities; telecommunications; and accommodation and food service activities. Sectors of which VAT collection expanded were the manufacture of beverages; activities of head offices, management consultancy activities; real estate activities; construction of warehouse and support activities for transportation; and retail trade. (2) Oil and petroleum products taxes due to the government's alternative energy consumption promotion which resulted in the missing of diesel tax collection, following the temporary shutdown for maintenance of petroleum refinery. (3) Import duties due partly to a decline in imports. (4) Motor vehicle tax due to the drop in the agricultural product prices despite motor vehicle entrepreneurs launching new models into the market and sale promotion, following the slowdown in the domestic economy. (5) Specific business tax.

Property income from government and investment income payable on pension entitlements, accounted for 5.4% of total government revenue, which increased by 0.9%. The expansion was driven by the income from dividend with the share of 59.8% of total government property income, increased by 4.8%, partly contribute to income from dividend of public agencies, namely department of transportation and communication; department of commerce and services. Meanwhile, other property income, namely investment income payable on pension entitlements, increased by 4.6%, slowing down from 2018 due to

a deceleration in the dividend received (child allowance and old-age program) from the social security fund. Interest income grew by 4.3%, driven by the rising interest of student loans and deposits of financial institutions. However, rental income decreased by 49.4%, attributed partly to a fall in real estate rental fees.

Current taxes on income, wealth, and etc., accounted for 22.7% of total government revenue, which increased by 2.8%, lower than in 2018. Tax revenue expansion was from personal income tax, which increased by 10.1% due to tax collection on salary payments with a rise of 6.6% in line with compensation of employees of the private sector with 6.7% and withholding tax collection on salary payments of the public sector with 4.6%. Besides, withholding tax collection on interest payments increased by 6.1%. Withholding tax collection on service fees increased by 6.2%. However, withholding tax collection on real estate transactions decreased by 25.0% due to a decline in the total commercial real estate sales. Moreover, tax collection from corporate income tax increased by 2.5%, lower than 2018, due partly to (1) Tax collection on net profit and forecasted net profit increased by 5.0%, lower than 2018. The deceleration resulted mainly from the tax collection on Corporate Income Tax in 2018, following a decline in the tax collection on forecasted net profit as the slowdown economic condition in the first mid-year of 2019. (2) Withholding tax collection by the private sector increased by 2.1%, in accordance with the Manufacturing Production Index (MPI). (3) Tax collection on income distribution abroad increased by 0.5% due to the deceleration in companies' net profit. Meanwhile, petroleum income tax collection increased by 6.4%. The high growth of tax collection was mainly contributed by the transfer of petroleum concession among petroleum exploration and production entrepreneurs, an elevated efficiency in tax collection, and hiking oil price.

Social contributions, which accounted for 13.0% of total government revenue, expanded by 7.9%, rising from 5.4% in 2018. The expansion was partly from an increase in contributions to the local government pension fund and the Bangkok government pension fund. The contributions to social security funds of both employers and employees slowed down in line with a lower number of insured persons. Meanwhile, the contribution rate of both employers and employees remained the same rate as the previous year.

Miscellaneous current transfers receivable, which accounted for 1.1% of total government revenue, decreased by 6.8%. The decrease was mainly contributed by a fall in income from operating subsidies, penalties, traffic fines.

Interest paid, which accounted for 4.1% of total government expenditure, increased by 4.6%, lower than 4.9% in 2018. The deceleration was mainly from government bond yield. Short-term and long-term government bond yields adjusted downward. Short-term government bond yield declined due to higher demand after the investors have more liquidity from the maturity of bond redemption. However, long-term bond yield adjusted downward after raising the weight of Thai government bonds in JP Morgan Global Government Bond Index; consequently, it triggered higher demand for long-term government bonds. The short-term loan interest of commercial banks increased remarkably by 181.4%, driven by the expansion of commercial banks' short-term loans. Promissory notes for financing deficit increased by 50.0%. Interest paid decreased covered (1) Interest expenses on promissory notes for debt restructuring decreased by 18.8%. (2) Interest paid of international debt decreased by 2.2%.

Subsidies, which accounted for 1.4% of total government expenditure, decreased by 19.4% as a result of a decrease in subsidized LPG and Gasohol E20 from Fuel fund, and private education subsidy for the management of basic education.

Social benefits other than social transfers in kind, which accounted for 12.9% of total government expenditure, increased by 9.4%, lower than 14.4% in 2018. The deceleration originated from the increase in a usual pension; perpetuity; monthly payment of perpetuities; outpatient medical expenses - state hospital for legal pensioners; social benefits in case of old age pension, child allowance, and the unemployed; allowance for the elderly and the disabled; the project on strengthening the grassroots economy according to Pracharat policy; and

the stimulus measures to raise income for low-income earners under the statesponsored subsidy and welfare scheme. Meanwhile, severance paid; outpatient medical expenses - state hospital for legal eligibility, except for pensioners; and a monthly allowance for pensioners showed the decreased value.

