- (1) Climate Change Imperative: ADAPTATION
- Tourism development could augment climate risks and vulnerabilities, especially for the poor
 - > Climate proofing tourism infrastructure
- Effects of CC on Tourism Industry
 - > Awareness and capacity building of tourism sectors on CC risks and vulnerabilities
 - ➤ Integrating tourism into CC Adaptation Strategies

Concept



- (2) Going beyond GDP i.e. beyond the numbers of tourism and income generation:
- Put the equation right in measuring BOTH tourism benefits and impacts
- Tools/ Criteria/ Standard for measurement of 'green tourism'
- Access and benefit sharing of tourism revenue
- Roles of LGOs and CBOs

HOW?: case studies and ideas



- (1) Considering Carrying Capacity and Measuring Tourism Loss and Gain:
- Poverty-Environment Initiative in Samut Songkram
- Tool: Sub-Global Assessment (SGA) as a tool and social process to make the link between ecosystem services and income generation activities e.g. tourism
- <u>Level</u>: local government organisations and communities

HOW?: case studies and ideas



- (2) Payment for Ecosystem Services (PES) / CSR Approach:
- Revenue from Tourism to support National Parks
 Operation and Maintenance
- Voluntary Payment from Tourist to conserve biodiversity, keystone species, and to support environmental management e.g. waste, water pollution
- Tapping into high-end hotels to buy local products to support sustainable harvesting

HOW?: case studies and ideas



- (3) Fiscal and Financial Measures:
- Climate Public Expenditures and Institutional Review (CPEIR)
 - ➤ National Adaptation Trust Fund: of which part of the financial resource could come from tourism sector ----

"Tourism Conservation Charge"