Miscellaneous current transfers payable, which accounted for 3.0% of total government expenditure, increased significantly by 22.7%, improving from 1.1% in 2018. The acceleration was from an expansion of transfers expenses for operations - non-profit organizations, household sector, and other business agencies; the project on strengthening the grassroots economy under Pracharat policy; and the stimulus measures to raise income for low-income earners under Government Welfare Program; and government expenditure on social security and welfare affairs and services. Moreover, the addition of the government's state welfare scheme to support social welfare cardholders (e-Money) consisted of

- Home rental for the elderly, which will be paid on the 12th of the month to the elderly welfare cardholders and renting a house (0.22 million people) from December 2017 to September 2018.
- The amount limit pocket for buying consumer products (e-Money Thong Fah) and e-Money are paid to people who registered for the training. The registrant, who earns 0-30,000 baht per year, will be paid an additional 200 baht/ person/month, and if they earned 30,001-100,000 baht per year, they will be paid an additional 100 baht/person/month. They are allowed to withdraw cash from March to December 2019. Moreover, the welfare cardholders are also allowed to withdraw cash.

The government's economic stimulus package to stimulate the weakening economy in the mid-year of 2019 (The Thai Cabinet has approved 13,210 million baht giveaways for welfare cardholders on 30 April 2019) consisted of

- Under the welfare card program, farmers who hold welfare cards will receive 1,000 baht each in May 2019 to purchase agricultural raw materials such as fertilizer, pesticide, and other factors of production.
- Low-income parents with children still at school will receive 500 baht for each child who is still minor for the month of May 2019. The amount will mitigate the parents' expenses, such as student's uniform and school supplies.

Moreover, the government's Pracharat welfare card scheme to help ease low-income earners' cost-of-living burden (The Thai Cabinet has approved 20,102.11 million baht on 20 August 2019) consisted of

- The 500-baht cash handouts, which are granted by the government to help cover the cost of living expenses for two months from August to September 2019. Low-income earners can use the cash cards at Blue Flag outlets.
- The Child Support Grant scheme provides welfare support to children in impoverished households that are eligible to receive the welfare support under The Child Support Grant scheme for (newborn) children of the Ministry of Social Development and Human Security. They will be paid an additional 300 baht/person/month to the welfare cardholder for two months from August to September 2019.

Meanwhile, training expenses-outsiders, transfer expenses for operations-other business agencies and non-financial state-enterprises decreased.

2) Net savings of public corporations and government enterprises

Net savings of public corporations and government enterprises valued at 353,038 million baht, increased by 73.1%, rebound from a 13.9% decrease in 2018. Public corporations and government enterprises net profit in business accounting figure of the 2019 calendar year showed value at 134,929 million baht, lessened by 43.3%. After consolidated with 408,686 million baht of national accounts definition adjustment, public corporations and government

enterprises net profit in national accounts aspect before profit allocation registered at 543,615 million baht, grew by 36.5%, accelerating from a 6.2% fall in 2018. After deducting by profit allocation, comprising (1) dividend (2) profit delivered to government and (3) bonus payment from net profit, which decreased by 2.0%; consequently, net savings of public corporations and government enterprises significantly increased.

Net savings of state enterprises classified by organization establishment, public corporations net saving or performance in national accounts aspects posted at 81,500 million baht, increased by 3.9%, recovering from a 19.3% decrease in 2018. Other state enterprises showed 271,538 million baht of net savings, which rose by 116.3%, surging up from a drop of 10.2% in 2018.

Saving – investment gap

Gross saving registered value at 5,190,016 million baht, increased by 3.1%, better than a slight decline in 2018. Gross capital formation or investment registered at 4,010,284 million baht, lessened by 2.7%, dropping from a 16.0% expansion in 2018. Such gross saving and investment brought about a surplus of the saving-investment gap at 1,179,732 million baht, which larger than a surplus of 912,130 million baht in 2018, equivalent to a 7.0% share of GDP.

GDP Implicit Price Deflator

Overall price level increased by 0.9%.

GDP Implicit Price Deflator

GDP Implicit Price Deflator in 2019 grew by 0.9%, decelerating from 1.4% in 2018. Agricultural price deflator increased by 3.3%, recovering from a fall of 2.8% in 2018. Meanwhile, non-agricultural price deflator rose by 0.7%, compared to a rise of 1.8% in 2018 as a result of an increase in the deflators contributed chiefly to major activities, namely electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply; construction; wholesale and retail trade; transportation and storage; accommodation and food service; education; human health and social work; financial and insurance activities; real estate activities; and activities of households as employers. Decreasing in deflators was found from mining and quarrying; manufacturing; water supply; sewerage, waste management and remediation activities; information and communication; and art, entertainment and recreation.

On the expenditure side, the overall price deflator rose by 0.8%, higher than 0.0% in 2018. Private consumption expenditure price deflator grew by 1.0%. The price deflator of investment also grew by 0.2%. Besides, the price deflator of government final consumption expenditure grew by 1.6%. For the external sector, the price deflator of exports goods and services decreased by 2.4%. Similarly, the price deflator of imports goods and services declined by 2.6%.

Consumer price index (CPI) in 2019 expanded by 0.7%, compared to 1.1% in 2018, while producer price index (PPI) declined by 1.0%, in contrast to a rise of 0.4% in 2018.

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


